Dept. of Interior Celebrates Launch of ‘Indian Youth Services Corps’

U. S. Secretary of the Interior Deb Haaland on June 10, 2022 joined tribal leaders, community partners and Indigenous youth to celebrate the launch of the Indian Youth Service Corps (IYSC) and unveil the program’s guidelines.

The IYSC is a new partnership-based program designed to provide meaningful education, employment and training opportunities to Indigenous youth through conservation projects on public and Indian lands, and Hawaiian homelands, putting young people on a path to good-paying jobs while working to tackle the climate crisis.

Building on the decade-long success of the Ancestral Lands Conservation Corps, the IYSC will provide opportunities for Native Americans and Alaska Natives to support the conservation and protection of natural and cultural resources through construction, restoration or rehabilitation of natural, cultural, historic, archaeological, recreational or scenic resources. Participants will receive a mix of work experience, basic and life skills, education, training and mentoring.

“Indigenous people have a strong and abiding connection to the Earth – increasing their access to nature early and often will help lift up the next generation of stewards for this Earth,” said Secretary Haaland. “In addition to completing much-needed conservation projects that will enhance landscapes and ecosystems on Tribal and public lands, the Indian Youth Service Corps will have considerable focus on vocational skills training, economic empowerment and career development for Indigenous youth.”

Authorized in 2019 by the John D. Dingell, Jr. Conservation, Management, and Recreation Act, the John S. McCain III 21st Century Conservation Service Corps Act amended and expanded the Public Lands Corps Act to establish the IYSC.

The National Park Foundation (NPF) on June 10 announced a new commitment to fund \$1 million in IYSC projects, in addition to its ongoing support of Tribal youth service corps projects. NPF is currently funding more than 10 projects

from Maine to New Mexico that engage Tribal youth in a wide range of conservation and preservation activities, providing invaluable skills development, personal and professional mentoring and career preparation. Projects also protect Indigenous cultural practices, languages and traditional ecological knowledge used for land management practices.

“The imprint of Tribal history and culture is visible across our national park landscapes,” said National Park Foundation President and CEO Will Shafroth. “Supporting the Indian Youth Service Corps engages and connects Tribal youth to the care and preservation of sacred places across the nation’s public lands.”

Tribal leaders, community partners and several current and former Indigenous members of the Conservation Legacy Ancestral Lands Conservation Corps and Rocky Mountain Youth Corps joined a virtual round-table with Secretary Haaland and Shafroth to share their experiences in conservation.

The IYSC guidelines provide a framework for Tribal and partner organizations’ participation in the program. Goals of the program include creating awareness of Indigenous culture and history, and conserving and protecting their landscapes, stories and shared experiences for current and future generations.

The program guidelines were established in consultation with Indian Tribes, the Bureau of Indian Affairs and other stakeholders. They authorize the Departments of the Interior, Agriculture and Commerce to implement the new program.

IYSC activities can include research projects, oral histories, habitat surveys, climate mitigation, trail restoration, invasive species removal, fire fuels reduction, watershed restoration, recreational expansion and the development of educational, informational or communication materials for the public.

The projects will promote Indian self-determination and economic development and can take place on Tribal lands, or

on federal lands where Tribes have ancestral connections. All projects on Indian lands will be designed and managed in a collaborative fashion, including consultation with the Tribal

government prior to the start of any project.

The Interior Dept. is committed to strengthening Tribal sovereignty and governance, fulfilling the federal government’s

trust and treaty responsibilities, and engaging in robust consultation with Tribal Nations. This year, the Department is providing \$2 million to the Bureau of Indian Affairs, \$700,000 to the National Park Service and \$600,000 to the Bureau of Reclamation to establish the IYSC.



Oral History Project Returns to SFN Library

The Sac and Fox National Public Library is reviving their Oral History Project after a 24-year hiatus. This year’s project is funded through the Association of Tribal Archives, Libraries, and Museums American Rescue Plan: Humanities Grants for Native Institutions. One of the devastating effects of the COVID-19 pandemic was losing elders and tribal members. The loss of an elder is a

loss of stories and cultural knowledge. In the hopes of providing learning opportunities through storytelling and safekeeping elders’ oral histories, ten elders were chosen to participate this year. BIA Announces ‘Living Languages Grants’ for 45 Tribes

U. S. Assistant Secretary for Indian Affairs Bryan Newland announced June 14, 2022 that the Indian Affairs Office of Indian Economic Development has awarded \$7 million in grants under the Living Languages Grant Program to 45 American Indian and Alaska Native Tribes and Tribal organizations.

