#### Indian Affairs Proposes Rule to Support Entrepreneurship in Indian Country

The U. S. Department of the Interior's Indian Affairs div sion on April 3 announced that the Office of Indian Energy and Economic Development (IEED) has published a proposed rule to establish the Indian Business Incubators Program

#### Would Establish Indian Business Incubators Program

(IBIP), in accordance with the Native American Business Incubators Program Act of 2020 (P.L. 116-174). The proposed rule sets out who is eligible for

the program, how to apply, how the IEED will evaluate applications and make awards, and how it will administer the program.

The IBIP will provide com-

petitive grants to eligible applicants to establish and operate business incubators that serve entrepreneurs (start-up and early-stage businesses) who will provide products or services to tribal reservation communities.

The deadline for comments on the proposed rule is June 14, 2021. In addition, tribal consultation sessions will be held on it via webinar on May 12 and 13 at 1:00 p.m. ET. Details for registering for the sessions can be found in the Federal Register notice on the proposed rule that published April 13.

"Entrepreneurship has a long history in Indian Country, and the Department of the Interior is proud to support businesses in tribal communities," Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary – Indian Affairs Bry n Newland said. "The Indian Business Incubators Program supports the goals of tribal self-determination by promoting tribal economic self-sufficiency. I encourage tribal leaders to share their perspectives on this proposed rule."

A business incubator is an organization that assists entrepreneurs in becoming viable businesses by providing advice and

#### **Mindy Eicher Coordinating Adult Protective Services**

The Sac and Fox Nation Adult Protective Seriv ces Program was established in September 2 with a mission to enhance, promote and maintain the safety and well-being of tribal elders and vulnerable adults through prevention, education and protective seriv ces.

Seriv ng as coordinator of the Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT) and Adult Protective Services (APS) is Mindy Eicher, whose office is located in the Social Seriv ces Building on the Sac and Fox Nation headquarters campus.

"When healthy relationships turn into unhealthy ones, we need to help you get through these and make sure safety is first and foremost," said Eicher. "Person and family-centered seriv ces are aimed to promote safety by the means of assessments, investigation and emergency response. We are here to help you," she added.

Eicher said common questions that individuals may have include:

- Why is this happening to me? It could be a mental health issue or it could be an addiction problem.
  - Will anyone get into trou-

ble? They could, if a crime has been committed, but our goal is

to keep yu s afe and help yu.
• What is abuse? Cruel or violent treatment, mistreating or

improper use of stuff.What is exploitation? Taking something that belongs to you and uses to benefit self.

Signs of abuse include: unexpected fractures, bruises, welts, cuts, sores, burns and scratches; lack of basic hygiene; lack of adequate food; bed-bound person left with care; caregiver "living off" elder; caregiver has control of money, but fails to

prov de elder needs; caregiver isolates elder (not letting people in house or talk to others); and, caregier r is aggressier.

# **Brockway Community Center Added to National Register of Historic Places**

The Oklahoma Historical Society, State Historic Preservation Office (OK-SHPO) has announced an additional National Register of Historic Places listing for Oklahoma. The National Register of Historic Places is our nation's official list of properties significant in our past.

The Brockway Community Center was listed in the National Register of Historic Places at the local leve 1 of significance for its connection to the area's Black history.

Its period of significance—beginning in the year 1968—aligns with the Oklahoma City Federation of Colored Women's Club' purchase of the bi Iding at

N. Ex rest Ax. in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma County, to serve as its new permanent home, recognizing the ongoing work of the group and its continuing importance to the African American

community.

The purchase of this sub tantial property represented the culmination of significant efforts begun in 1911 with the formation of the Oklahoma City chapter of the organization. Operating under the statewide organization's slogan "Lifting as We Climb" the club used the Brockway Community Center as its headqa rters to prov de a luab e serv ces to soung Black women and children, improve the qa lity of life in local Black neighbrhoods, and advec ate for racial eqa lity.

The **9 6** purchase prov ded the club with a significant base for its important activ ties, which continued in the **bi** lding until its sale in **0** 1 The Brockway Community Center remains the only extant **bi** lding in Oklahoma City directly affiliated with the Oklahoma City Federation of Colored Women's Club.

#### WHAT ARE THE INGREDIENTS IN THE MODERNA COVID-19 VACCINE

The Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine contains the following ingredients: messenger ribonucleic acid (mRNA), lipids (SM-102, polyethylene glycol [PEG] 2000 dimyristoyl glycerol [DMG], cholesterol, and 1,2-distearoyl-sn-glycero-3-phosphocholine [DSPC]), tromethamine, tromethamine hydrochloride, acetic acid, sodium acetate trihydrate, and sucrose.

