'Not Invisible Act' Commission Set to Begin Active Advisory Role

On May 5, 2022, U. S. Secretary of the Interior Deb Haaland and U. S. Deputy Attorney General Lisa Monaco recognized 'National Missing or Murdered Indigenous Persons Awareness Day' with a virtual event to highlight the 'Not Invisible Act' Commission.

During the event, panelists discussed the Missing and Murdered Indigenous Peoples (MMIP) crisis and the importance of the Not Invisible Act Commission in the collaborative efforts to address the crisis. The event was live-streamed on the Interior Department's website.

The Departments of the Interior and Justice are working In Combating Violence Against Native People

to implement the Not Invisible Act, sponsored by Secretary Haaland during her time in Congress. The law established the Not Invisible Act Commission, a cross jurisdictional advisory committee composed of law enforcement, Tribal leaders, federal partners, service providers, family members of missing and murdered individuals, and most importantly - survivors. The Departments announced the Not Invisible Act Commission members.

"The Justice Department is committed to addressing the crisis of missing or murdered Indigenous persons with the urgency it demands," said Attorney General Merrick B. Garland. "That commitment is reflected in the strength of our partnerships across the federal government, including with the Department of the Interior as we take the nex steps in launching the Not Invisible Act Commis-

"The Commissioners announced today will play a critical role in our efforts to better meet the public safety needs of Native communities. The Justice Department will continue to work alongside our Tribal partners with respect, sincerity, and a shared interest in the wellbeing of Tribal communities."

"Everyone deserves to feel safe in their community, but a lack of urgency, transparency and coordination have hampered our country's efforts to combat violence against American Indians and Alaska Natives," said Interior Secretary Deb Haaland.

"As we work with the Department of Justice to prioritize the missing and murdered Indigenous people's crisis, the Not Invisible Act Commission will help address the underlying roots of the Missing and Murdered Indigenous Peoples crisis by ensuring the voices of those impacted by violence against Native people are included in our quest to implement solu-

tions.' The Not Invisible Act Commission will make recommendations to the Departments of the Interior and Justice to improve intergovernmental coordination and establish best practices for state, tribal, and federal law enforcement, to bolster resources for survivors and victim's families, and to combat the epidemic of missing persons, murder, and trafficking of Native American, Alaska Native, and Native Hawaiian people.

Among its missions, the Commission will:

- Identify, report and respond to instances of missing and murdered Indigenous peoples (MMIP) cases and human traf-
- Develop legislative and administrative changes necessary to use federal programs, properties, and resources to combat the crisis:
- Track and report data on MMIP and human trafficking
- Consider issues related to the hiring and retention of law enforcement offices,

Coordinate Tribal-state-federal resources to combat MMIP and human trafficking offices on Indian lands; and,

· Increase information shar-

ing with Tribal governments on violent crimes investigations and other prosecutions on Indian lands.

The Commission has the authority to hold hearings, gather testimony, and receive additional evidence and feedback from its members to develop recommendations for the secretary and attorney general.

Mother of Deceased Tribal Member Creates Resource Tool for Native Homicide Victims' Families

The local Oklahoma headline of the Shawnee News-Star read "Woman Lying in the Road Gets Hit, Killed by Car near Shawnee." But, I am so much more than that. I was taken from my family on the night of January 9th, 2021 under questionable circumstances.

My name is Skye (Griggs) Jim, I was 30 years old and a mother of five beautiful children. I was a daughter, grand daughter, a sister, a niece, and an auntie. I was Sac and Fox and Shawnee. My maternal great grandmother was the late Beatrice Onzahwah. My paternal grandmother was the late Cora Bass. I was also Bear clan and, like my relatives before me, I belonged to this land. I belonged here.

In order to understand my story, it is also important that you understand the issue of Missing and Murdered Indige-

nous Women (MMIW). According to the 2018 Urban Indian Health Institute Research

Report: * Murder is the third-leading cause of

death among American Indian and Alaskan Native women. * Native women are mur-

dered and sena llv assaulted 10X the national average. * 29 years old is the median

age of the victims. * 1 out of 3 Native women are sena lly assaulted in their life-

time. * 8 % of these assaults are perpetrated by non-natives.

