If you have limbs around your camp, please pick them up so we can mow around the campsite.

#### Oklahoma

May 17th marks the national holiday, "Victory Day" for the Sac and Fox Nation. Victory Day was declared after the Sac and Fox Nation had sued the State of Oklahoma for failing to recognize the motor vehicle titles and tags issued by our tribe.

With a Native American legal team, including the late Bill Rice, the late Truman Carter and Greg Bigler, the case made it through all levels of the court system in our favor. The final decision by the Supreme Court was unanimous 9-0, siding with the Sac and Fox Nation. It acknowledged that the State of Oklahoma would not impose income taxes or motor vehicle taxes on Sac and Fox Nation tribal members.

Thereafter, the State of Oklahoma was to recognize the tags and titles issued to our tribal members. The Sac and Fox Nation was victorious for these reasons. However, Victory Day comes about for more reasons than that. This victory was only possible because of the tribal members who took it upon themselves to gain the education needed to break the cycles our tribe was stuck in for generations.

In our history with the U.S. Government, the Sac and Fox people were made to believe that we had lost our sovereignty. We were told that all of our matters were matters for the Bureau of Indian Affairs to dictate for us because we were not living on a reservation. They told us we had no governing authority over our own people. These things we were made to believe were never confirmed.


It was in 1980 when our people acted to change that for good.

### Supreme Court Case

Our council of that time took it upon themselves to commit to this fight for all of us: Principal Chief John R. Thorpe; Second Chief Gaylon R. Franklin, Sr.; Secretary/Treasurer Hazel Williamson; Committee Member Henrietta Massey; Committee Member Thomas Morris Jr.; and, Committee Member Alvin Falls.

In 1982, our Council enacted new taxation laws that allowed the tribe to tax oil, gas, sales, tobacco, and earnings. These actions taken by our council than winning the Supreme Court case. May 17th is a Sac and Fox Holiday that acknowledges we have always had the power to govern according to our own laws. It is acknowledging that we are our own nation. Sac and Fox Victory Day is set to remind us of our sovereignty. It is a day to recognize our strength and resilience.

## Church, School **Added to National Historic Register**

Oklahoma Historical Soci-The ety, State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) has announced the National Register of Historic Places designation for the following properties in Oklahoma. The National Register of Historic Places is the nation's official list of properties significant in our past.

### Oklahoma County

First Unitarian Church of Oklahoma City, 60 N W 18 h St., Oklahoma City

First Unitarian Church of Oklahoma City was listed in the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion C at the local level of significance for Architecture. Constructed in 1929, with additions completed in 198 and 1974 First Unitarian Church is an excellent local example of a religious building designed in the Colonial Revival architectural style. Original building sections, including the sanctuary and Daniel Hall, were designed by the firm Smith and Walker of Boston, Mass. These sections retain much of their original layout and historic features, including multi-light arched windows and a prominent copper-clad spire. Subsequent additions reflect midcentury interpretations of the Colonial Revival style and completed the building's uniqe, U-shaped footprint around an elevated open courtyard. The overall design and construction of First Unitarian Church reflects the evolution of the congregation's community outreach and education programs. The property remains a community landmark symbolizing downtown Oklahoma City's historic development.

### Seminole County

Seminole High School, **0**1 North Timmons St., Seminole

Seminole High School, located in Seminole, Seminole County, was listed in the National Register of Historic Places at the local level of significance for its association with Community Planning

# U. S. Dept. of Interior to Hold Nation-to-Nation Consultations

The U. S. Department of the Interior's Office of the Assistant Secretary for Indian Affairs on March 29 announced that it will hold nation-to-nation consultations with Tribes on draft amendments to two different regulations, one regarding the fee-to-trust process and one regarding Class III gaming compacts. The potential changes to these separate regulations aim to address concerns about their clarity, efficiency, and cost. Tribal leaders were notified of upcoming consultations in a letter from Assistant Secretary for Indian Affairs Bryan Newland.

"The changes we are exploring represent progress towards good governance and follow-through on the Biden-Harris administration's commitments to Indian Country," said Assistant Secretary Bryan Newland. "We understand the importance of ensuring a timely and efficient process for taking land into trust and providing clarity on Class III gaming compact negotiations. We look forward to additional feedback from Tribes on how to further improve these proposed amendments."

