# A Variety of News Stories Making Headlines Here in 2021

(Editor's Note: The health and safety challenges of the past year resulted in many special and traditional activities of the Sac and Fox Nation being canceled or postponed, as in the previous year. However, numerous achievements were made and tribal services administered over the course of the year. Following are a few of the various news stories making headlines in monthly editions here during the year 2021.)

The Presidential Task Force on Missing and Murdered American Indians and Alaska Natives (AI/AN) released a status report detailing accomplishments during its first year and outlining its strategy for the next 12 months

The President's Executive Order (E.O.) 13898, set forth a range of tasks to be completed over the two-year life of the Task Force, with required reports at the end of each year.

In its first year, the Task Force, also known as Operation Lady Justice (OLJ), held more than 15 in-person and remote meetings with tribes, individuals and stakeholder groups, and established and convened 10 working groups to address specific mandates of the executive order, including developing protocols, solving cold cases and expanding outreach and awareness.

Construction began on the 15th Street Improvement Project in Chandler. The project is a partnership agreement between the Sac and Fox Nation and the City of Chandler.

proved the project and dedicated \$386,400.00 toward the reconstruction of 15th Street between US 66 and County Road EW 910 in Chandler. The Tribe's federal transportation funds were used as the Tribe's contribution to this street improvement. The project's total improvement costs is \$541,400.00.

Tribal leaders approved a resolution proclaiming Arvel Winter as a National Treasure of the Sac and Fox Nation. The proclamation recognized Winter by stating, in part: "WHEREAS, Arvel Winter's entry into tribal public service came at a time of great turmoil and financial hardship in the Sac and Fox Nation,

WHEREAS, Arvel Winter led the effort to create a strong and sound public financial management system for the people of the Sac and Fox Nation, and;

WHEREAS, Arvel Winter's quiet leadership and dedicated service was a significant factor in establishing the Sac and Fox Nation as a leader in the Renaissance of Tribal Governments in Oklahoma in the 1980's, and;

WHEREAS, the Governing Council has demonstrated our People's respect and admiration by naming Arvel Winter as an Honorary Member of the Sac and Fox Nation, and;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED AND PRO-CLAIMED that Arvel Winter shall be recognized and honored as a NATIONAL TREASURE of the People of the Sac and Fox Nation.

other volunteers distributed 100 32-bottle cases of drinking water and 650 gallons of non-potable water for household use to dozens of Sac and Fox tribal families from the Shawnee area.

The team set up the drive-by water distribution station in the parking lot of the Sac and Fox Nation Multi-Purpose Complex from 2-4 p.m. after bitter-cold temperatures over the preceding week caused water outages and the City of Shawnee to issue a

The University of Oklahoma (OU) Libraries' Western History Collections (WHC) received a \$200,000 award to preserve, digitize and make more accessible the Native American oral histories that were recorded by OU students in the 1960s and (Continued on Page 3)

# **Dept. of Justice Presents Awards to Support Domestic Violence Jurisdictions**

The U.S. Department of Justice Office on Violence Against Women (OVW) on Dec. 8, 2021 announced awards to 11 Indian Tribal governments to support them in exercising special domestic violence criminal jurisdiction (SDVCJ). The Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act of 2013 (VAWA 2013) recognized the authority of tribes to exercise SDVCJ over certain defendants, regardless of their Indian or non-Indian status, who commit crimes of domestic violence or dating violence or violate certain protection orders in Indian country.

'We heard from tribal leaders that they need access to funds to support the day-to-day costs of SDVCJ, and I'm pleased to announce OVW is issuing eleven awards to implementing tribes to defray these costs," said OVW Principal Deputy Director Allison Randall. "OVW is dedicated to working with tribes to address challenges in protecting victims and responding to offenders in their communities, as well as supporting tribal sov-

ereignty. The recipients of the oneyear awards under OVW's Tribal Jurisdiction Program are: Chickasaw Nation, Oklahoma; Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians, North Carolina; Fort Peck Assiniboine and Sioux Tribes, Montana; Muscogee (Creek) Nation, Oklahoma; Nottawaseppi Huron Band of the Potawatomi, Michigan; Pascua Yaqui Tribe, Arizona; Port Gamble S'klallam Tribe, Washington; Pueblo of Santa Clara, of Oklahoma; the Cherokee Nation of Oklahoma; and the Tulalip Tribes of Washington.

