A Variety of News Stories Making Headlines Here in 2020

(Editor's Note: The health and safety challenges of the past year resulted in most special and traditional activities of the Sac and Fox Nation being canceled or postponed. However, numerous achievements were made and tribal services administered over the course of the year. Following are a few of the various news stories making headlines in monthly editions here during the year 2020.)

January

Sac and Fox Nation Principal Chief Justin F. Wood announced the Business Committee had taken a first stop to diversify the tribal economy with the purchase of Shawnee Trophy, effective Jan. 1, 2020.

Officials at Pictureworks Entertainment vowed to continue working on the feature film, 'Bright Path: The Jim Thorpe Story,' following the unexpected death of executive producer Rick Hill.

February

Sac and Fox Nation voters on Jan. 4, 2020 approved an amendment to the Constitution of the Sac and Fox Nation in a Secretarial Election. The amendment pertains to membership of the tribe, and was ratified by a vote of 165 for, and 62 against.

The amendment states: "Persons born after the date of October 16, 1954, who possess one-eighth or more Sac and Fox Indian blood, at least one of whose parents is a member of the Sac and Fox Nation, shall be entitled to membership with the Sac and Fox Nation, provided an application is submitted in writing to the Sac and Fox Nation, and provided that such person, if enrolled with another tribe, shale first file a conditional relinquishment with the other tribe."

The Sac and Fox Nation Business Committee hosted Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives Charles McCall at the Nation's capitol complex. Following lunch, the group toured the Sac and Fox nation Juvenile Detention Center and the Nation's USDA Food Distribution Facility.

March

The United States Department of Justice, the Department of the Interior and the Department of Health and Human Services held an initial meeting of a White House task force to address the incidence of missing and murdered American Indians and Alaska Natives. Federal task force members are charged with "enhancing the criminal justice response, consulting with tribal governments on potential solutions, and empowering native communities with information."

Sac and Fox Nation tribal member Lina Ortega, who serves as associate curator of the Western History Collections with the University of Oklahoma Libraries, coordinated an 'Indians for Indians' Radio Show Symposium at Bizzell Memorial Library on the OU campus. She also coordinated a musical performance by Irigon Starr at Catlett Music Center on the OU campus. The events were presented in conjunction with a 'Native Voices Over the Airwaves: The Indians for Indians Radio Show' exhibit on display at Bizzell Memorial Library through June 2020.

April

Sac and Fox Nation tribal member and Yale University student Anna Smist was among

a group of students paying a special visit to the Sac and Fox Nation Capitol as part of an 'Oklahoma Sovereignty Tour.' The Yale Indigenous Performing Arts Program group staged a reading Cherokee playwright Mary Kathryn Nagle's play about the controversy following the 1953 death of world-famous athlete Jim Thorpe titled, 'My Father's Bones.'

Sac and Fox tribal leaders announced the purchase of a more powerful Mass Notification (outdoor/indoor) and Warning System for the tribal capitol grounds. The new system replaces the single outdoor pole siren at the RV Park an the Justice Center. The new sirens have audible, visual and voice capabilities.

Officials of the Sac and Fox Nation and the Oklahoma Dept. of Transportation executed a Memorandum of Agreement to reconstruct the bridge over Salt Creek on SH 99, 1.26 miles north of US 66.

May

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act provided critical relief for Indian Country to address the COVID-19 pandemic, including over \$500 million in direct appropriations to Indian Affairs, and an unprecedented \$8 billion for tribes.

June

The Sac and Fox Nation received \$21,318,227.90 of CARES Act funding, and the Sac and Fox Nation Business Committee approved the Sac and Fox Nation COVID-19 Economic Support Program to provide support to all enrolled tribal members. The committee voted unanimously to allocate \$6,875,5000 of CARES Act funding to the support program. Authorization was given for all enrolled members to receive \$1,000 payments in June 2020, and \$1,000 payments in September 2020.

Chief of Staff Audrey Lee coordinated the filling and delivery of a first-wave of food baskets to 300 tribal elders living in Lincoln, Payne and Pottawatomie Counties. Basket items included: potatoes, flour, shortening, vegetable oil, sugar, tea, coffee, bread, assorted fruit, frozen chicken breasts, hamburger meat, rice, oatmeal, assorted fresh vegetables, salt, pepper and bottled water.

