Major Don J. Couteau Served In Top Secret Missions for O.S.S. During World War II

(Editor's Note: Through the years, and currently, many Sac and Fox Nation tribal members have served in the U. S. Armed Forces. The following features the late Major Don J. Couteau, written by his daughter, Donna Couteau.)

Don J. Couteau (Ka toe pay), Thunder Clan, and his brother Orville (Wah Pah thee kah) grew up in Oklahoma. Their father was Carl Couteau (Too kee Kush) and mother was Laura Mae Jackson Couteau.

During the Great Depression, the boys learned to hunt rabbits and small game, since their father remarried and their mother worked as a waitress in small cafés. Times were hard and they frequently had to split up and stay with various relatives. As they got older, they worked as roughnecks in oil fields and sometimes high steel.

World War II broke out, and Don and Orville joined up. Don went into the U.S. Army Air Corps, and Orville was mostly stationed stateside in the U. S. Army. When we used to ask him (Don) what he did during the war, he would say "top secret, sworn to secrecy" or joked, "Well, if I told ya, I'd have to kill ya!" We assumed that he, like many veterans, just didn't want to talk about it. He kept it a secret until their mission was declassified almost 12 years after the "Code Talkers" during the 1980s.

Don was a teenager when he was sent to fight Nazis in Europe, circa 1942. He was assigned to a secret air base called 'Harrington Field' in England. He was part of Swarts Crew, and related that one day all the men were seated in rows by crew on long benches in a quonset hut. A general came in and told them they would choose to opt out of the mission by standing up and walking out with their crew at the end of the presentation. The operation was called code name the 'Carpetbaggers.'

The Carpetbaggers were the de facto air arm of the Office of Strategic Services, or OSS, the forerunner of the CIA. Their missions were so secret that the airmen themselves rarely knew where they were flying, what they were carrying, or to whom they were delivering agents and supplies.

They were to fly out at night, only by thew light of the moon, in B-24s painted all black. They would train to fly so slowly they could easily stall out and, so low to the ground that sometimes he said they had tree tops in their bomb bay doors when they closed them. Only the pilot and navigator would know their destination. Don's navigator was 'Rocky' Cocharo, who was still living as of this writing.

On the night of the operation, an all-black Chevrolet with black windows would pull up near the aircraft and usually a single passenger would board from the rear, and had no contact with the flight crew. All passengers were called 'Joe.' So, in case of capture, that is all the crew would know. 'Joe' was a spy who parachuted out of the 'Joe hole,' a specially built area near the center of the plane. They went out over France and Germany to aid the 'resistance.' Supplies and pamphlets were

also dropped to throw-off detection of their real mission and to mark the agent's location for recovery by the 'underground.'

The general said if any crew wanted to opt out, now was the time to get up and leave. The general said, "Good, it's unanimous, were all in." Later, when the crews were outside, they admitted that no one wanted to be the first to leave! Also, knowing the plan, what may have happened if they had?

Don's boyhood hunting skills were used when he became a tail-gunner and a marksman. He had excellent night vision "eyes like a cat," he said. Every mission was harrowing with bad weather, low altitude and air speed, as well as, the German Night-Fighters and flak all around them from ground artillery. He related that on one mission, they were hit! He claimed that if the Night-Fighters had come up from the rear, where he was, that wouldn't have happened.

The bombs they carried were wrapped in straw, and caught fire when they were hit. It looked like they were going down. The crew member behind him was trapped, hanging upside down like a fly in a web, tangled in his harness. Don got the heel of his boot aught in the base of the gun turret as they were trying to parachute out of the burning aircraft. Don started to laugh at the absurdity of their situation. The other guy said, "What are you laughing at? We're all gonna die."

But, Don got his foot free and another crew member put out the fire. The pilot limped the plane back to another secret field and set it down. Over the next couple of days, they made their way back to Harrington Field.

Before the missions, they always left their wallets and money, letters and photos on their beds, as was their custom. When they did not return after the first night, the other air crews went to the pub and drank a toast in their honor with the money, assuming they had all been killed in action, as had so many others before them.

The 8th Air Force 801st/492nd Bombardment Group flew 62 'Joes' in high-risk 'Carpetbagger' missions from January to July of 1944. It ended when Gen. George Patton needed their air fuel for his tank divisions. Their motto was, "By the full

Black Hawk Health Center Project to Begin Nov. 9

The Black Hawk Health Center Expansion Project has been approved by the Business Committee for construction. Lambert Construction Company of Stillwater, Oklahoma has been awarded the contract.