In 2015 there were 5,712 known incidents yet only 112 cases were logged into the federal database and 95% of those cases were not covered by national or international media.

O klahoma is one of the top ten states with highest numbers of MMIW cases.

You should know, however, that my story may or may not

be unique. You see, I have fallen under both categories of Missing and Murdered.

At the young age of 15, I went missing and in that, I ex perienced some trauma, but I survived. It became a federal interstate case, but my family fought for me and, unlike many missing indigenous women and girls, they were able to find me and bring me home alive.

It is difficult for my family knowing that they fought for me but have now lost me 15 years later to yet another act of colonial violence. Colonial violence against both Indigenous Women and Men is real. It's tragic and affects our families and communities in so many ways

Mismatch in Emotions vs Assistance Received After Natural Disasters

The intensity of emotions exervices
Online when natural disasters strike doesn't necessarily lead to an equal amount of financial assistance when people need recovery help afterward, according to recent Oklahoma State University research.

"There was a significant mismatch," said Courtney Bir, an Oklahoma State University Ex ension farm management specialist and assistant professor in the OSU Department of Agricultural Economics. "This rapid fall in media attention may leave directly impacted communities without help and support as they face the difficulty of rebuilding after a disaster."

An understanding of social media activity might help government agencies and relief organizations make better use of public attention before, during and after disasters such as hurricanes, as well as wildfires, tornadoes and weather events common in Oklahoma.

In the study recently published in the journal Natural Disasters, researchers found Online media responses to catastrophes vary based on a wide range of factors such as the type of disaster, geography, population impacted and severity of damage. For ex mple, social media content related to hurricanes has typically outnumbered fire content, which mostly can be attributed to larger populations in coastal areas. Analysis of such social media references could be helpful to policymakers and agencies such as the American Red Cross and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

Researchers also warned of pitfalls, such as unscrupulous people who prey on trending media content to increase promotions of unrelated products. They also noted the impact of "compassion fatigue," a personal sense of depleted empathy due to overwhelming expos ure to suffering.

So, timing is key, Bir said. The research showed there was a mismatch in public response between periods that people posted about disasters on social media and the times when aid was needed to rebuild. "That range of behavior could be a significant factor in helping Oklahomans," Bir said. "Wildfires impact Oklahoma agricultural producers, and they cannot rely on early social media support to result in material help later. Thoughts and prayers Online are great, but donations and support post-disaster are still needed."

Sec. Haaland Announces the Launch Of Boarding School 'Road to Healing'

Secretary of the Interior Deb Haaland and Assistant Secretary for Indian Affairs Bryan Newland on May 11, 2022 released Volume 1 of the investigative report called for as part of the Federal Indian Boarding School Initiative, a comprehensive effort to address the troubled legacy of federal Indian boarding school policies. This report lays the groundwork for the continued work of the Interior Department to address the intergenerational trauma created by historical federal Indian boarding school policies.

This investigative report is a significant step by the federal government to comprehensively address the facts and consequences of its federal Indian boarding school policies—implemented for more than a century and a half—resulting in the twin goals of cultural assimilation and territorial dispossession of Indigenous peoples through the forced removal and relocation of their children. It reflects an extensive and first-ever inventory of federally operated schools, including profiles and maps.

The investigation found that from 1819 to 1969, the federal Indian boarding school system consisted of 408 federal schools across 37 states or then territories, including 21 schools in Alaska and 7 schools in Hawaii. The investigation identified marked or unmarked burial sites at approximately 53 different schools across the school system. As the investigation continues, the Department expects the number of identified burial sites to increase.

"The consequences of federal Indian boarding school policies—including the intergenerational trauma caused by the family separation and cultural eradication inflicted upon generations of children as young as 4 years old—are heartbreaking and undeniable," said Secretary Haaland. "We continue to see the evidence of this attempt to forcibly assimilate Indigenous people in the disparities that communities face. It is my priority to not only give voice to the survivors and descendants of federal Indian boarding school policies, but also to address the lasting legacies of these policies so Indigenous peoples can continue to grow and heal."

