Marilyn Spoon Creates 'Bandolier Bag' For First Americans Museum in OKC

(Editor's Note: The much-anticipated First Americans Museum opened to the public on Sept. 18, 2021 in Oklahoma City. The 175,000 sq. ft. museum is located at 659 First Americans Boulevard. The museum's mission is to educate the broader public about the unique cultures, diversity, history and contributions of the 39 tribal nations in Oklahoma today.

Showcased are state-of-theart exhibitions in history, culture and art, live public and education programs; a children's discovery center with family-friendly activities; a full-service restaurant presenting unique Native-inspired cuisine; and a museum shop featuring one-of-a-kind handmade items created by Oklahoma's premier Native American artists.

The following is written by Sac and Fox Nation tribal member Marilyn Spoon who, upon special request, crafted a 'bandolier bag' that is currently ex*hibited at the museum.)*

The Bandolier Bag by Marilyn Spoon

I, Marilyn Spoon, Clipah, live on the Meskwaki settlement in Tama, Iowa and have worked full-time as a substance abuse counselor at the Meskwaki Behavioral Health Program for the last 10 years. I enjoy beading, sewing and visiting Oklahoma as much as possible.

In mid July, 2020 I received a voicemail from First American Museum's (FAM) senior Curator Heather Ahtone, Ph.D inquiring if I was interested in creating a bandolier bag that would represent the Sac and Fox Nation for the museum that would be opening in the fall of 2021.

The FAM was commissioning items to be created by tribal in which they are enrolled. I had to think long and hard on this task as it was such an honor to be asked. One of my goals in life was to make a bandolier bag, but never attempted to make one.

After several other phone messages, and serious thinking about this honorable task, I finally returned the call in late August, 2020 in which I agreed to make the bandolier bag. The deadline for delivering the bag was November 15th.

I spent a month extensively researching how a bandolier bag is constructed. I bought a book on bandolier bags and was able to contact one of the people featured in the book who gave me advice. During my research, I came across several Ojibway women who had been making bandolier bags over the years who gave information on how to they construct their bags. I also talked with two Meskwaki tribal members, Daniel Youngbear and Terri Scott, who gave me tips on the construction and encouragement.

After gathering the materials, I decided to use my late mother, Viola Grant Spoon's designs that I still have in my possession. On October 10, 2020, I began my construction of the bag after careful consideration of what I wanted the bag to represent of the Sac and Fox Nation. I researched the colors of the most active clans of the Nation: Red: Fox, Wolf and Deer; Green: Peace and Fish; Blue: Thunder; Grey: Bear; Snow: White; and, Eagle: Yellow.

All of the beadwork is outlined with yellow beads along with the yellow bottom fringe, which yellow represents our Sauk name: People of the Yel-

members representing the tribe low Earth. The wavy lines represent water, as our Sauk people originated from The Great Lakes area. The band and straps are lined with green, which represents the Peace Clan, which is the Grant family's clan.

The bag was started Oct 10 and, it was completed on November 11. I worked on the bandolier bag daily. After work on weekdays, I worked from 3 to 5 hours, weekends anywhere from 6 to 10 hours a day. The front of the bag is beaded on velveteen; the back and lining are cotton; the fringe is cotton with brass beads; the green bias edging is cotton and, the entire bag is hand beaded and hand sewn. There was a total of 165 hours or more that went into completing the bag.

The finally touches of the bag included the brass beads and the fringe, which I completed November 11th. There was only one day that I did not work on the bandolier bag because my hands were in so much pain from all the work. So, I took the whole Saturday off on November 7th.

On November 13, 2020 I was able to present it to the FAM museum in which the staff were very impressed with the finished items and expressed it was more than what they expected. I am very pleased that the bag is on display at the beginning of the museum exhibits. I was very surprised that it is also in the official "Okla Homma: Tribal Nations Gallery" book on the museum.

I can express that working on the bandolier bag gave me peace, pride, contentment and pleasure every day. It was truly an honor to create this bandolier bag as a representation of our beloved Sauk Nation.

Dept. of Interior to Begin Tribal Consultations For Federal Indian Boarding School Initiative

The U. S. Department of the Interior on Sept. 30 announced it would begin Tribal consultations as the next step of the Federal Indian Boarding School Initiative, a comprehensive review of the troubled legacy of federal boarding school policies.

