\$1.2 Trillion Infrastructure Package Includes \$11 Billion for Tribes

Mayors and tribes across Oklahoma have lists miles long of projects they hope to fund with some of the more than \$5 billion that has been unlocked for Oklahoma by the federal Infrastructure Bill.

The \$1.2 trillion infrastructure package signed into law on

> The state and municipalities will receive about \$4.6 billion for roads and bridges, \$520 million for water infrastructure projects, nearly \$500 million for airport and public transportation and more than \$100 million to improve internet access for the 1.12 million low-income Oklahomans, according to the White

Despite the substantial bi-

partisan support the legislation received in the Senate and to a lesser degree in the House, every member of the Oklahoma congressional delegation voted against the bill.

Major cities and tribes across the state said they have large needs for the cash that will become available as a result of the legislation. "We have storm water needs because we're the largest city in the state of Oklahoma not to have a storm water utility

because we're the only city in the state that has to vote on the creation or raising of the utility, so having funds to address gaps in that area will be fantastic," said Norman Mayor Breea Clark.

Clark said three Norman bridges have failed in the past five years, and her office is excited about infrastructure money going toward bridge and road repairs because the city is behind in their maintenance.

The city has an important project at 36th Avenue NW that (Continued on Page 3.)

Ag Producers Face Challenges, But There **Are Reasons for Farm and Ranch Optimism**

Agricultural producers are certain to face challenges as they plan for 2022, but there are reasons to be optimistic about the U.S. farm and ranch situation as a whole, said Rob Fox, director of Cobank's Knowledge Exchange Division.

Fox discussed his outlook at Oklahoma State University Extension's 2021 Rural Economic Outlook Conference in October, where he addressed the longer-term effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, the shrinking labor force, drought impacts on cattle supplies, packer concentration, poultry profitability, views on policy he has seen in evidence coming out of Washington D.C. and more.

"Commodity prices across the board are doing pretty well, particularly the grains and especially cotton," Fox said. "Cattle prices could be a bit better, but they're not terrible. The most obvious challenges are some key risks on the crop inputs

Among the challenges listed

There are going to be shortages of chemicals and fertilizer because of plant shutdowns and logistical issues. Fertilizer prices are going to be higher the remainder of this year and into 2022. Supply chain issues will continue to plague producers for the foreseeable future.

"Tractor repair parts, blades for equipment, forage choppers, pesticides and herbicides; you name it, there are going to be delays and shortages," Fox said. "As a former dairy farmer, I can attest a producer can be in big trouble if a piece of equipment goes out. To combat this, keep more spare parts on hand, if possible, and stick to a well-designed maintenance schedule."

Trent Milacek, OSU Extension area agricultural economics specialist, agreed with Fox and recommends Oklahoma producers take all possible steps to ensure they have a plan in place for several months or more to lessen the negative effects of

potential challenges. "Get your fertilizer supplies purchased, even if you have to keep them in a shed," Milacek said. "Take advantage of current good crop prices; forward contract, look at futures prices, lock in what you can. There isn't a lot an individual producer can do about the specifics of ongoing trade negotiations, but producers need to pay attention and manage as best they can any fallout and related effects."

Ongoing trade negotiations between the United States and China could be particularly important. The current Phase One deal expires at the end of this year. Most analysts agree American agriculture has fared well overall. Unfortunately, other segments of the U.S. economy have not.

"Producers and agribusiness leaders need to watch what happens with the upcoming negotiations as America attempts to get something better across the board," Fox said. "There is going to be a lot of pressure from various industries put on negotiators."

Protein production is expected to do well in 2022. The world is demanding access to more meat – beef, chicken, pork, Fox recently told the agricultural television program SUNUP.

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

"The United States is the world's most efficient producer of meat," he said. "As long as we have a level playing field, there should be strong international markets for American meat, although some types will be more popular than others in specific countries, as always."

On the home front, most beef cattle will need supplemental feed in addition to hay this winter. The amount and type of supplement depends on the type and amount of hay available. Crop and feedstuffs prices are sharply higher this year, in part because of the export-driven corn market. Current corn prices in the southern Great Plains are 40-50% higher than the same time last year.