"This report presents the opportunity for us to reorient federal policies to support the revitalization of Tribal languages and cultural practices to counteract nearly two centuries of federal policies aimed at their destruction," said Assistant Secretary Newland. "Together, we can help begin a healing process for Indian Country, the Native Hawaiian Community and across the United States, from the Alaskan tundra to the Florida everglades, and everywhere in between."

As part of the Federal Indian Boarding School Initiative and in response to recommendations from the report, Secretary Haaland announced the launch of "The Road to Healing." This year-long tour

Business Committee Meeting Minutes are now accessible on the Website sacandfoxnation-nsn.gov and Facebook will include travel across the country to allow American Indian, Alaska Native, and Native Hawaiian survivors of the federal Indian boarding school system the opportunity to share their stories, help connect communities with trauma-informed support, and facilitate collection of a permanent oral history.

"The Department's work thus far shows that an all-of-government approach is necessary to strengthen and rebuild the bonds within Native communities that federal Indian boarding school policies set out to break," added Secretary Haaland. "With the President's direction, we have begun working through the White House Council of Native American Affairs on the path ahead to preserve Tribal languages, invest in survivor-focused services, and honor our obligations to Indigenous communities. We also appreciate the ongoing engagement and support for this effort from Members of Congress and look forward to continued collaboration."

Volume 1 of the report highlights some of the conditions children endured at these schools and raises important questions about the short- and long-term consequences of the federal Indian boarding school system on American Indian, Alaska Native, and Native Hawaiian communities

The investigation found that the federal Indian boarding school system deployed systematic militarized and identity-alteration methodologies in an attempt to assimilate American Indian, Alaska Native, and Native Hawaiian children through education, including but not limited to renaming Indian children from Indian to English names; cutting the hair of Indian children; discouraging or preventing the use of American Indian, Alaska Native, and Native Hawaiian languages, religions and cultural practices; and organizing Indian and Native Hawaiian children into units to perform military drills.

Despite assertions to the contrary, the investigation found that the school system largely focused on manual labor and vocational skills that left American Indian, Alaska Native, and Native Hawaiian graduates with employment options often irrelevant to the industrial U.S. economy, further disrupting Tribal economies.







12 Things Everyone Can Do to Prevent Elder Abuse

Our communities are like buildings that support people's wellbeing. Sturdy buildings ensure that people are safe and thriving at every age. We all have a part to play in this construction project.

Here are 12 things everyone can do to build community supports and prevent elder abuse.

Learn the signs of elder abuse and neglect and how we can collectively solve the issue.

Talk to friends and family members about how we can all age well and reduce abuse with programs and services like improved law enforcement, community centers, and public transportation.

- Prevent isolation. Call or visit our older loved ones and ask how they are doing regularly.
- Send a letter to a local paper, radio or TV station suggesting that they cover World Elder Abuse Awareness Day [June 15] or Grandparents Day in September.
- Join Ageless Alliance, an organization that connects people of all ages, nationwide, who stand united for the dignity of older people and for the elimination of elder abuse. Visit agelessalliance.org.
- > Provide respite breaks for caregivers.

- Encourage our bank managers to train tellers on how to detect elder financial abuse.
- > **Ask our doctors** to ask all older patients about possible family violence in their lives.
- Contact a local Adult Protective Services or Long-Term Care Ombudsman to learn how to support their work helping older people and adults with disabilities who may be more at-risk.
- Organize an "Aging with Dignity" essay or poster contest in a local school.
- Ask religious congregation leaders to give a talk about elder abuse at a service or to put a message about elder abuse in the bulletin.
- Volunteer to be a friendly visitor to a nursing home resident or to a homebound older person in our communities.

It is up to <u>all of us</u> to prevent and address elder abuse!

Sac and Fox Mission School Report

Submitted by: Chris Boyd, NAGPRA Coordinator

The Sac and Fox Historic Preservation Office, along with the Bureau of Indian Affairs, has taken an initiative to conduct multiple surveys to better understand the history of the Sac and Fox Agency property. Our first objective is to investigate the history of our Mission School.

Between December 31st 2021 and January 4th 2022, Joe Deere Consulting, LLC conducted a Class III archaeological survey at the site of the mission school campus. Tribal members have a growing interest and concern in the history of our school bearing in mind the current climate surrounding investigations involving multiple mission schools and boarding schools across Canada and the United States.

