CHEROKEE BALLARD TALKS ABOUT HEALTH



Cherokee Native and former Oklahoma City television personality Cherokee Ballard spoke at the elders conference held on June 25th and 26th. On Friday afternoon Cherokee spoke about her struggles with her own health including her televised removal of a grapefruit size tumor from her body. In 1999 she was diagnosed with Non-Hodgkins Lymphoma. Within a few days of being diagnosed she began her treatment and is obviously still with us today. Besides sharing her diagnosis and recovery she also shared with the elders about taking her health care into her own hands by asking questions and not being afraid to challenge her medical team, which included the Indian Health Service system. At the end of her talk about her own health crisis Cherokee answered questions posed by the elders in the audience and the posed for pictures with many tribal members.

year of July 1 – June 30. Questions as to the per-capita payment are surfacing, but remember that the firm of Finley & Cook has to reconcile financial records; a yearly audit must be conducted which may take approximately six weeks; a Governing Council has to be held to approve resolutions approving the amount to be paid in per-capita payments and Revenue Allocation Program (RAP) distributions; and the updating of pertinent tribal membership information needs to be accomplished before any payments are made to the tribal members. Yes, the per-capita checks can be disbursed earlier than what has transpired in past years. We will keep you informed as the process develops.

The following is my continued report on the preparation for negotiations of the Annual Funding Agreement (AFA). The first section was in the June issue of the Sac & Fox News.

Part 2: Annual Funding Agreement.

Negotiation Authority

Tribal Governments (Leaders)

As sovereign nations, the tribal governments determine who will represent their tribes during the negotiations. The tribal team may include elected officials, technical and program staff, legal counsel, and consultants, but, regardless of the composition of the team, those representing the tribe must have final decision making authority in order to successfully negotiate and reach final agreement on the issues.

Office of Tribal Self-Governance (OTSG)

The OTSG serves as an advocate for Self-Governance tribes within the Indian Health Service (IHS). The OTSG has "full self-governance implementation authority of the IHS Director, including authority over the negotiation process, independent of other divisions of IHS in matters relating to self-governance."

Agency Lead Negotiators (ALN)

The IHS Agency Lead Negotiators (ALN) represent the Director, IHS, and the Agency position during negotiations. The ALN work under the direction of the OTSG to provide tribes with self-governance information, assist tribes in self-governance planning, coordinate meetings between tribes and the Agency during planning and negotiations, and coordinate the Agency's response to tribal questions.

The ALN are given the authority to complete and conclude final negotiations with tribes. When necessary, ALN receive assistance from other Area or HQ staff [including staff from IHS Office of Finance and Accounting (OFA) and Office of General Counsel (OGC) prior to and during negotiations. Such assistance may include reviewing documents, identifying Agency concerns, providing advice on issues, calculating new tribal shares, advising the ALN on IHS retained services, or drafting language for Compacts/Funding agreements. It is important for such staff to be available, as necessary, to assist ALN at final sessions so that final negotiations may be concluded at the table.

In 2004 under the direction of the IHS Director, an IHS and tribal workgroup was formed to develop a self-governance "Curriculum and Standards Manual" to train and certify ALNs. The curriculum will be used to train ALNs on the factual, legal, regulatory and policy information on self-governance. ALNs will be required to be certified following completion of this training.

Office of Finance and Accounting (OFA)

The IHS Office of Finance Accounting (OFA) is responsible for the timely preparation of the annual financial tables needed for negotiations. Additionally, the OFA provides advice to the ALNs as requested on issues that may arise during the negotiations.

Office of General Counsel (OGC)

The Office of General Counsel (OGC) is located within the Office of the Secretary – Department of Health and Human Services. OGC's role during self-governance negotiations is to provide legal counsel to the IHS, through the ALN or others in the agency, including the IHS Director.

Tribal Self-Governance Advisory Committee (TSGAC)

The IHS Tribal Self-Governance Advisory Committee (TSGAC) plays no direct role in the individual tribal and IHS government-to-government negotiations; yet, the TSGAC does provide advocacy and policy guidance on the implementation of self-governance. The Director, IHS first established the TSGAC in 1996.