Taking land into trust on behalf of Tribes is critical for Tribal sovereignty, self-determination, preservation of history and culture, economic development, well-being of Tribal citizens, and to help right the wrongs of past policy. The changes being considered to 25 C.F.R. Part 151 would lead to a more efficient, less cumbersome, and less expensive fee-to-trust process by clarifying the Secretary of the Interior's authority to take land in trust for Tribes, reducing processing time, and establishing clear decision-making criteria. The proposed amendments also place an express focus on taking land into trust for conservation purposes. The proposed changes would build on action taken by Secretary of the Interior Deb Haaland in her first month in office to improve land in trust process. In April 2021, Secretary Haaland issued Secretary's Order 90, which re-delegates the authority to review and approve applications to place land into trust to the Bureau of Indian Affairs regional directors. The action reversed steps taken in 2017 that unnecessarily elevated land-intotrust decisions to the Department's headquarters staff, increasing the complexity of the decision-making process and causing delays. The proposed amendments were also developed in response to nation-to-nation consultations on tribal homelands restoration held in October 2021.

The Indian gaming industry remains one of the most significant sources of Tribal economic development in Indian Country. The changes being considered to 25 C.F.R. Part 293, which governs the review and approval of tribal-state gaming compacts, would provide clarity on the criteria the Department would consider when deciding whether to approve these compacts by clarifying boundaries as to allowable topics of negotiation, better defining key terms, and clearly outlining when the Department must review a gaming compact.

The Department will conduct four virtual consultation sessions between May 9 and May 23. While these regulations are not directly connected to one another, the Department is holding consultations on these changes at the same time to maximize convenience for Tribal leaders.

and Development, Education and Architecture. The property is significant for community planning and development as a tangible product of the City Beautiful Movement in Seminole. Construction of a new, expansive high school building that was modern in every respect provided for an expanded curriculum, including a junior college, making the property significant for education. Seminole High School is also architecturally significant as an exemplary local example of a pre-New Deal, Art Deco-styled school building designed by prominent Oklahoma architect Josephus Overton (J. O.) Parr. The period of significance extends from 190 to 190. In addition to the three-story school building, an expansive front lawn, metal flagpole and stone retaining wall all contribute to the property's historic significance.

Listing in the National Register of Historic Places is an honorific designation that provides recognition, limited protection and, in some cases, financial incentives for these important properties. The SHPO identifies, evaluates and nominates properties for this special designation.

## Sac and Fox Nation Education Department News

We hope that everyone is enjoying the fine weather that we are having. Just to give an update on the VISA Cards for the RAP Clothing/School Supply. We have made an agreement with the Citizen Bank of Ada to start the process of our account with them. The cards will be available to issue out when we start accepting RAP Clothing/School Supply Applications on July 1, 2022.

If you received funding for 2021-2022 school year and DID NOT TURN IN YOUR CLOTHING RECEIPTS, YOU WILL NOT BE ELIGIBLE TO SUBMIT **APPLICATION IN JULY 2022** 

This next school year 2022-2023, the clothing allowance will be \$300.00 and \$100.00 for school supply per student. You will still need to fill out RAP Clothing/School Supply application and have your school sign for verification of enrollment. We will not be asking for a W-9 form BUT YOU WILL NEED TO SEND IN STUDENT(S) COPY OF TRIBAL MEMBERSHIP CARD.

You will receive two different cards for clothing and school supply. When you receive your VISA cards in the mail PLEASE READ THE INSTRUC-TIONS. If you lose your cards there will be a \$5.00 fee per card for the first time and will be deduct from either clothing or supply, whichever card is lost. If the second card you lose then it will be a \$10.00 fee per card and you will have to pay out of pocket. You will have until December 30th to use all funds on both cards. More details to come next month.

The Education Department has been

very busy attending Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) Consultations at various public school locations. We have met with Stillwater, Cushing, Tecumseh, Shawnee, McLoud and Tulsa Public Schools.