We must first understand the history of the school before we continue to investigate. We are at the beginning phases of a multiple survey project that will allow us to better understand a critical point in our past as Sauk people. We know that the construction and implementation of this school along with the Dawes act were disturbing actions of assimilation to destroy our language, history and culture. We will continue to unveil the truth in order to educate Sauk people on the importance of language, history and culture. Below is a summary from the survey:

The Sac and Fox Mission School project is in the northern portion of the SW quartile of Section 22, Township 14N R6E. This parcel, along with much of the surrounding land, was assigned through Treaty and later allotted to the Sac and Fox Nation, pre-1900 (Specifically, Government Land Office (GLO) 1873 map has, "Sack Fox Agency" written in pencil and the 1875 GLO map has the Sac and Fox agency and Mission school well established.

Historic resources do not agree on dates for the Mission school or its buildings. However, a general outline of the history of the archaeological resources found in this survey can be constructed:

• Between 1870 and 1873 – The Sac and Fox Mission school began, originally called a manual labor school, then an industrial school, the school began with both boys and girls in attendance, but not on the original campus. The school started in "an unfinished dwelling of the physician at the Sac and Fox Agency" (Chronicles of Oklahoma, Winter 1951, Vol 29:4). Between 1872 and 1874 – The original brick one-room school building was built with a south facing entrance towards the main road. There was a dirt wagon road leading up to the school building, and a fieldstone wall extending west from the building on its front side.

This wall may have extended on the eastern end as well, but photo evidence does not allow for this assertion. This original school had a single entrance and two shuttered windows on each side of the entrance on the south end, a chimney on the north end, and its east and west facing façades had three shuttered windows each. First-person memoirs comment that the school was, "filled with double school desks" (House, page 451, Chronicles).

• Between 1873 and 1874 – Possibly just after but about the same time as the original school building was built; the Mission Building was built in its original 3-story brick form. The Mission Build-

ing was built in the Gothic Revival style, with a steeply pitched roof, front and side gables, and a one-story porch.

- Between 1875 and 1910 There were 3-4 construction episodes that included additions to the Mission school building. A frame structure on the back of the building (north side), a frame addition on the east end of the building, a larger frame addition to the north side of the building (from one story on stilts to 3 stories with a brick sub-wall foundation), and an addition of a bell, another chimney (east end) and window extensions are the additions that happened over the years.
- 1891 to 1892 A large frame building was built behind (north) the Mission Building for laundry and storage; the Girls' Dormitory was built on the eastern edge of the campus, and the two-story frame School Building addition was built.
- The Girls' Dormitory originally did not have the windows protruding for the rooftop that allows the attic rooms to have windows. No addition to the dormitory is discussed in historic documents, so it is probable that the additional windows were constructed very soon after the building was built. The Girls' Dormitory was of the Colonial Revival style, which was popular in America from 1880-1955 (McAlester 2013). The façade was symmetrical with square Doric columns.
- The School Building addition is also of the Colonial Revival style. The School Building addition was hipped (roof style with no gables) with a full-width porch, and is sometimes called the Classic Box. The façade was symmetrical. Around 1900 wood plank sidewalks were built around the buildings.

• Between 1895 and 1910 – The steel water tower, bell tower, and a windmill were built. These were probably built closer to 1895. However, the evidence is misleading. There could have been an earlier windmill and water tower that were situated further south and closer to the main road than any of the buildings. This is probable. Then the new steel tower would have been built in its current location closer to 1910. There is no picture evidence of a windmill. The bell tower is equally lacking in historic doc-

Though the wooden tower behind the School Building addition (NW) obviously was created for something heavy and has a visible pulley, this author originally believed the tower to be for a well wheel pulley system. With the lack of historic and archaeological evidence for either, the tower remains mysterious. The first photo of the place where the wooden tower was built was before the actual construction of the tower, and is a photo of boys (Jim Thorpe reportedly amongst them) taken ca. 1894.

If this tower is a bell tower, then there is little chance for any archaeological evidence. However, if a well is found filled in where the tower once stood (which is a very real possibility due to its location next to the original brick school building), then further archaeological evidence may allow for a better understanding of this tower structure.