"Hay prices in Oklahoma are up 23.5% year over year and up 10.6% in Texas compared to the same time last year," said Derrell Peel, OSU Extension livestock marketing specialist. "Increased feed costs have been negatively affecting feedlots for several months. The impacts will grow as cow-calf and stocker producers face additional feed and supplement needs this winter."



was supposed to receive federal funding, she said. Clark said the city has matching money from a general obligation bond voted on by Norman residents waiting to be combined with federal funds to complete the project.

According to the city's website, the project involves widening 36th Ave NW from north of Tecumseh Road to north of Indian Hills Road from two to four lanes, with five-foot-wide on-street bike lanes.

"This project has a high chance of moving forward and finally being completed because of the progress we've already made, and hopefully, the infrastructure bill will fill that gap and get it over the finish line. So this is very important in Norman, and we should be able to act on it immediately," she said.

Jerald Gilbert, Enid's city manager, said the city is very excited about the prospect of additional infrastructure funding to fix the city's aging and insufficient infrastructure.

"Roads, streets, and bridges are a huge need for us in Enid. Water and sewer lines are another exciting possibilities. Just about any infrastructure that you could imagine, requires repairs, replacements, or improvements," he said.

Oklahoma City Mayor David Holt said he is very interested in money for roads and bridges and the city's transit dollars. "We're a city built around the automobile, but in the last couple of decades, our residents are wanting to see public transit alternatives and prioritize more money in that bucket to partner with some of the things we're already doing," Holt said.

Holt said Oklahoma City is building its first bus rapid transit line between Classen Boulevard and Northwest Expressway, two important medical and commercial areas. The other thing he looks forward to, Holt said, is Amtrak's promise to use infrastructure money to connect Oklahoma City to southern Kan-

The initial logo design was created by Kayla Jackson, a member of the Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe who is also a graduate of the Bureau's Haskell Indian Nations University located in Lawrence, Kansas.

"The Bureau of Indian Education is working to lay the foundation for the next generation of Native children to succeed," said Assistant Secretary – Indian Affairs Bryan Newland. "I'm proud the BIE will have an official logo as it carries out its mission moving forward, and I'm even more proud that it was designed by a BIE student - Kayla Jackson."

"Over the past few years, the Bureau of Indian Education has instituted new strategies to more independently serve the unique needs of our students," said BIE Director Tony L. Dearman. "As we build our capacity, we are creating our own identity as a world class education provider. This logo perfectly captures the spirit of our mission. Every detail honors our Indigenous heritage and our commitment to the education of our students. It encapsulates intellect and determination, which is exactly what we strive to instill in every student."

Jackson submitted her design as part of a BIE-wide competition inviting students to lead in the creation of the new logo. Following a collaborative effort where each element was thoughtfully selected to embody the essence of the Bureau, the logo went through the official process for federal approval.

"This design captures culture, knowledge, and leadership," Kayla Jackson said. "The open book represents lifelong



learning. The Indigenous student is wearing a fancy shawl regalia including moccasins, ribbon skirt, shawl, yoke, beaded headband, and eagle feather with hair long and braids. The student embodies the spirit of their ancestors by dancing with honor and carrying out prayers with every step. The eagles that are emblazoned on the shawl represent acknowledgment, strength, and determination. Finally, in the background there is the sun which gives us growth, abundance and hope."

The center of the logo is an Indigenous student placed on an open book indicating the power of knowledge and lifelong learning. The four lines on the book represent the four directions, the four seasons, the four stages of life and four sacred plants. The logo represents the ongoing commitment of the BIE to its mission as it provides educational services to its students and Tribal communities.

The logo will be used on all official correspondence as well as publications, website, social media, and communication materials.







Supply Shortages Force Scientists To Become Resourceful, Patient

For biomedical researchers, pipette tips are a bit like No. 2 pencils are for high school students taking the ACT: cheap, voluminous and indispensable. So, what do you do when suddenly none are available?

Demand for Covid-19 testing materials along with weather- and pandemic-related disruptions to manufacturing and distribution of lab equipment have forced scientists at the Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation to become resourceful and patient.

"The difficulty in finding critical equipment is as bad as I've seen it in my 30 years here," said Kiely Grundahl, a lab manager for OMRF's Genes and Human Disease Research Program. Disposable pipette tips are laboratory essentials. Scientists use the small, cone-shaped pieces of plastic to transfer tiny volumes of liquid in experiments. Several OMRF labs are having trouble finding the ones they need.