The Education Department and Health Department both setup booths at the Native American Student Day on April 1. The event was at the PayCom Center downtown Oklahoma City. There were 31 booths and 1,000 students that attended. This was the 2nd annual event. The Education Department Booth was raffling off three laptops. Students that came by the booth had to answer a 10 question survey in order to earn a raffle ticket.

Questions were as listed: How many federally recognized tribes are in Oklahoma? Can you name 5 of the Federally recognized tribes in Oklahoma? How many federally recognized are in the United States? Can you name 5 current tribal leaders in Oklahoma? Who is the Governor of Oklahoma? How many counties are in Oklahoma? Name the 5 Tribes (5 Civilized Tribes)? How many stars are on the United States Flag?

Ouestions were geared towards what we thought our American Indian Students should be aware of in our current state of affairs with the United States and amongst tribal government. The turnout was large and majority of the students successfully completed the entire questionnaire. 



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### What Are the Warning Signs of Elder Abuse?

The most common warning signs of elder abuse are strange and sudden changes to an elderly loved one's mental, physical, or financial well-being. Specific signs of elder abuse vary depending on what type of elder abuse is affecting the victim. Signs and symptoms of elder abuse can include:

- Injuries such as bruises, cuts, or broken bones
- Malnourishment or weight loss
- Poor hygiene
- Symptoms of anxiety, depression, or confusion
- Unexplained transactions or loss of money
- Withdrawal from family members or friends

To prevent elder abuse, family members should keep a close watch on older loved ones under the care of someone else. Relatives should also report any signs of elder abuse to local authorities as soon as possible.

### **Risk Factors for Elder Abuse**

While any older person can suffer from elder abuse, some run a greater risk of abuse or neglect than others. Risk factors for elder abuse include:

• Age: Adults over the age of 80 are more likely to suffer from elder abuse, according to a 2014 medical study from Northwestern University and Rush University researchers.

• Caregiver: A caregiver who lives with the elder, depends on them for financial support, abuses drugs, or has a criminal background may be more likely to commit abuse.

• Gender: The 2014 Chicago study found that women were more likely to suffer from elder abuse. Women may also suffer from more severe types of abuse over longer periods of time, according to the World Health Organization (WHO).

• Health: This includes poor physical health and mental health issues such as dementia. According to the National Council on Aging (NCOA), nearly 50% of those with dementia suffer from elder abuse and neglect.

• Isolation: According to a 2015 report from the Department of Health and Human Services (DHS), nearly 13 million older people in the U.S. lived alone. Elders who live by themselves or who are withdrawn may be at risk of abuse, according to the NCOA.

### Signs of Elder Abuse by Type

The signs of elder abuse can vary with each case, and some seniors may fall victim to more than one type of abuse. Since any type of elder abuse can affect a parent, grandparent, or other relatives, it is important to know the warning signs for each type.

### **Physical Signs of Elder Abuse**

Physical abuse is the most obvious type of elder abuse. Loved ones should regularly check up on their older family members and use their best judgment in cases of physical injury. Sometimes, caregivers or nursing home staff members may claim that something else caused the injuries to cover up the abuse.

### Signs of Emotional Abuse

While it may not leave physical scars, emotional abuse can be just as damaging to an older relative's health. Emotional abuse can include screaming, threatening, or instilling fear in an elderly loved one. Signs of emotional elder abuse include:

- Being hesitant to talk freely
- Isolating or withdrawing from others
- Making up implausible stories about how an injury occurred
- Suffering from anxiety, anger, depression, or fear

As a senior transition into the care of someone else, family members should take note of their emotional well-being. If the elder's happiness and overall mood decrease in a concerning way, emotional abuse could be the cause.