ÔVW's Tribal Jurisdiction Program was authorized under VAWA 2013 and supports tribes with jurisdiction over Indian country in exercising SDVCJ. Tribal Jurisdiction Program funds may be used to strengthen tribal criminal justice systems, provide indigent criminal defense, conduct jury trials and provide services and applicable rights to crime victims.

Costs could include, but are not necessarily limited to, incarceration costs (including medical care) for non-Indian SD-VCJ defendants, trial costs for SDVCJ cases, defense counsel

New Mexico; Seminole Nation costs, costs associated with empaneling a jury for an SDVCJ trial, batterer's intervention or other pre- or post-conviction supervision or programming costs and related training and technical assistance.

The Office on Violence Against Women provides leadership in developing the nation's capacity to reduce violence through the implementation of the Violence Against Women Act and subsequent legislation. Created in 1995, OVW administers financial and technical assistance to communities across the country that are developing programs, policies and practices aimed at ending domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault and stalking.


## Obituaries

1970s. The funding comes from the Doris Duke Charitable Foundation, whose namesake financed the collection of original recordings.

Sac and Fox Nation tribal member Lina Ortega, associate curator for the Western History Collections and subject librarian for the Native American Studies department in the College of Arts and Sciences, will serve as the project lead, ensuring a supportive relationship between those entities, as well as OU's Native Nations Center and OU Libraries. Ortega noted that OU intends to involve the state's Native communities in the decision-making processes during the project.

Director of the Sac and Fox Nation Education Department Edwina Butler-Wolfe announced a project with Jose Olivero, Public Affairs Specialist from the Social Security Administration Office.

"Mr. Olivero contacted the Sac and Fox Nation Education Department in February, to see if we could utilize some of their excess laptops. We accepted 50 laptops on March 30, 2021. This opportunity will provide the technologies needed for various telecommunications while we continue to combat COVID-19.

"My plan is to use the laptops for virtual tutoring for our Sac and Fox Students, we would like to start sessions this summer if possible. This will allow our students to have additional resources for assistance and provide a safe environment virtually where our tribal students can receive a more one-on-one approach with their studies," Director Butler-Wolfe

On November 22, 2021, Chief Justin Wood received an email from Coca-Cola's executive director, in regard to some potential computers (laptops) to be donated for our junior and senior high school students. event was coordinated by Title VI Coordinator Carrie LaDeaux, Adult Protective Services Program Coordinator Mindy Eicher, staff members Candice Tainpeah, Cathy McEntire and Jennifer Gunter and others.

The activities included the initiation of a 30-day 'walk-a-thon' program in Jim Thorpe Memorial Park and the presentation of pedometers to elders for the measuring of walk distances, messages from guest speakers, door prizes and a prepared lunch.

#### August

Truman Carter, founder and owner of Indian Country Law Center in Shawnee, Okla. submitted for publication "A Strategic Plan for Tribal Government Leaders," which provided the history of the federal-tribal relationships and policies, and recommendations.

The article, in part states: "The year 2021 has become a critical time in the history of Indian Tribes in Oklahoma in particular and around the country in general. Tribal leaders are facing attacks and challenges to tribal sovereignty, tribal tribal ways of life.

"Because of the numerous successes of Tribes in providing and expanding public services and business ventures, state officials are asking Congress to enact laws that erode those precious rights, privileges and immunities that past tribal leaders have fought so hard to prevent tribal erosion in favor of the state control over tribal and Indian activities on Indian

"The duty and obligation of every Indian tribal leader is to take every action necessary to leave the tribes in better shape than they found them."