In June, Secretary Deb Haaland announced the Federal Boarding School Initiative directing the Department, under the supervision of Assistant Secretary for Indian Affairs Bryan Newland, to prepare a report detailing available historical records, with an emphasis on cemeteries or potential burial sites, relating to the federal boarding school program in preparation for future action.

In letters to Tribal leaders, Interior invited Tribal governments, Alaska Native Corporations, and Native Hawaiian organizations to provide feedback on key issues for inclusion in the Department's report and help lay the foundation for future site work to protect potential burial sites and other sensitive information.

"I launched the Federal Indian Boarding School Initiative to begin the long healing process that our country must address in order to build a future we can all be proud to embrace. As we move forward, working with Tribal Nations is critical to addressing this legacy with transparency and accountability," said Secretary Deb Haaland. "Tribal consultations are at the core of this long and painful process to address the inter-generational trauma of Indian boarding schools and to shed light on the truth in a way that honors those we have lost and those that continue to suffer trauma."

"Engaging Tribes is a necessary step as we work to shed light on what happened at federal boarding schools and chart our path forward," said Assistant Secretary for Indian Affairs Bryan Newland. "These conversations will not be easy, but they are critical as we truly investigate the legacy that these institutions left behind."

To facilitate discussion during the consultations, participants are requested to address the following topics: Appropriate protocols on handling sensitive information in existing records; Ways to address cultural concerns and handling of information generated from existing records or from potential site-work activities; Potential repatriation of human remains, including cultural concerns and compliance with the Native American Graves Protection

and Repatriation Act; Future policy and procedure implementation to protect burial sites, locations, confidential information, and culturally sensitive information; Management of sites of former boarding schools; Privacy issues or cultural concerns to be identified as part of the Initiative; and, other issues the Department should address in its review.

Formal consultations mark a new phase in the ongoing work of this initiative. Agency staff are currently compiling decades of files and records to facilitate a proper review to organize documents, identify available and missing information, and ensure that records systems are standardized.

The Department is also building a framework for how it will partner with outside organizations to guide the next steps of review. In addition, leaders are working with the Indian Health Service to develop culturally appropriate support resources for those who might experience trauma resulting from the initia-

This work will build towards the submission of a final written report on the investigation to the Secretary by April 1, 2022.



What the tribal member who visited me requested was that she did not care for the Drum and Singer contest that was now being performed at our annual Sac and Fox Nation Pow-wow. I agree with that tribal member. That is what I said, and reported on to the Governing Council.

The young ladies need to understand, there are other tribal members who agree with us, we two ladies.

I have even gone far enough to recommend to the Committeeman on the Business Committee that the Drum and Singers Contest be held in October while it is still warm. I believe that would be a fine time to hold the Drum and Singers Contest. The Pow-Wow Committee could use that perhaps, as a "fund-raiser." Such event would give tribal members one more time to be together and listen to our songs.

In addition, I asked the Business Committee, and recommended, that the Sac and Fox tribe needs to have some event each month, to "bring in people for economic reasons and purposes."

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ty and other locations in the state. The much-publicized filming began in April and ended in September.

The production brought movie stars Leonardo DeCaprio, Robert De Niro, Brenden Fraser, Lily Gladstone and others to Oklahoma for the months during the filming. The filming also provided opportunities for many Native Americans from across the state to take part as 'extras,' 'stunt men' and other capacities.

Three members of the Sac and Fox Nation are known to have participated in the filming. Those include Tina Blackburn, Greg Morris and Zack Morris. The tribal members were involved as extras with various scenes and locations during the filming.

'Killers of the Flower Moon' is an upcoming American Western crime drama film directed and produced by Martin Scorsese, and written by Eric Roth based on the nonfiction book of the same name by David Grann. Leonardo DiCaprio, who also served as producer, stars alongside Jesse Plemons, Lily Gladstone, and Robert De Niro. The movie is expected to be released in late 2022.

The book and movie investigate a series of murders that plagued the Osage people in Osage County, Oklahoma during the 1920s after valuable oil was discovered on their land. The Osage people were granted in court the right to profit from oil found on their land, which made them the target of greedy ranch owners.

Sac and Fox tribal member Tina Blackburn said she enjoyed her involvement with the film production. "It was an adventure. This is the biggest thing I've ever done," she commented.