The TSGAC consists of tribally elected officials representing a cross-section of self-governance tribes; representing self-governance tribes by acting on their behalf, to clarify issues that affect all

compacting tribes specific to issues affecting the delivery of health care for American Indians and Alaska Natives; confers, discusses, and reaches consensus on specific self-governance issues; and provides verbal and written advice about self-governance issues to the Director, IHS, and the Director, OTSG.

Self-governance tribes from each Area select their own delegate and alternate. These representatives bring the views and issues from each Area while working on the self-governance policy issues that are brought to the Committee. The TSGAC is provided support from a tribal/federal technical workgroup whenever situations warrant further research and review to carry out a policy for the Committee.

Negotiation Documents

Compact – The compact sets forth the general terms of the government-to-government relationship between the Indian tribe and the Secretary, consistent with the Federal Government's trust responsibility and statutory and treaty obligations to Indian tribes and other terms as the parties intend to control from year to year. The regulations define a self-governance compact as a legally binding and mutually enforceable written agreement that affirms the government-to-government relationship between a self-governance tribe and the United States. Tribes must have a compact in order to participate in self-governance. A compact is a separate document from a Funding Agreement, and must be executed before or at the same time as a Funding Agreement. Upon approval and execution of a self-governance compact, the compact remains in effect for so long as permitted by Federal law or until terminated by mutual written agreement or retrocession or resumption of all program, services, functions, and activities (PSFA) or portion thereof.

Funding Agreement – The Funding Agreement is a legally binding and mutually enforceable written agreement that identifies the programs, services, functions, and activities, or portion thereof, that the tribe will carry out, the funds being transferred from Service Unit, Area, and HQ in support of those PSFA and such other terms as are required or may be agreed upon pursuant to the Self-Governance Act. Normally, tribes draft and submit their own Funding Agreements to IHS and the tribal draft Funding Agreement is also used in negotiations.

Negotiations Process

Pre-Negotiations: Pre-negotiations are used to provide information on budget, tribal share calculations, and residual information and to provide adequate time for review by both the tribe and IHS. At least 120 days in advance of the final negotiations date, the IHS shall provide the tribes with the following information (at all IHS levels-HQ, Area Service Unit and Program base) in hard copy and electronic format. (a) Program Title & Description (b) Total Budget Amount (c) Identification of Residual (d) Identified Tribal Share (e) Basis for Determining Tribal share (f) Compact and/or Funding Agreement Language Revisions.

During pre-negotiations, the team and governing authority from a tribe that is continuing self-governance participation may also want to request information from or meet/have a conference call with IHS. The tribe may wish to discuss financial materials that show its estimated funding for the next year (program, Area, and HQ) and increases that it has or will receive in the current year and the basis for those increases and may have questions regarding any funding amounts that may be lower than in the previous year.

Negotiations – The documents required for negotiations are a Compact and Funding Agreement. The tribe should establish a checklist for the negotiations that includes all issues and objectives of the tribe to be incorporated into the Compact and Funding Agreement. These documents are normally drafted by the tribe and provide the basis for negotiations and discussion with the Agency. The negotiations process includes discussion among the parties on the following major components: (a) composition of the Negotiations Team and time frame for negotiations (b) identification of Residual Amount (c) determination of tribal

share Distribution Formula (d) tribe determines which programs to include in the Funding Agreement (e) no reduction in services to non-participating tribes (f) retained services or buy-backs (g) discussion on current policy issues and directives (h) process and time frame for Agency review.

Post-Negotiations – Following completion of the negotiations, the Compact, Funding Agreement, and associated worksheets are signed by the authorizing tribal official and submitted to the Agency for final processing and signature.

I have decided to make my reporting on the Annual Funding Agreement (AFA) into three parts. The final section will be in the August issue of the Sac and Fox News. May God continue to bless you, your families, and our Nation!



NEW JUVENILE FACILITY ADMINISTRATOR TRACY HANEY



Tracy Haney is the Facility Administrator of the Sac & Fox Nation Juvenile Detention Center. Mr. Haney is a member of the Seminole Nation of Oklahoma and previously worked with the Sac & Fox Indian Child Welfare program in Family Violence and Child Protection. His 20-year career includes both tribal and state service. He was the Juvenile Justice Program Director for the Citizen Potawatomi Nation, an Institutional Programs Supervisor for the Oklahoma Office of Juvenile Affairs and a Youth Guidance Specialist for the Oklahoma Department of Human Services.