#### HOW DOES IT WORK?

The Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine uses mRNA to provide a blueprint for your cells to build your body's defense against SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19. The Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine does not contain SARS-CoV-2, or any virus—just the blueprint to help fight against it. The Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine may not protect everyone.

#### WHAT ARE SOME OF THE SIDE EFFECTS?

Side effects that have been reported with the Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine include:

Injection site reactions: pain, tenderness and swelling of the lymph nodes in the same arm of the injection, swelling (hardness), and redness

General side effects: fatigue, headache, muscle pain, joint pain, chills, nausea and vomiting, and fever

There is a remote chance that the Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine could cause a severe allergic reaction. These may not be all the possible side effects of the Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine. Serious and unexpected side effects may occur. The Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine is still being studied in clinical trials.

#### DOES IT WORK?

Moderna vaccine is 95% effective 2 weeks after the second dose.

#### HOW LONG WILL IT LAST?

Studies are ongoing, but the latest research suggests 6 months.

Dear Trib 1 Memb rs:

Hair ng serve d as the Trib lly elected Secretary for the Sac and Fox Nation for several terms of office, I want you to know what you can do, to preserve not only your own personal history, and family history, but you can also leave information for tribal history. Please know, when I received the Tribal Files in October of 1969, the files were in twelve (12) boxes, with one red box that contained the membership cards of each enrolled member, at that time.

The box of membership cards was used for a few years to control our Tribal Membership. Then, I created a file of manila folders for each enrolled tribal member. After a few years of usage of that method, I could see that a more durable file folder was needed. Thus, a red, heavier file folder was then purchased to transfer each individual tribal member to the more durable file.

I, then invited each member to send in copies of documentation of their personal achievements, that they wanted to have filed in their personal folder. That premise is still available today. However, that bit of information is not published more, for your information. Many members have attained great heights in their lives, and thus, we need to remember them, and their work. While serving the Sac and Fox Nation, I came to the conclusion, years ago, "- the Sac and Fox Nation are "smart people."

Thus, I do urge you to reply to the information for our Sac and Fox Nation

Historical purposes. We no longer visit each other, anymore, to "- keep our family history and stories alive." Yes, I know. We have had the Coronovirus-19 with us, all the past year. But, you must agree, we have lost a lot of our family and tribal stories. We are forgetting who we are "kin to."

Do you get my point? So, inform our Tribal Secretary (the Constitutional person), or mail in to her, all your personal family history. It would be good to begin with the grandparent's name, and their Roll number. Many of them will be listed with Indian names, maybe. Also, ask her for any information. That is the office that has all the tribal records.

This information is to each trib 1 member! So, feel free to do it.



#### Tax Liability Notification

What are the withholding requirements for distributions that are made per a Revenue Allocation Plan (RAP)? The first step is to identify the source of funds used for the distribution. Unless the source of funds is specifically exempt from taxation, the amounts that make up the distributions to tribal members are taxable.

Which funds get reported on Form 1099-Misc? Distributions could be derived from many sources, including the profits from a tribal business other than a Class II or Class III gaming operation, interest income on investments, or rental payments from tribal lands. All these payments require a tribe to prepare a Form 1099-MISC

When does a person receive a Form 1099-Misc, Statement for Recipients of Miscellaneous Income? If a person receives \$600 or more in 1 calendar year from the same source, that amount must be reported on a Form 1099, and that Form 1099-Misc. must be provided to the individual.

It is only the amount distributed from NET GAMING REVENUE that is subject to withholding. The Internal Revenue Code provides that "Every person, including an Indian tribe, making a payment to a member of an Indian tribe from the net revenues of any Class II or Class III gaming activity conducted or licensed by such tribe, shall deduct and withhold from such payment a tax in an amount equal to such payment's proportionate share of the annualized tax." The amount to withhold is provided in Withholding Tables found in IRS Publication 15-A, Employer's Supplemental Tax Guide.

If the Indian tribe anticipates making a distribution of any kind, the Indian tribe needs the tribal members' Social Security number before the distribution is made. If an Indian tribe does not know a tribal member's Social Security number at the time of distribution, the distribution is subject to "backup withholding" (at 28% in 2009). (Source: Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Indian Tribal Governments Frequently Asked Questions, Last Reviewed or Updated: April 22, 2013)

Per capita payments could affect any Tribal, Federal, State, and/or Local benefits you may receive or programs in which you participate. The Sac and Fox Nation encourage you to check with your tax accountant or benefit specialist.

If a tribal member receives income that is taxable, a 1099 must be issued for Tax Purposes. The W-9 also serves as a yearly address update.


Can the allotted minor payment be refused in order to have the entire per capita payment be deposited in trust? Yes, but in order to do so we must still receive a W-9 for the same reasons stated above. We would also need a written statement to that effect to be included with the W-9.