Indian Health Services funds have been dedicated to design and construct the expanded clin-

ic building. Federal transportation funds are being provided to fund the design and construction of the paving and parking lot portion of the project. A Monarch butterfly pollinator habitat is also included.

Studio 45 Architects of Tulsa is the project architect. EST, Inc. of Oklahoma City provided

the engineering design of the paving and parking lot. The planned construction start date is November 9, 2020. The general contractor has 19 months to complete the project.

During construction, every effort will be made to keep the clinic open to the public with access for medical services. Initially, patients will be provided with temporary parking nearest the front entrance doors. The public may experience some inconvenience and the clinic access points may change during construction. During this time your patience and understanding will be greatly appreciated.

Schools Receive Grants for 'PPE' From Sac and Fox Nation

The Sac and Fox Nation Business Committee on Oct. 6 announced a total of \$19,594 is being donated to five area schools to purchase personal protective equipment (PPE) for students, faculty and staff. The funding is from the Sac and Fox Nation Local Government Operations donations budget.

The Business Committee approved the following PPE grants to public school districts located within the Sac and Fox Nation's jurisdiction: North Rock Creek

\$5,000; Oak Grove \$5,000; Stroud \$5,000; Ripley \$2,297; and, Davenport \$2,297.

"The Sac and Fox Nation is happy to support our local schools," said Principal Chief Justin F. Wood. "It is critical that schools have access to personal protective equipment. The Sac and Fox Nation is committed to keeping our children safe and protecting our communities. We will continue to do our part to help stop the spread of COVID-19."

Chief Justin Freeland Wood's Address to the Nation

STATEMENT ON TOBACCO TAX COMPACT WITH THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA

The Sac and Fox Nation and the State of Oklahoma entered into a Tobacco Tax Compact ("Compact") on January 1, 2013. The Compact terminated on October 1, 2020. Prior to the termination of the Compact, the Sac and Fox Business Committee submitted a request to the State of Oklahoma to extend the Compact by twelve months to October 1, 2021. The State of Oklahoma denied this request and informed the Sac and Fox Nation that the State of Oklahoma is not interested in extending the Compact. The Business Committee is disappointed by this response.

In light of the current economic challenges presented by the COVID-19 public health emergency, the Business Committee proposed a one year extension to preserve the status quo and to allow both parties ample time

to negotiate the terms of the Compact, if so desired. Extensions such as this are a practical, commonplace solution. The Business Committee believes an extension is in the best interest of retailers and consumers.

The Compact addresses important economic contributions related to taxes and retail sales. Compacts provide for cooperation and coordination between tribal nations and the State of Oklahoma, which benefits all Oklahomans. Additionally, compacts play an important role in government to government relationships.

The Business Committee believes sovereign governments must work together to ensure prosperity and growth. The Business Committee is exploring all options and will continue to request additional details from Governor Stitt's office about the State's denial of the extension request.

moon we flew, secret wings of the O.S.S. in World War II."

The Office of Strategic Services was the precursor of the C.I.A. Don earned several medals, including the Air Medal with two oak leaf clusters, and was under consideration for the French Legion of Honor at his death. He loved flying, but would not glorify war. He went on to earn the rank of major, and became a V.I.P. pilot in the U. S. Air Force. Two years ago, The Congressional Gold Medal was awarded to the O.S.S. in Washington, D.C.

His headstone at the Coastal Bend Veterans State Cemetery reads, "Major Don J. Couteau, September 26, 1925 - February 24, 2020, Air Medal, "Fly With The Angels." Don was 94-years old.

He is survived by his wife of nearly 75 years, LeNell B. Couteau; daughter, Donna Couteau Cross (Joe); foster daughter, Audrey Tunches; sons, Mark Couteau (Mary), and Christopher Couteau; grandchildren, Aimee Couteau (Travis Linares), Steven Couteau (Bernadette), Anne Couteau, Sarah Couteau and Amanda Couteau Miles (Dan); great-grandchild Lilah Miles; sisters, Jackie Morrison, Carletta Henthorn, Carlena Hagler, Shirley Whittington, Barbra Reeves, and Mable Walton. "NSN DOT GOV" confirms that it is an official government website that has been certified, verified, and recognized by the United States Government.