Fellow tribal member Greg Morris also enjoyed his time in the Pawhuska area. "It was fun and exciting for the first time," said Morris. "There were people from tribes from all over. I was part of a group called 'Osage Riders,' and those of us on horseback were classified as stunt men. Our pay scale was better than as extras, and when we broke for lunch, we ate with the professional actors," he add-

HAPPY THANKSGIVING!!

We have finalized the 2021- 2022 Academic year of RAP Clothing & School supply Assistance Program funding. This year we have served approximately 110 families and 196 students. We encourage everyone that received funding, please provide your clothing receipts by April 1, 2022.

If the receipts could be mailed by the postal service it will provide accountability towards developing a paper-trail, where the mail will be logged and prevents loss of documentation. We had 30 families that was ineligible for the school year 2021 -2022, this was due to not turning in all of their clothing receipts supporting the documentation. It was very difficult to be unable to serve those families, but we have guidelines in place, and we must follow them.

I would like to mention that when parents/guardians/ grandparents submit any paperwork into the Education Department, please read the instructions on the application. We will be asking that you submit a (copy) tribal enrollment card (CDIB) and if we are paying any money to you, then we will need a W-9 tax form completed.

We will be continuing to ask for documents, until we transition to scanning documents into our computer system by using Laserfiche. Laserfiche will also allow us to go digital and provide the forms to be sent by hyperlinks to email accounts that will allow you to sign digitally. This will decrease paper and be more environmentally friendly by reducing emissions.

This will be capable of online fillable forms and reduces wait times while promoting due dates to be successful for each person. Another issue we like to mention is when, the Education Department calls applicants of missing documents and they delay in sending the requested documents to us, it only puts you in jeopardy of possibly not receiving services, due to deadline or funding to services may run

Scott worked in the service center of Crown Auto World most while in high school. Scott graduated Valedictorian of Distinction from Bristow High School and was an Academic All-Stater.

His plan is to obtain a bachelor's degree in Biological Sciences and to also obtain a master's degree in the same field. He joined TEDNA ACE in July of 2021 and has completed a series of training courses for preparation in being ready for the academic school year he is assigned.

We also like to mention that the RAP School Clothing/School Supply will be increased to \$300.00 for clothing and \$100.00 for school supply. Starting next year July 2022, for school year 2022 – 2023.

The Education Department will be issuing out VISA Cards starting July 2022 for school clothing/supply. We will keep you updated as time approaches.







SAC AND FOX NATION CARES ACT TRIBAL EMERGENCY WATER REPAIR PROGRAM GUIDELINES

PROGRAM FUNCTIONS:

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, this program is to help alleviate the public health and safety needs of eligible tribal members with clean water. By assisting with emergency water repairs, such as but not limited to not having running water, issues with water wells, plumbing issues with water lines, sewer lines, septic tanks, leach lines, lagoons, hot water heaters, toilets, sinks and showers. Tribal Emergency Water Repair Program is established for tribal members living within and outside of the jurisdiction who need emergency assistance on getting running water to their homesteads and/or emergency repairs as mentioned above. This program is open to all tribal members owning a home which is their primary place of residence.

GUIDELINES:

RAP Administrator

- 1. Preference may be given to elders and handicap members based on individual health and safety needs and the emergency situation.
- 2. An amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) in maintenance and/or repairs will be made to any one home, regardless of the number of tribal members listed as owners.
- 3. An EMERGENCY is any deficiency causing the home to be unsafe, unstable or uninhabitable including but not limited to the following: not having running water, issues with water wells, plumbing issues with water lines, sewer lines, septic tanks, leach lines, lagoons, hot water heaters, toilets, sinks, showers and any other deficiency that may present safety and health hazards to the inhabitants.
- 4. Applicants must apply for services through the Sac and Fox Nation RAP Department. The contact number is (918)-968-3526 ext. 2001 or 2000, fax number is (918)-968-4207 and the email is sfnrap@sacandfoxnation-nsn.gov. The DEADLINE to submit applications is December 17, 2021.
- 5. All applicants are required to submit an application, pictures and written estimates from three (3) contractors and proof of residence such as, a utility bill or a notarized statement stating proof of residency. When getting quotes from companies let them know that the project has to be completed by no later than December 30, 2021.
- 6. Applicants must submit Sac and Fox Nation tribal identification cards to verify membership.
- 7. If the applicant feels they have been wrongfully denied assistance/service, they may, in writing, request a review of their application by the Business Committee.
- 8. A final release form will be complete with the homeowner's signature.