July

The 57th Annual Sac and Fox Nation Powwow, scheduled for July 9-12 2020 was canceled due to the COVID-19 public health emergency. The 2021 Sac and Fox Nation Powwow is set for July 8-11, 2021 at Jim Thorpe Memorial Park tribal grounds.

The Sac and Fox Business Committee announced the Nation had received a second distribution from the CARES Act funding in the amount of \$2,879,457.81.

August

Pictureworks Entertainment, in conjunction with tribal partners, the National Congress of American Indians, and several of Jim Thorpe's descendants announced the launch of 'Take Back What Was Stolen,' an initiative to restore legendary Native American athlete and icon Jim Thorpe's status as the sole

gold medal champion of the 1912 Olympic decathlon and pentathlon.

September

In response to the pandemic, the Sac and Fox Business Committee established a temporary COVID-19 Relief Department to assist tribal members during the public health emergency. The committee also allocated \$2,000,000 and approved new COVID-19 assistance programs to provide critical assistance to eligible members of the Sac and Fox Nation.

Those programs include a Human Services Relief Program and a Business Relief Program. The committee also allocated \$700,000 and approved an Education Assistance Program to provide technology assistance

to all enrolled tribal students. Those eligible were able to apply to receive a Chromebook (Pre-K through 11th grade) or a laptop computer (12th grade through college) to assist with distance learning needs.

October

It was announced that construction had been completed on the new Sac and Fox Nation Transportation Facility in Stroud, Okla., which will also house the tribal Elders and Veterans organizations. Representation of the Elders and Veterans group participated and played a vital role in the planning and development process. The tribal project manager was Randle Carter, and tribal inspector was Cecil Bernard.

The Sac and Fox Nation

Business Committee approved a \$12.3 million contract with Lambert construction of Stillwater, Okla. for the expansion and renovation of Black Hawk Health Center. The development is projected to take 30 months to complete, with an estimated move-in date of April 2023.

November

Tribal officials announced a total of \$19,594 is being donated to five area schools to purchase personal protective equipment (PPE) for students, faculty and staff. Those school districts located within the Sac and Fox Nation's jurisdiction receiving PPE funding include: North Rock Creek, Oak Grove, Stroud, Ripley and Davenport.

December

The Sac and Fox Nation Information Technology (IT)

Chief Justin Freeland Wood's Address to the Nation

If there was ever a year that I would wish away, 2020 would be that year. However, even in a year filled with as much turmoil, suffering, and frustration I still find hope in the Christmas promise.

I love Christmas. I like to give gifts. I really like to receive gifts. It is not so much the gift itself, but knowing that someone else thought enough of our relationship to use both their heart and treasure to bring me joy. I have received some really awesome gifts over the years, some that I still use, some gathering dust and others have been retired to final resting heaps.

While our focus is on the Christmas season, the greatest gift I have ever received did not occur on Christmas, it was not wrapped. My faith in Jesus Christ has shaped my life from the age of seven. At times He has been my only friend, the only one who could truly wipe my tears away. In times of suffering, He is the reason I can still rejoice. In truth, the Christmas promise was a promise fulfilled. In this New Year I want to share my hope with you as it is truly the greatest gift I can offer.

"In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria. And, all went to be registered, each to his own town. And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. And while they were there, the time came for her to give birth. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

And, in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with great fear. And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!"

Department and Dobson Technologies of Oklahoma City announced the near-completion of the installation and activation of a new fiber-optic Internet network to serve the entire tribal headquarters campus. IT Director Boyd Cummings said the fiber-optic cable installation is one of three IT projects made possible through federal CARES Act funding. The other two components are the development of a "unified tribal database" and a new tribal website.

The Business Committee announced the forming of a task force focused on sovereignty protection. The committee is closely monitoring and addressing a number of critical issues that the Nation must pro-actively address. The goal is to build a coalition of experts and parties with historical knowledge to ensure the protection of the Nation's sovereignty and the well-being of all members of the Sac and Fox Nation.

It was announced the Business Committee had approved an additional COVID-19 Relief distribution of \$1,500 for all enrolled Sac and Fox tribal members. The relief is in response to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, to ensure all tribal members have support to address critical needs during the public health emergency.