Of course, commercial sub-entities and public political subdivisions of tribal government may also use a commercial dot com designation for commercial-oriented purposes.

Everyone should know in this pandemic it is very hard to order technology equipment. The Chromebooks are a very HOT item and it is taking time to receive our order. We are trying to accommodate Pre-K through 7th grade as fast as we can with their technology equipment.

Eighth through twelfth grade and college students have received lap tops. We are looking at ordering tablets for our younger students Pre-K through 2nd grade. The Sac and Fox Nation Education Department was invited to a virtual TED-NA Board Annual Business Meeting on October 6, 2020 at 11:30 am. TEDNA stands for Tribal Education Departments National Assembly, and is a Native-run national non-profit organization. TED-

NA is a membership organization for the Education Departments of American Indian and Alaska Native Tribes (TEDs).

TENDA seeks to provide ongoing resources and technical assistance to the professional development of tribal education departments to help those departments to craft more comprehensive educational systems. TENDA accomplishes this by fostering effective relationships with government agencies, education agencies, and organizations.

TENDA also seeks to provide support and encouragement for each tribes' right to define and achieve its own education goals specific to their community and represents Tribal nations reclaiming our sovereignty in education; trough the empowerment of establishing tribal education departments or the re-establishment of the tribal education departments. By empowering TEDs, TENDA is positioning our Nations to be able to lead our people through educational settings such as early childhood, K-12, college, and/or career readiness initiatives.

During the business meeting, the executive director of TENDA made a recommendation to place Edwina Butler-Wolfe of the Sac and Fox Nation on the Board. There was a motion and a second to the motion and voted unanimous to place me on the board. The Sac and Fox Nation will be represented throughout Indian Education and Indian Country for our input in Education. According to TENDA membership records, the Sac and Fox Nation's last involvement was 2011. My plans will be to have a strong voice of input in Every Student Succeeds Act that was implemented in December of 2015, which replaced the No Child Left Behind

The TEDNA annual meeting was also conducted on the same day as the board meeting updates from Washington D.C., with scheduled presentations from the Bureau Indian Education (BIE) Director Tony Dearman and, Office of Indian Education (OIE) Director Julian Gerrero. Also, Diana Cournoyer, Executive Director of National Indian Education Association (NIEA), who gave an update on current issues.

A couple of the issues that were reported included the Johnson O'Malley Program, with increasing the cost per child. This issue has been long overdue of an increase. There was talk before the pandemic that it was going to be resolved at the upper level of the federal government side, but with all that has happened it has been pushed back.

The other issue is Every Student Succeeds Act 2020 - 2021, which is coming up to be reauthorized. I am sure there will be many meetings scheduled for input of

what can be different in making this Act to be more structured.

Can You Get Covid-19 Twice?

they've been reinfected after recovering from Covid-19 are popping up daily, leading to an unnerving question: Can we get coronavirus twice?

Unlikely, say experts at the Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation, at least in the short term.

"It seems more probable that people re-exhibiting symptoms are simply still carrying the virus, not getting reinfected. That's a critical distinction," said OMRF President Stephen Prescott, M.D., a physician and medical researcher. "To date, researchers have not been able to document any proven cases of reinfection."

Case reports, mostly from China, Prescott said, indicate that some people, particularly older adults, take a long time to clear Covid-19. "That means they can be sick and seem to recover, but they still carry the virus." Also contributing to the "reinfection" debate is occasional inaccurate viral testing, said OMRF scientist Linda Thompson, Ph.D., who recently

New accounts of patients who believe received \$1.75 million in federal funding to study Covid-19 antibodies in Oklahomans.

"It's not unusual for a Covid patient to get a follow-up test to see if they've cleared the virus. A false negative, whether because of low viral levels or a faulty test, could lead someone to think they had recovered," said Thompson. "Then, ultimately, they test positive again, inaccurately appearing as a second infection."

In other viruses, researchers have found that an initial infection triggers at least short-term immunity. But long-term immunity ultimately has to do with the strength of the body's full immune response. "That response also includes antibodies outside of the blood, like in the nose and throat, as well as the body's B and T cells, which can provide long-term defense against viruses," Thompson said.

To help understand this more definitively, OMRF researchers are investigating the neutralizing power of antibodies that form in response to the virus as well as how long those antibodies remain protective.