### Signs of Financial Abuse

Unlike the other types of abuse, financial abuse can go unnoticed because

- Keeping the elderly person from talking to visitors alone
- Speaking about the elder as if they were a burden
- Using flirtatious or inappropriate language around the elder



the senior's physical and emotional health won't be directly affected. Yet financial abuse can leave elders unable to afford even the most basic health care needs. Common signs of financial abuse include:

- Large sums of money missing from bank statements
- The senior cannot access their financial records

• The elder provides gifts or monetary reimbursement in exchange for companionship

• Strange or unexplainable transactions

A trusted financial expert or family member should monitor the elderly person's accounts and ask about any concerning transactions, if possible. If the senior cannot explain the loss of funds, they may be a victim of financial abuse. Signs of Sexual Abuse

Some seniors, such as those with mental or physical handicaps, may not be able to consent to sexual relationships. If an elder is sexually abused, their physical and emotional health can suffer significantly. Sexual abuse can also devastate loved ones and family members. Signs of sexual abuse of an elder include:

- An unexplained sexually transmitted disease (STD)
- Bruises on the thighs or genitals
- Bleeding, pain, or irritation of the genitals
- Inappropriate relationships between a caregiver and elder

Family members should promptly address any possible cases of sexual abuse to keep their parents, grandparents, or other elderly relatives safe.

## Warning Signs of Neglect

While the signs of elder abuse and neglect are similar, the latter often stems from inadequate care, not intentional harm. That said, neglect can be just as harmful to an elderly loved one's health, particularly if the health issues go on for months. Signs of neglecting an elder include:

- Bedsores or pressure ulcers
- Being left in bed for an extended period of time without supervision or care
- Lack of basic hygiene, adequate food, or hydration
- Missing medical aids, such as walkers, dentures, eyeglasses, medications, or hearing aids

• Unclean or unsafe living conditions, such as a lack of heat or plumbing, soiled bedding, or bug infestations

## Signs of Abusive Caregivers

Trusted family members should always keep a close watch on those providing care to their elderly parents, grandparents, and other relatives. Sometimes, the first signs of elder abuse stem from caregivers. Possible signs of abusive caregivers include:

- Being indifferent, angry, demeaning, or aggressive toward the elderly person
- Failing to show affection toward the senior (if they are related)

Many victims are frail and vulnerable, cannot help themselves and depend on others to meet their basic needs. Physical, behavioral and environmental signs, or signs of financial irregularities, are **WARNING SIGNS** of possible abuse or neglect. They are not proof, but they are clues that a problem may exist.

This program will fund as many Tribal Member requests as funding will permit. However, preference may be given to emergency situations. • Applicants claiming a physical disability must provide a physician's statement.

### ELDERS/DISABLED LAWN CARE SERVICES RESPONSIBILITY LETTER

### 2022 Mowing Season will begin April 15, 2022 through September 15, 2022

- 1. Home and Property must be occupied by the eligible Sac and Fox Tribal Member.
- 2. This Program is a **Supplemental** Lawn Service to the eligible Sac and Fox Tribal Member. There will be a guarantee of Ten (10) cuts per mowing season, to occur bi-weekly during the 2022 mowing season.
- 3. Property must be cleared of any and all debris before lawn can be mowed. This includes all trash receptacle's, trash, toys, etc. Failure to remove any and all items large and small that may interfere with the lawn care will result in your Service Provider/Contractor not mowing/weed eating that specific area.
- 4. The Sac and Fox Tribal Member is responsible for notifying the Service Provider/Contractor of any hazards i.e. pipes, boards, tress stumps, etc. (This information helps protect the Service Provider/Contractor from harm and also allows him/her to protect their equipment).
- 5. Up to One (1) acre will be mowed. A lawn is considered to be less than an acre in size & in proportion with a normal sized urban lot.
- 6. If you, as the Sac and Fox Tribal Member, request the Service Provider/Contractor to mow and or weed eat more, it will be <u>your responsibility</u> to pay for that portion serviced. The Elders Title VI Lawn Care Program is <u>only</u> responsible for payment of \$60.00 for Two (2) mows a month for the above mentioned sizes.
- 7. If you or our Service Provider/Contractors have any issues regarding the safety of a lawn or the size of a lawn that cannot be resolved between yourself and the Service Provider/Contractor; Services will be suspended until the Elders Title VI Program assesses the situation and reaches a mutual resolution with both parties.
- 8. It will be at the discretion of the Elders Title VI Lawn Care Services Program who will be your Service Provider/Contractor for the 2022 Lawn Care season.
- 9. **<u>DO NOT</u>** sign the Service Provider/Contractor invoice until <u>AFTER</u> services are completed.