Mr. Haney's experience includes working with youth in the areas of child abuse, sexual assault, domestic violence, delinquency prevention and intervention, and juvenile corrections.

Mr. Haney volunteers his time to many tribal, state, and local boards. He is the current President of the Oklahoma Indian Child Welfare Association, Inc. and also serves on the Oklahoma Advisory Task Force on Child Abuse and Neglect, the Child Abuse Training and Coordination Council, the Shawnee Area Native American Child Protection Team, and the Project: SAFE Board of Directors.

Other organizations he has served include the State Interagency Task Force on Child Abuse and Neglect, the Pottawatomie County Child Abuse Team, the Salvation Army Boys & Girls Club Advisory Council, and many others.

Mr. Haney holds a Bachelors of Science degree in Criminal Justice from St. Gregory's University. He is a C.L.E.E.T. certified law enforcement officer certified as a child sexual abuse investigator and forensic interviewer. He was the 2001 recipient of the District V Child Advocate of the Year for Pottawatomie County and received the 2007 Sonya Atetewutakewa Award for Distinguished Service in the Protection of Native American Children from the University of Oklahoma's Center on Child Abuse and Neglect.

Mr. Haney and his wife, Paula, have four children. They have been married for 17 years and their family has served as both a foster and adoptive home for Native American children. They are members of Faith Christian Outreach where they serve in the children's ministry.

Sac and Fox Nation Tribal School Clothing Grant/School Supply Grant Information Sheet

The Sac and Fox Nation finds it is important to the social welfare and the Tribal Community for its members to receive adequate and appropriate education. Every school aged child has a need for adequate and appropriate attire and educational supplies to attend school for the benefit of themselves and the community at large. Therefore, in order to fulfill the educational needs and health and welfare needs of Sac and Fox school aged children the Nation has established the Tribal School Clothing Grant and Tribal School Supply Grant.

The Tribal School Clothing Grant and Tribal School Supply Grant will provide an allowance in the form of a "Gift Card" to enrolled Sac and Fox Nation students, for the amount of One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) for clothing and Fifty Dollars for school supplies for the Academic School Year 2009-2010 **until all funds are expended**. Tribal students who are attending school or home schooled, Kindergarten-12th grade are eligible to submit an application for the Tribal School Clothing/School Supply Grant. An applicant may apply **only** once during the 2009-2010 school year and all funding is based on a "first-come first served" basis.

The Tribal School Clothing Grant Application **must** be completely filled out by the applicant **before** taken to the School to obtain the signature from an authorized school official (**Authorized school official means; Superintendent, Principal, or School Secretary, please be sure and include official title of signatory**). An official school stamp or seal must show on original signed application.

Remember application forms must be completely filled out or will be returned to sender "NO EXCEPTIONS".

Applications containing all required documentation (attached) will be processed in a timely manner. After the application is processed a "Letter of authorization" will be mailed to the parent or legal guardian of the eligible student applicant. This "Letter of Authorization" will be used for the actual purchases.

- Fiscal Year 2010 RAP Budget Request with line item and narrative detail

ALL Departments, Programs, Committees, Commissions and Boards that were allocated funds in the FY2009 RAP Budgets must comply with the reporting requirements as specified above.

ALL Departments, Programs, Committees, Commissions and Boards that were allocated funds in the FY2008 Carryover RAP Budgets for use in FY2009 shall also submit reports in accordance with the above deadline and requirements.

ALL Departments, Programs, Committees, Commissions, Boards and individual tribal members seeking funding in the FY2010 RAP Budgets MUST have their request submitted to the Business Committee with the above requirements by the July 31, 2009 deadline.

If your RAP Budget request is new and FY2010 would be the first year of RAP funding, you still must submit reports for Fiscal Year 2009 according to the above requirements if the Department/Program had any funding at all for Fiscal Year 2009.

SAC & FOX HISTORY



Johnathan Buffalo, Historic preservation officer for the Sac & Fox Tribe of the Mississippi in Iowa (Meskwaki), compiled the following history of how one tribe became three.