"There's a lot we don't know yet," said Prescott. "Within a year or so, we'll have a lot of these answers, but we aren't there. So, until then, wear a mask, practice physical distancing and continue to do the things we know for certain are protective and slow the spread."

W-9 Form

It is critical that the W-9 Form be completed correctly and thoroughly for each individual tribal member. Be sure to fill out your NAME, MAIL-ING ADDRESS, SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER, and then SIGN and DATE your form.

Required Legal Documents

If you have had a name change due to marriage, divorce, adoption, etc., it is important the Finance Department has a copy of your social security card. All othere legal documents should be sent to the Enrollment Department so their records can be updated. Any guardianship or Power of Attorney documents need to be on file with the Finance Department.

Minors

Parents or guardians are responsible for providing a W-9 for minor children; not doing so could result in the minor's payment not being deposited into the minor's trust fund account in a timely manner.

Tax Liability Notification

What are the withholding requirements for distributions that are made per a Revenue Allocation Plan (RAP)? The first step is to identify the source of funds used for the distribution. Unless the source of funds is specifically exempt from taxation, the amounts that make up the distributions to tribal members are taxable.

Which funds get reported on Form 1099-Misc? Distributions could be derived from many sources, including the profits from a tribal business other than a Class II or Class III gaming operation, interest income on investments, or rental payments from tribal lands. All these payments require a tribe to prepare a Form 1099-MISC

When does a person receive a Form 1099-Misc, Statement for Recipients of Miscellaneous Income? If a person receives \$600 or more in 1 calendar year from the same source, that amount must be reported on a Form 1099, and that Form 1099-Misc. must be provided to the individual.

It is only the amount distributed from NET GAMING REVENUE that is subject to withholding. The Internal Revenue Code provides that "Every person, including an Indian tribe, making a payment to a member of an Indian tribe from the net revenues of any Class II or Class III gaming activity conducted or licensed by such tribe, shall deduct and withhold from such payment a tax in an amount equal to such payment's proportionate share of the annualized tax." The amount to withhold is provided in Withholding Tables found in IRS Publication 15-A, Employer's Supplemental Tax Guide.

If the Indian tribe anticipates making a distribution of any kind, the Indian tribe needs the tribal members' Social Security number before the distribution is made. If an Indian tribe does not know a tribal member's Social Security number at the time of distribution, the distribution is subject to "backup withholding" (at 28% in 2009). Can the allotted minor payment be refused in order to have the entire per capita payment be deposited in trust? Yes, but in order to do so we must still receive a W-9 for the same reasons stated above. We would also need a written statement to that effect to be included with the W-9.

INDIAN HEALTH SERVICE WATER AND SEWER ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE

The Indian Health Service, Office of Environmental Health and Engineering, offers programs to install water and sewer facilities to qualified Indian Homeowners. Funding and construction of sanitation facilities, such as wells, water service lines, septic tanks and drain fields, wastewater lagoons and sewer service lines, are available.

Minimum eligibility requirements include:

- Property must be located within the local Indian Health Service jurisdiction: The greater portion of Oklahoma County; Pottawatomie County north of the North Canadian River; Cleveland County west of the Indian Meridian; Lincoln County; Logan County, and a portion of southern Payne County.
- You must be a member of a federally recognized Indian tribe, band or group;
- If renting, you must obtain a lease agreement (minimum of five years) and a copy of the landowner's deed/title and CDIB. Property owner must possess a Certified Degree of Indian Blood (CDIB).
- HUD homes must be paid in full before services can be provided.

Documentation of tribal affiliation and home ownership or long-term lease will be required with the application for services. Mobile homes must be tied down, skirted and wheels removed prior to service.

Absentee Shawnee and Citizen Potawatomi Nation tribal members must apply for services through their tribal OEH offices.

Please note that applying for service does not guarantee you will receive service. Service depends on the availability of funding.

Why the 'nsn.gov' Designation?

From time to time, a question has been asked as to why the Sac and Fox Nation uses such a special exclusive (and longer) native sovereign nation dot gov Internet designation and name:

The "nsn dot gov" (nsn.gov) designation carries with it more significant levels of legitimacy, trust, and authority than a commercial, "dot com" domain name.

"NSN DOT GOV" confirms that it is an official government website that has been certified, verified, and recognized by the United States Government.

Of course, commercial sub-entities and public political subdivisions of tribal government may also use a commercial dot com designation for commercial-oriented purposes.