Task Force on Missing, Murdered Indians Reports 'A Productive First Year'

The Presidential Task Force on Missing and Murdered American Indians and Alaska Natives (AI/AN) on Dec. 10, 2020, released a status report detailing accomplishments during its first year and outlining its strategy for the next 12

The President's Executive Order (E.O.) 13898, set forth a range of tasks to be completed over the two-year life of the Task Force, with required reports at the end of each year. Attorney General William P. Barr and Secretary of the Interior David L. Bernhardt transmitted the status report to President Trump, and notably characterized these accomplishments as, "a productive first year of Task Force operations."

In its first year, the Task Force, also known as Operation Lady Justice (OLJ), held more than 15 in-person and remote meetings with tribes, individuals and stakeholder groups, and established and convened 10 working groups to address specific mandates of the executive order, including developing protocols, solving cold cases and expanding outreach and awareness. Readouts of the sessions can be found on the Operation Lady Justice website.

"American Indians and Alaska Natives experience some of the highest rates of violence in the country, a situation that is all the more tragic in light of the generations of trauma already suffered by indigenous people," said Attorney General

"Despite the COVID-19 pandemic and the unprecedented challenges it posed, the Task Force continued to progress with appropriate urgency to diagnose the symptoms of this intractable problem. They sought the help and input from tribal leaders and tribal communities to develop sustainable protocols that will lead to long-term resolutions tribal communities need and deserve."

"The Trump Administration has taken numerous actions to support Tribal communities with a particular focus on addressing the crisis of missing and murdered Native Americans and Alaska Natives," said Secretary of the Interior David L. Bernhardt. "The new cold case offices that we stood up around the country are already providing much needed support in a critical effort to resolve missing and murdered cases and provide justice for victims and their families."

"It has been a true honor to represent the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services on the Operation Lady Justice Task Force and serve Native American communities and populations," said Commissioner Jeannie Hovland of the Administration for Native Americans.

"Tribal leaders and community advocates have been on the forefront of this issue for years. At their request, I have elevated the critical role prevention must play in reducing the number of Native Americans who tragically go missing or are murdered. With their partnership and guidance, HHS is taking unprecedented action on this issue using a public health approach. This means addressing the root causes of this issue. I believe that together we can, and will, end the crisis of Missing and Murdered Native Americans."

"President Trump was the first President to formally recognize the long-overlooked issue of missing and murdered Native Americans, but more importantly he demanded action," said Doug Hoelscher, Assistant to the President and Director of White House Intergovernmental Affairs.

"The work of the Operation Lady Justice Task Force, created by President Trump's executive order, is laying a solid foundation for long-sought progress by improving data coordination, enhancing collaboration among various law enforcement entities, creating several cold case offices, and elevating support for victims and their families. Thanks to President Trump's leadership and the hard work of the Task Force members, tribal partners, and advocates, missing and murdered Native Americans are forgotten no more!"

President Trump signed E.O. 13898 on November 26, 2019, establishing the Operation Lady Justice Task Force, to "address the legitimate concerns of American Indian and Alaska Native communities regarding missing and murdered people."

The order requires the Task Force to submit a status report in November 2020 and a final report in November 2021. Attorney General Barr and Secretary Bernhardt are co-chairs, with Office of Justice Programs Principal Deputy Assistant Attorney General Katharine T. Sullivan and Assistant Secretary for Indian Affairs Tara Katuk Mac Lean Sweeney serving as their designees. Marcia Good, from the Justice Department's Office of Tribal Justice, is executive director.

As noted in the report, the Task Force will continue to consult with tribal leaders and solicit stakeholder feedback as it develops strategies for strengthening investigations, raising public awareness, and improving data collection and information sharing.

INDIAN HEALTH SERVICE WATER AND SEWER ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE

The Indian Health Service, Office of Environmental Health and Engineering, offers programs to install water and sewer facilities to qualified Indian Homeowners. Funding and construction of sanitation facilities, such as wells, water service lines, septic tanks and drain fields, wastewater lagoons and sewer service lines, are available.