The Living Languages Grant Program provides an opportunity for Tribes to receive funding to document and revitalize languages that are at risk of disappearing because of a declining native-speaker population. For more than 150 years, Native languages in the U.S. have been subjected to suppression and elimination from a variety of factors such as federal boarding and other types of schools that forced American Indian, Alaska Native and Native Hawaiian children to forgo speaking the language of their peoples.

“Native language preservation has for many years been cited by Indigenous leaders as important to their self-preservation, self-determination and sovereignty. Native preservation and language revitalization is a critical priority because languages go to the heart of a Tribe’s unique cultural identities, traditions, spiritual beliefs and self-governance,” said Assistant Secretary Newland. “Through the Living Languages Grant Program and other inter-agency efforts, the Biden-Harris administration is working to invest in and strengthen the nation-to-nation relationship and ensure that progress in In-

dian Country endures for years to come.”

The program evaluated 59 applications, totaling \$9.37 million in requests, to support Tribal programs that document Native American languages or build Tribal capacity to create or expand language preservation

programs.

Grant proposals were rated on the extent to which funding would document, preserve or revitalize a Native language; the degree to which the language addressed by a proposal risks extinction; the likelihood that

Lawrence Oliver Kahbeah, Sr.

Lawrence Oliver Kahbeah Sr., a U.S. Navy veteran of Okmulgee, Okla., passed on from this life into eternity on Friday, May 20, 2022 in the comfort of his own home at the age of 92.

Lawrence was born on December 22, 1929 in Horton, Kansas to Oliver and Bessie “Wakolee” Kahbeah. He grew up in Shawnee, Okla. at the home place on Moccasin Trail Rd. He loved telling his family the story of him walking to Possum Trot School (District #) everyday, a mile and a half each way.

After finishing school, he returned to Kansas to attend Haskell Indian University in Lawrence, KS. He then joined the National Guard and later joined the U.S. Navy. He was a boiler mate in the engine room on the USS McLaughlin. In 1950, he fought in the Korean War on the beach at Inchon Landing.

After serving his country, he started school at Oklahoma State University Technical School in Okmulgee, Okla., where he attained a degree in dry cleaning. It was while attending school he met Priscilla Simmers. Lawrence and Priscilla were married on October 19, 1955 in Muskogee, Okla. Lawrence and Priscilla had six children, who they raised in Okmulgee, with the exception of the oldest baby, Arthur, who only lived to be ten days old. Lawrence worked in the dry-cleaning business, as well as working for Indian Health Services.

Lawrence loved sharing stories of his childhood, his military experiences, his love for God and his Sac and Fox culture. After retirement, he enjoyed putting on puppet shows for the children, teaching them about his culture. He was an avid follower of Christ and he served as a layman in the Newtown Methodist Church for most of his adult life. He loved holidays and family get together and never missed an opportunity to share the love of God with others.

Sac and Fox Nation Education Department News

Greetings

We hope everyone is doing well and staying cool in this blistering hot weather. We want to share with you some of the events that the Education Department will be involved with during the month of July. School will be starting up soon for the 2022 – 2023 year. Included here are some of the sites that we are planning to be present at to take JOM application: also a list of sites that we have already been present.

On June 14, 16, 20, and 22, we made ourselves available for parents or students in the Cushing area for any assistance with education questions and filling out JOM Applications for the upcoming school year. Site in Cushing was at the Cushing Board of Education Building. We would like to thank the superintendent and staff for accommodating us at their building during our visit. Unfortunately, we had zero parents show up for our assistance.

On June 15, 17, 21 and 23 the Education Department was at the Shawnee Sac and Fox Multi-Purpose for any assistance with the upcoming school year with JOM Application and other educational help.

We will be at North Rock Creek School on July 19 for New Student Enrollment 10:00 am until 2:00 pm. July 20th and 21st for existing student enrollment, 10:00 am until 2:00 pm, for both days.

Chandler Public school will have enrollment Monday July 25 through Thursday 28 during the following time periods:

The Education Department Staff will be on site on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday to sign up JOM Students.

The RAP Clothing/School Supply start July 1. If you have turned in your 2021-2022 school clothing receipts in by April 1, 2022 you will be eligible for RAP School clothing/school supply. We serviced 111 families and we only received 60 families clothing receipts. Unfortunately, we will have 51 families that will not be eligible this year.