For cardiovascular biologist Audrey Cleuren, Ph.D., the problem is finding a particular plastic specimen tube. Her latest order is delayed by nearly three months. Plastics aren't the only essentials in short supply. In setting up her new lab, Cleuren had to borrow an older-model centrifuge from another OMRF scientist. Researchers use the high-speed rotating device to separate samples. Cleuren's is on backorder. Expected arrival date: March 2022.

"That's something we use daily. We have to have it," said Cleuren, who studies the function of cells that line blood vessels. "There's plenty to keep us busy. But there are some things that we have to wait for because there is no alternative."

According to the Food and Drug Administration's Device Shortage List, scarcity of testing supplies and equipment is expected to last for the "duration of the Covid-19 public health emergency." That scarcity has also led to price spikes. At OMRF, scientists go through roughly 9,000 disposable gloves per month, said Wendy Quinn, OMRF's purchasing director. Since the onset of the pandemic, their cost has risen 80%.

In carefully managed grant budgets, said Cleuren, those small expenses add up. "We pay for that." These days, lab managers like Grundahl and Mike Mc-Daniel spend hours hunting down supplies from alternate vendors. If that fails, they look to their OMRF neighbors.

"You send out a mass email," said Mc-Daniel, part of OMRF's Cardiovascular Biology Research Program. "Like 'Hey, does anybody have a this or a that they're not using for the time being to tide us over?" McDaniel said the shortages have made scheduling the use of shared equipment critical. And to overcome the scarcities of single-use plastics, some labs are even considering returning to

It takes creativity, but cooperation makes all the difference in ensuring science marches on. "This supply shortage is unprecedented," McDaniel said. "But it's been inspiring to see the team-first attitude among all the labs."

"If you look at the Amtrak map across the country, the Heartland Flyer comes up from Fort Worth and ends here in Oklahoma City, so funding in the bipartisan bill for passenger rail would potentially link us up to Newton, Kansas, which is a northern suburb of Wichita, making the whole Amtrak network more available to our residents," he said.

Holt acknowledged that projects funded by the infrastructure bill would take years to complete, and future mayors would probably "cut the ribbons" when they are finished. He said the relocation of Interstate 40 near downtown is an example of a major infrastructure project. The project was first conceived in the 1990s, and he cut the ribbon 25 years lat-

"When I talk about these things, and the benefits I see for Oklahoma City, I also recognize we're talking about years to award these dollars and years beyond that to begin construction," Holt said.

Lawton Mayor Stan Booker said "We have a lot of water-sewer infrastructure that we're hoping can be advanced with infrastructure money, and also some industrial roadwork; those are roads used for industrial traffic. "So, those are the main areas we could benefit from the most, industrial infrastructure and water-sewer infrastructure," Booker said.

Randy Sachs, a spokesman for the Choctaw Nation, said infrastructure money will allow the Nation to make intergenerational infrastructural investments in broadband expansion, road construction and surface improvements, electrification and power generation, and many other things.

"The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act are historical and incredibly large. Because of this, the transfer of funds could be slow, and implementation could be even slower. Federal agencies and departments will likely hold numerous consultations and listening sessions and accept written and oral comments to fully understand the needs and desires of tribal governments before distributing these funds," Sachs said.

It will also allow them, he said, to continue to care for their environment, which they believe is one of the primary responsibilities of tribal communities.

"The Choctaw Nation is grateful to the Biden Administration and our allies in Congress for ensuring Indian Country was not forgotten during the drafting of this important legislation," he said.

- ____d. Each child who is of one-eighth or more Sac and Fox Indian blood born on or

after October 16, 1954, each of whose parents is a member of the tribe.

- e. Persons born after date of October 16, 1954, who possess one-eighth (1/8) or more Sac and Fox Indian blood, * at least one parent is a member of the Sac and Fox Nation, shall be entitled to membership with the Sac and Fox Nation, provided an application is submitted in writing to the Sac and Fox Nation and provided that such person,* if enrolled with another tribe, shall first file a conditional relinquishment with the other tribe.
- f. Persons making application for membership shall be entitled to file application under Section 3 (c) only two times, and if rejected both times, they shall not be entitled to further consideration under 3 (c).

*Having been duly ratified and approved, proposed Amendment A is hereby designated as Amendment No. VII to the Constitution of the Sac and Fox Nation.