Minimum eligibility requirements include:

- Property must be located within the local Indian Health Service jurisdiction: The greater portion of Oklahoma County; Pottawatomie County north of the North Canadian River; Cleveland County west of the Indian Meridian; Lincoln County; Logan County, and a portion of southern Payne County.
- You must be a member of a federally recognized Indian tribe, band or
- If renting, you must obtain a lease agreement (minimum of five years) and a copy of the landowner's deed/title and CDIB. Property owner must possess a Certified Degree of Indian Blood (CDIB).
- HUD homes must be paid in full before services can be provided.

Documentation of tribal affiliation and home ownership or long-term lease will be required with the application for services. Mobile homes must be tied down, skirted and wheels removed prior to service.

Absentee Shawnee and Citizen Potawatomi Nation tribal members must apply for services through their tribal OEH offices.

Please note that applying for service does not guarantee you will receive service. Service depends on the availability of funding.

2020 PER CAPITA PAYMENT INFORMATION

- Individual must be enrolled by September 30, 2020 to be eligible for the 2020 per capita payment.
- Tribal members will need to submit a W9 to the Finance Department for the upcoming 2020 Per Capita Payment.
- Once a W-9 form is received, it will be updated into our system and all payments due will be made at a time of disbursement.
- If an individual is a NEW tribal member, or has had a NAME CHANGE, a copy of Social Security card is needed for our records.
- There is NO deadline on submitting a W9. All checks will be mailed, no exceptions.
- The IRS 1099 form will be mailed by January 31, 2021. NEW MINORS . . . PLEASE SEND COPY OF SOCIAL SECURITY CARD SO WE CAN GET TRUST ACCOUNTS ESTABLISHED

W-9 Form

It is critical that the W-9 Form be completed correctly and thoroughly for each individual tribal member. Be sure to fill out your NAME, MAIL-ING ADDRESS, SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER, and then SIGN and DATE your form.

Required Legal Documents

If you have had a name change due to marriage, divorce, adoption, etc., it is important the Finance Department has a copy of your social security card. All othere legal documents should be sent to the Enrollment Department so their records can be updated. Any guardianship or Power of Attorney documents need to be on file with the Finance Department.

Minors

Parents or guardians are responsible for providing a W-9 for minor children; not doing so could result in the minor's payment not being deposited into the minor's trust fund account in a timely manner.

Tax Liability Notification

What are the withholding requirements for distributions that are made per a Revenue Allocation Plan (RAP)? The first step is to identify the source of funds used for the distribution. Unless the source of funds is specifically exempt from taxation, the amounts that make up the distributions to tribal members are taxable.

Which funds get reported on Form 1099-Misc? Distributions could be derived from many sources, including the profits from a tribal business other than a Class II or Class III gaming operation, interest income on investments, or rental payments from tribal lands. All these payments require a tribe to prepare a Form 1099-MISC

When does a person receive a Form 1099-Misc, Statement for Recipients of Miscellaneous Income? If a person receives \$600 or more in 1 calendar year from the same source, that amount must be reported on a Form 1099, and that Form 1099-Misc. must be provided to the individual.

It is only the amount distributed from NET GAMING REVENUE that is subject to withholding. The Internal Revenue Code provides that "Every person, including an Indian tribe, making a payment to a member of an Indian tribe from the net revenues of any Class II or Class III gaming activity conducted or licensed by such tribe, shall deduct and withhold from such payment a tax in an amount equal to such payment's proportionate share of the annualized tax." The amount to withhold is provided in Withholding Tables found in IRS Publication 15-A, Employer's Supplemental Tax Guide.

If the Indian tribe anticipates making a distribution of any kind, the Indian tribe needs the tribal members' Social Security number before the distribution is made. If an Indian tribe does not know a tribal member's Social Security number at the time of distribution, the distribution is subject to "backup withholding" (at 28% in 2009). (Source: Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Indian Tribal Governments Frequently Asked Questions, Last Reviewed or Updated: April 22, 2013)

Per capita payments could affect any Tribal, Federal, State, and/or Local benefits you may receive or programs in which you participate. The Sac and Fox Nation encourage you to check with your tax accountant or benefit specialist.

If a tribal member receives income that is taxable, a 1099 must be issued for Tax Purposes. The W-9 also serves as a yearly address update.

Can the allotted minor payment be refused in order to have the entire per capita payment be deposited in trust? Yes, but in order to do so we must still receive a W-9 for the same reasons stated above. We would also need a written statement to that effect to be included with the W-9.