Lambert Construction Company, of Stillwater, Okla., received a 'Build Oklahoma' award from the Associated General Contractors of Oklahoma (AGCOK) for its successful completion of the Sac

and Fox Nation Transportation Facility, which also houses the tribe's elders and veterans organizations.

This is a single story building in Stroud, Okla. consisting of 9,231 square feet of finished interior and another 2,700 square feet of external courtyard space.

#### September

Family members and friends of the late Don Couteau were in attendance July 21, 2021 as the late U. S. Army Air Corps Major was recognized by the French government for "his personal contribution towards the liberation of France" during World War II. Couteau, a Sac and Fox Nation tribal member, took part in the operation "Carpetbaggers," as a member of special operations air groups that provided aerial support behind enemy lines throughout Europe. The top-secret missions were only declassified within the last 15 years.

France Consul General Alexis Andres was in special attendance to present the 'Legion of Honor Award' with the rank of 'Chevalier' (Knight) to Major Couteau's daughter, Donna Couteau, and the Couteau Family. Also present were curself-government, and to preserving the rent Honorary France Consul for Oklahoma Grant Moak, and former Honorary France Consul for Oklahoma Barbara Thompson.

> M. Saginaw Grant, 'Wapime' (grey fish), died on Wednesday, July 28, 2021. A long-time resident of Los Angeles, he was well-known as a hereditary chief, actor and author. He passed away from natural causes in North Hollywood, California. He was born July 20, 1936 in Pawnee, Okla. to Sarah Murray Grant and Austin Grant, Sr., the oldest of four children.

Sac and Fox Judge Darrell Dowty conducted the installation ceremonies for the new secretary and grievance committee member.

Staff members of the Sac and Fox Nation's Land and Cattle Dept., along with other volunteers, gathered Saturday, Sept. 11, 2021 to plant a variety of vegetables and enjoy lunch at a garden plot prepared north of the Jim Thorpe Memorial Park powwow grounds. The garden is established in conjunction with the Sac and Fox Nation Food Sovereignty Program.

Tribal member Marilyn Spoon, upon special request, crafted a 'bandolier bag' to be exhibited at the First Americans Museum that opened Sept. 18, 2021 in Oklahoma City.

Showcased at the museum are state-of-the-art exhibitions in history, culture and art, live public and education programs; a children's discovery center with family-friendly activities; a full-service restaurant presenting unique Native-in-spired cuisine; and a museum shop featuring one-of-a-kind handmade items created by Oklahoma's premier Native American artists.

The primary filming of the upcoming Hollywood film, 'Killers of the Flower Moon,' recently concluded in and around the Pawhuska, Okla. community and other locations in the state. The much-publicized filming began in April and ended in September.

The production brought movie stars Leonardo DeCaprio, Robert De Niro, Brenden Fraser, Lily Gladstone and others to Oklahoma for the months during the filming. The filming also provided opportunities for many Native Americans from across the state to take part as 'extras,' 'stunt men' and other capacities.

Three members of the Sac and Fox Nation are known to have participated in the filming. Those include Tina Blackburn, Greg Morris and Zack Morris. The tribal members were involved as extras with various scenes and locations during the filming.

#### December

Shawnee, Okla. attorney and former longtime treasurer of the Sac and Fox Nation, Truman Carter, age 72, died on Oct. 31, 2021.

Carter was well-known throughout Oklahoma as a scholar in Indian law, a criminal prosecutor for several tribes, and an advocate for Indian children who were victims of neglect or abuse. He was also a trail blazer in the development of the first tribal-county law enforcement cross-deputization agreement, and the first fully-operational tribal police and court system in Oklahoma. For 16 years, he served as the elected treasurer of the Sac and Fox Nation.

Carter maintained a private law practice and tribal development center in Shawnee.