HOW ONE TRIBE BECAME THREE

by Johnathan Buffalo

- 1812 -1824

The Meskwaki (Fox) are concentrated along the Mississippi River Valley areas. The Sauki (Sac) are also along the Mississippi River but more to the south. Leaders of both tribes sign treaties as "Sac & Fox", both tribes controlled a large stretch of the waterway and subsequently were identified as the "Sac & Fox of the Mississippi River." Then a group of mostly Sac Indians broke away from the larger Sac tribe and moved to northwest Missouri along the Missouri River Valley and in 1824 this break-away group signs a treaty independently ... receiving a separate identity as the "Sac & Fox of the Missouri River."

- 1837

The Sacs and Foxes are forced inland as punishment for the Black Hawk War and to break the tribes' domination of the Mississippi and Missouri rivers. The Fox are moved into central Iowa Territory, the Sac are moved into southern Iowa Territory and the other Sac group (the "Sac & Fox of the Missouri River") are moved to a reservation in the northeast Kansas Territory. The government refers to the Sacs and Foxes in the Iowa Territory as "The Sac & Fox of the Mississippi" in order to differentiate this group from the "Sac & Fox of the Missouri".

- 1845

Wanting more land for settlers, the government forces a treaty to remove the "Sac & Fox of the Mississippi" from Iowa Territory to a reservation in east central Kansas Territory ... south of the reservation already occupied by the "Sac & Fox of the Missouri." However, only one-fifth of the Meskwaki (Fox) actually arrive at the new reservation; the rest are still hiding in Iowa or have taken refuge with other tribes. The Fox who go to Kansas occupy the west side of the reservation and the Sac occupy the east side. Following the removals, Iowa almost immediately becomes a State in 1846.

- 1846 -1869

The Meskwaki gradually return to Iowa before and after purchasing 80 acres of land in the state in 1857. The United States is embroiled in Civil War 1861-1865. The people remaining at the second reservation are mostly Sauki and move to a new reservation in the new Indian Territory (present-day Oklahoma). The vacated reservation in central Kansas is opened up to White settlers. The reservation in northeast Kansas remains intact. This accounts for the three Sac and Fox tribes of today: The Sac & Fox of the Mississippi in Iowa (primarily Meskwaki), the Sac & Fox Nation of Oklahoma (remaining Sauki plus a few Meskwaki), and the Sac & Fox of the Missouri in Kansas and Nebraska (the first group of Sauki who broke away in 1824).

Section 208. Poll Watchers
 Each candidate may designate in writing one person, not a candidate, to watch the activities at the polls. Such designation shall be presented to Election Board Officials prior to the election. Such persons may not interfere in any way with the conduct of the election, but may observe only. Any poll watcher interfering with the election or attempting to electioneer, in any way, shall be rejected from the poll area by a Sergeant of Arms or law enforcement officer.
Notification of Poll Watchers for the Primary Election must be in writing and received by 4:30 p.m. on Friday, July 10, 2009.
Notification of Poll Watchers for the General Election must be in writing and received by 4:30 p.m. on Friday, August 14, 2009.
 All notifications must be sent to the Sac and Fox Nation Election Board, Route 2, Box 246, Stroud, OK 74079

Section 302. Voting List
 (a) It shall be the duty of the Tribal Secretary to compile from the Tribal membership rolls a list of all persons who will be eligible voters on the date scheduled for the Primary Election and General Election and to resent sufficient certified copies of this list as requested to the Election Board no later than sixty (60) days prior to the primary Election and no later than sixty (60) days prior to the General Election. The said copies are to be returned to the Tribal Secretary.
Deadline for Voting List: Primary Election: Tuesday, May 26, 2009 General Election: Tuesday, June 30, 2009
 (b) One copy of the voting list shall be maintained in the Tribal Offices and be open to public inspection during Regular business hours no later than sixty (60) days prior to the election.
Open to the public: Primary Election: Tuesday, May 26, 2009 General Election: Tuesday, June 30, 2009

Section 303. Challenges to Voting List
 (a) At any time more than twenty (20) days before the Primary Election and General Election, any person may challenge the voting eligibility of any person whose name appears on said list, or may apply to have their name added to said list by filing an application with the Election Board. The application shall clearly indicate the substance of the challenge, the specific names challenged, and the relief requested.
Deadline for Challenges: Primary Election: Thursday, July 2, 2009 General Election: Friday, August 7, 2009