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Tribes Standing Together Against Potential Changes to Indian Child Welfare Act

Cetan Sa Winyan, director of the American Indian Movement's Indian Territory Oklahoma chapter, said all tribes, not just the four already petitioning the U.S. Supreme Court, should stand together against potential changes to the Indian Child Welfare Act (ICWA) in a case the court has been asked to review.

"They closed the boarding schools and opened up CPS (Child Protective Services), but it's the same thing -- they're still coming in and taking our children," Winyan said.

The ICWA was enacted in 19 8 to help keep Indigenous children in Indigenous homes. In ICWA cases, the first preference for placement is that the child go to an extended family member, even if the relative is non-Native. Second preference is someone within the child's tribe; third preference is another tribe.

The Cherokee Nation of Oklahoma, the Oneida Nation of Wisconsin, the Morongo Band of Mission Indians of California and the Quinault Indian Nation of Washington are petitioning the Supreme Court to request that the bill remain intact.

The state of Texas is challenging the constitutionality of ICWA, claiming it's a race-based system that makes it more difficult for Native kids to be adopted or fostered into non-Native homes. Another argument is that the law commandeers states too much, giving federal law imbalanced influence in state affairs.

A Supreme Court response to the tribes' petition and the petition filed by the plaintiffs was due Oct. 8

Tribes and advocates argue that ICWA is culturally- and politically-based, not race-based, because tribal nations have political status as sovereign governments under federal law.

Cherokee Nation Deputy Attorney General Chrissi Nimmo said the tribe will put all the resources it has into making sure ICWA is protected. "ICWA attempts to keep children connected to their tribe ... and an attack on that is absolutely an attack on tribal sovereignty," Nimmo said.

The bill was enacted to quell the disproportionately high rate of Indigenous children's removal from their traditional homes, culture, language and dress. Before ICWA passed, 25% to 35% of all Indigenous children were being forcibly "assimilated" from intact Indigenous family structures to predominantly non-Indigenous homes.

"There was this bias that would lead to children being placed in foster care for things that weren't abuse or neglect but things mainstream social services didn't understand," Nimmo said.

Te'Ata Loper, partnership grant coordinator for the Oklahoma Indian Child Welfare Association, said ICWA is "vital to the continuation of our tribal nations and tribal families" and is optimistic the court will maintain tribal sovereignty given the legal precedent found "in countless Supreme Court case decisions."

The Oklahoma Indian Child Welfare Association is a nonprofit supporting Indigenous families and children by providing advocacy, education, training and collaboration with Oklahoma tribes and partner agencies.

AIM Indian Territory also provides a support system for tribal families trying to navigate the child welfare system. Winyan said the organization has been working to educate Oklahoma tribes about what's been happening with ICWA in the courts. She knows some don't understand the politics of it, or the severity, but Winyan said many can understand ICWA's impact when it's compared to the boarding schools era.

"It's just another form of saying, 'Kill the Indian, Save the Man,'"she said. "It hasn't changed."

One mother from the Cherokee Nation has seen the impacts Indigenous children face when raised in non-Indigenous homes.

Kim Duncan adopts and fosters children through the tribe. She and her husband, also an enrolled Cherokee member, became certified to foster and adopt in December 2017 and shortly thereafter took in two girls who were also Cherokee.

The girls, then ages 9 and 10, had gone through six different non-Indigenous homes between Dec. 13 and Dec. 28 of that year, by the time Duncan and her husband became their seventh and final home.

"The other six homes before us completely shut down and said, 'we don't want any more kids,'" Duncan said. "That's how traumatic it was. They were probably the hardest two we've ever taken in and we ended up adopting them, and they are totally different kids now."

Duncan said leaving the Indian Child Welfare Act as it is would mean that Indigenous children like hers would still get to grow up in homes where they are surrounded by people that not only sometimes look like them but speak their language, understand their culture.

A non-Indigenous home, she said, just can't provide those needs to Indigenous children. Duncan said when they made a home for their two girls, they were immediately drawn to Duncan's husband because he was perhaps a familiar, darker face.

"They just related to him more," Duncan said. "My children are darker-skinned, most of them, and they related to them." Duncan has fostered 14 children since 2017 and adopted three of them.