• 1905 to 1915 – Several relatively small buildings were built around campus. Reports are of: Coal house (1906), Pump House (1907), Laundry addition (1908), Carpenter Shop (1909), Cow

Shed (1910), Poultry House (1911) and the Silo (1914). Only further phase II excavation can reveal these buildings archaeologically.


After the close of the school between 1917 and 1921, no more building construction happened. There was some disagreement over ownership of the buildings and land during the 1920s as the Federal Government tried to sell the houses and use the land for oil and gas purposes. The Sac and Fox took their case to court, and saved the buildings from being sold, and the campus from being used for oil and gas extraction.

• By the 1940s Tribal members had moved into the out-building like the staff quarters and the laundry house. Historic archaeological evidence for this time period is found in mounds and mechanical push-piles around the site with artifacts

including hair spray cans, glass bottles and other dateable refuse. The girls' dorm burned down in the early1940s and historic evidence suggests the school building may have met the same fate after 1951.

Archaeological evidence of mechanical ground disturbance in and around the area of the School Building addition and the Mission Building are the last entries for the timeline and would have happened after 1951, and could have been from multiple disturbance episodes over a couple of decades. Trees growing up in the area that would have been razed are between 20 and 50+ years old.

- Funding for this program is limited and each application will be processed in the order in which it was received. This program will fund as many Tribal Member requests as funding will permit. However, preference may be given to emergency situations.
- Applicants claiming a physical disability must provide a physician's statement.

2022 Mowing Season will begin April 15, 2022 through September 15, 2022

- 1. Home and Property must be occupied by the eligible Sac and Fox Tribal Member.
- 2. This Program is a <u>Supplemental</u> Lawn Service to the eligible Sac and Fox Tribal Member. There will be a guarantee of Ten (10) cuts per mowing season, to occur bi-weekly during the 2022 mowing season.
- 3. Property must be cleared of any and all debris before lawn can be mowed. This includes all trash receptacle's, trash, toys, etc. Failure to remove any and all items large and small that may interfere with the lawn care will result in your Service Provider/Contractor not mowing/weed eating that specific area.
- 4. The Sac and Fox Tribal Member is responsible for notifying the Service Provider/Contractor of any hazards i.e. pipes, boards, tress stumps, etc. (This information helps protect the Service Provider/Contractor from harm and also allows him/her to protect their equipment).
- 5. Up to One (1) acre will be mowed. A lawn is considered to be less than an acre in size & in proportion with a normal sized urban lot.
- 6. If you, as the Sac and Fox Tribal Member, request the Service Provider/Contractor to mow and or weed eat more, it will be **your responsibility** to pay for that portion serviced. The Elders Title VI Lawn Care Program is <u>only</u> responsible for payment of \$60.00 for Two (2) mows a month for the above mentioned sizes.
- 7. If you or our Service Provider/Contractors have any issues regarding the safety of a lawn or the size of a lawn that cannot be resolved between yourself and the Service Provider/Contractor; Services will be suspended until the Elders Title VI Program assesses the situation and reaches a mutual resolution with both parties.
- 8. It will be at the discretion of the Elders Title VI Lawn Care Services Program who will be your Service Provider/Contractor for the 2022 Lawn Care season.
- DO NOT sign the Service Provider/Contractor invoice until AFTER services are completed.

Signs of Elder Abuse

Elder abuse can include neglect, physical, emotional, financial or sexual abuse. It is up to all of us to prevent and report suspected abuse. Here are some signs of elder abuse that everyone should know.

Emotional & Behavioral Signs

Unusual changes in behavior or sleep Fear or anxiety Isolated or not responsive Sadness

Physical Signs

Broken bones, bruises, and welts Cuts, sores or burns

Torn, stained or bloody underclothing Sexually transmitted diseases without clear explanation

Dirtiness, poor nutrition or dehydration

Poor living conditions

Missing daily living aids (glasses, walker, and medications)

Financial Signs

Unusual changes in bank account or money management Unusual or quick changes in a will or other financial documents Fake signatures on financial documents Unpaid bills