Section 401. Eligibility for Office
This section has been declared unconstitutional in its totality pursuant to case #APL-0101 filed in Supreme Court on 7-15-05.
Eligibility for Office per Sac and Fox Nation Constitution:
 Article VI Elections-Section 1. Any person elected to membership on the Business Committee shall not be less than twenty-one (21) years of age and shall be a member of the Sac and Fox Nation. At the time of his election he shall reside within the geographical boundaries of the State of Oklahoma. Any member of the Business Committee removing from the State of Oklahoma shall automatically forfeit his office.

Section 402. Filing for Office
 To be eligible for election and have one's name placed upon the ballot Notice of Candidacy for an elective office must be filed with: The Tribal Secretary after depositing the candidate's non-refundable filing fee of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) (cashier's check only) with the Tribal Treasurer during regular business hours at the Tribal Office complex not later than sixty-five (65) calendar days prior to the date of the Primary Election and General Elections. The Tribal Secretary shall notify the Chairman of the Election Board of all candidates who have filed for office.
Opening Date to File for Office: Friday, January 2, 2009. Closing Date for Primary Election: Thursday, May 21, 2009
If No Primary Election is held, Closing Date for General Election: Thursday, June 25, 2009 at 4:30 p.m.

Section 403. Petition for Office
 A petition of ten (10) or more members of Council may submit a written notice with required filing fees of two-hundred (\$200.00) non-refundable (cashiers check only), no later than sixty-five (65) calendar days prior to the date of the Primary Election and/or General Election stating the name of the candidate, age, birth date, and proof of actual residence and domicile.
Deadline Date to Petition for Office: Primary Election – Thursday, May 21, 2009
If No Primary Election is held, Closing Date for General Election: Thursday, June 25, 2009

Section 406. Withdrawals
 Any candidate for office may withdraw by filing a written notice of withdrawal with the Election Board at any time within ten (10) days after the closing date of filing for office. Such notice shall contain the candidate's name, the office filed for, a statement of withdrawal and shall be notarized or sworn to before a person authorized to administer oaths, (Required filing fee non-refundable)
Deadline to withdraw: Primary Election: Primary Election – May 29, 2009 General Election: Thursday, July 2, 2009

Section 408. Contest of Candidate Eligibility
 Any candidate or eligible voter may challenge a candidate's legal qualification to run for office by filing a written petition with the Election Board within three (3) business days of the closing of the filing period. Each petition shall state with particularity the reasons the candidate is not eligible to file for office. There is a one-hundred dollars (\$100.00) non-refundable cashier's check contest fee.

Section 602. Application for Absentee Ballot

Section 713. Installment in Office

Installment by: If the tally is completed on Saturday, August 29, 2009, Installment by Tuesday, September 22, 2009
If the tally is completed on Sunday, August 30, 2009, Installment by Tuesday, September 23, 2009

Section 802. Contest Petition
 A candidate or qualified voter contesting a Tribal Election shall, within ten (10) days after completion of the tally of the election and declaration of the results, shall deposit a two hundred dollar (\$200.00) non-refundable cashier's check contest filing fee with the Tribal Treasurer, file with the Election Board a statement in writing setting forth their particular grounds for contest. The statement shall be verified by affidavit of the contestor (s) that they believe the matters and things therein contained are true. After the statement is filed the Election Board shall set a time for a hearing of the contest, no later than ten (10) days after the date on which the statement of contest was filed. Written notice of such hearing shall be mailed or delivered to each candidate for the office contested. Any party to the election protest and the Election Board shall have the right to view the election ballots and records in the presence of the Court Clerk in the clerk's office. Any party to the protest or a Tribal member shall be entitled to receive a photocopy of said documents certified as true and correct copies by the Court Clerk upon payment to said clerk of the normal and customary charges.

Said certified copies shall be received as evidence by the Election Board in like manner as an original. Alternatively the election Board, upon request of a party of on its own motion, may convene a hearing for any protested election at the Tribal Courthouse for the purpose of review of said election materials. After hearing the proofs and allegations of the contestants, the election Board shall make their findings and shall have authority to pronounce their judgment either setting aside, or confirming the election.