"People that are non-Indian are not as passionate about keeping the language strong, the culture strong," Duncan said. "If we allow our Indian children to be adopted by non-Indian homes, we're going to lose it."

ICWA applied in the adoption of Jennifer Bailey's now 7-year-old Cheyenne daughter. Bailey is a member of the Cheyenne and Arapaho Tribes. The birth mother, Bailey said, walked away from the adoption agency and chose she and her husband to raise her child because the child and Bailey were of the same tribe.

Bailey said she's concerned that

changing ICWA would lead potentially to long-term impacts on culture and language preservation, because it will keep Indigenous children from staying connected to their history and ancestry.

Nimmo said if ICWA is ruled as unconstitutional, as "race-based," it would open the door to dismantling other Indigenous laws using that argument.

"Nothing else that we deal with as tribal people -- land doesn't matter, money doesn't matter, language doesn't matter, artifacts don't matter if we don't have future generations," Nimmo said.

Chicago Blackhawks: Partnership Update

SUMMARY

The Chicago Blackhawks are optimistic as we start our partnership work together, the beginning of what we hope will be a strong and long-term allyship. And we understand that the resolution that passed at the end of August to establish a partnership between the Chicago Blackhawks and Sac & Fox Nation was the very first step of a process to build relationships and trust with the entire tribe. We also heard and believe that transparency will be such an important piece of this partnership going forward. With that in mind, we are pleased to share our first update with the tribe on the work we have been focused on in the early days of our partnership.

HONORING SAC & FOX VETERANS

During our first visit in May, we had an opportunity to meet several of your veterans and visit the Veterans Memorial. We also learned of the many years of effort some of your veterans have been engaged in to secure a donated Black Hawk helicopter from the Department of Defense. We offered to support that effort by leveraging our relationships. We are thrilled to share that we've made tremendous progress! On September 10th, we were officially notified by the Department of Defense that the Sac & Fox Nation's application has been approved. In follow up conversations with the DOD we learned that the estimated cost to demilitarize and transfer the airframe would be approximately \$250,000 which the Chicago Blackhawks have agreed to cover as needed. We look forward to this project advancing once an airframe is identified and the ground at the Veterans Memorial is prepared.

Tax Liability Notification

What are the withholding requirements for distributions that are made per a Revenue Allocation Plan (RAP)? The first step is to identify the source of funds used for the distribution. Unless the source of funds is specifically exempt from taxation, the amounts that make up the distributions to tribal members are taxable.

Which funds get reported on Form 1099-Misc? Distributions could be derived from many sources, including the profits from a tribal business other than a Class II or Class III gaming operation, interest income on investments, or rental payments from tribal lands. All these payments require a tribe to prepare a Form 1099-MISC

When does a person receive a Form 1099-Misc, Statement for Recipients of Miscellaneous Income? If a person receives \$600 or more in 1 calendar year from the same source, that amount must be reported on a Form 1099, and that Form 1099-Misc. must be provided to the individual.

It is only the amount distributed from NET GAMING REVENUE that is subject to withholding. The Internal Revenue Code provides that "Every person, including an Indian tribe, making a payment to a member of an Indian tribe from the net revenues of any Class II or Class III gaming activity conducted or licensed by such tribe, shall deduct and withhold from such payment a tax in an amount equal to such payment's proportionate share of the annualized tax." The amount to withhold is provided in Withholding Tables found in IRS Publication 15-A, Employer's Supplemental Tax Guide.

If the Indian tribe anticipates making a distribution of any kind, the Indian tribe needs the tribal members' Social Security number before the distribution is made. If an Indian tribe does not know a tribal member's Social Security number at the time of distribution, the distribution is subject to "backup withholding" (at 28% in 2009). (Source: Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Indian Tribal Governments Frequently Asked Questions, Last Reviewed or Updated: April 22, 2013)

Per capita payments could affect any Tribal, Federal, State, and/or Local benefits you may receive or programs in which you participate. The Sac and Fox Nation encourage you to check with your tax accountant or benefit specialist.

Why does a W-9 needed to be submitted yearly?

If a tribal member receives income that is taxable, a 1099 must be issued for Tax Purposes. The W-9 also serves as a yearly address update.

Can the allotted minor payment be refused in order to have the entire per capita payment be deposited in trust? Yes, but in order to do so we must still receive a W-9 for the same reasons stated above. We would also need a written statement to that effect to be included with the W-9.