This year, each Sac and Fox Student will receive their own VISA Card that will have \$300.00 for clothing and \$100.00 dollars for school supply which will have a total of \$400.00 on the VISA card when they receive in the mail. There will be no picking up the cards in the office. All Visa Cards will be mailed out along with a letter of tax exempt. You will need to show at the cash register when checking out the letter an you will need to keep the letter with you.

You will only be able to buy clothing and school supplies with the VISA card if you try to buy something besides clothing and school supplies you will be deactivated and all transactions will be denied on the spot. Then you will have to call the Education Department to let us know and we will see from the transaction history of what was being purchased that caused the deactivation.


VISA cards will not be re-loadable once you use all funds up you will have to destroy them yourself (by cutting them up). Clothing receipts will not be required to be turned in to the Education Department for school year 2022 – 2023.

Canadian SFN Tribal Member Mary Forget Creating Art Based On Life Experiences

“I am Mary Forget, a proud member of the Sac and Fox Nation, living on the Canadian side of the Canadian/USA border in Sault Ste. Marie, ON. I have lived in and around this area off and on for most of my life, raising 4 beautiful children and now have 11 healthy grandbabies.

“The reason I’d decided to paint this picture is for a couple of reasons: The first one being that I call it, “The Joining of the Clans,” because we are of the Bear Clan and, my youngest daughter just had my grandchild 9 months ago with her boyfriend who is of the Wolf Clan from the Oji-Cree Reservation, not far from here. They came together and brought forth a little boy, joining both Clans.

“The second reason behind this painting is that I, along with my children, were in a horrific car accident in Nov. 1999. I had horrible nightmares of black wolves killing my children almost nightly but, the grey and white wolves always protected my babies.

“This made me collect, draw or paint these wolves whenever I could. I have always loved painting or drawing more realistic art and, I am currently working on a piece featuring a moose for my oldest son. I hope fellow tribal members enjoy this as much as I do and, I hope that I can share more of what I love and cherish with them as well.”

Hummingbirds are Great Pollinators

Hummingbirds seem to have the precision, speed and appeal of a U.S. Air Force fighter jet, and these quick-winged feathered friends are fun to watch in the landscape.

Typically appearing in the U.S. from April through August, hummingbirds are the smallest of all bird species. But despite their tiny stature, hummingbirds play an important role in the ecosystem, said David Hillock, Oklahoma State University Extension consumer horticulturist.

“Hummingbirds are great pollinators. Besides the popular hummingbird feeders, gardeners can attract these birds to their yard with landscaping,” Hillock said. “Landscaping and gardening to purposefully attract birds is becoming increasingly popular.

What kind of plants do hummingbirds like? Bright, colorful flowers with places to perch are attractive to these birds. Flowers with tubular red and orange blossoms are good choices. Other options include milkweeds, trumpet vine, coral bells, honeysuckle, salvia, zinnia, azalea, bee balm, hosta and flowering currant.

“Hummingbirds require a constant and diverse supply of flowers to feed on from late spring through the fall,” Hillock said. “When selecting plants, try to make selections that will bloom throughout the season.”

For those who may not have space for a garden, installing a hummingbird feeder is an easy way to attract them to the area. These feeders are different than traditional bird feeders in that they hold a sweet, sugary drink the birds can access with their slender beak. Hillock said hummingbirds don’t have an acute sense of smell, so they rely on their eyesight to find food sources.

“These birds are attracted to bright, vibrant colors and floral patterns. If you’ve shopped for a hummingbird feeder, you’ve probably noticed they’re red. Using these feeders and incorporating red flowers and garden decorations will help entice the birds to your area,” he said. “Placing the feeder near plants will encourage the birds to feed from natural sources in addition to the feeder.”

While they do like the color red, the liquid inside the feeder shouldn’t be red. In fact, red dye can be harmful to hummingbirds. Consumers can purchase commercial nectar solution, or better yet, make their own using one part granulated white sugar to four parts boiling water. Allow the nectar to cool before filling the feeders. Don’t use honey or sugar substitutes.

Hillock suggests emptying and cleaning the feeders every few days, especially in warmer weather. Wash in a solution of 1 tablespoon of white vinegar and 1 cup of water. Place the feeder close to a window to help in observing these little feathered creatures. Consider getting a bird book from the library to help young children learn more about ornithology.
