Native Languages Summit Set Oct. 4 in Oklahoma City

The U.S. Departments of the Interior, Agriculture, Education and Health and Human Services have announced that the annual Native Languages Summit will be held on Oct. 4 in Oklahoma


The Speaking Sovereignty Summit, which will be hosted this year by the Bureau of Indian Education, supports Indigenous communities seeking to protect, revitalize and reclaim Indigenous languages, many of which were erased or critically endangered through assimilationist policies, including federal Indian boarding schools.

"The cornerstone of any culture or community is its language, is how oral histories are passed down, knowledge is shared, and bonds are formed. As part of our commitment to strengthening and supporting Indigenous communities, the Biden-Harris administration is resolute in its efforts to ensuring Native languages are preserved and protected," said Secretary of the Interior Deb Haaland. "The Department is proud to help lead this inter-agency effort to encourage programs and projects to include instruction in and use of Native languages."

Last year, as part of the 2021 White House Tribal Nations Summit, the Departments launched a new inter-agency initiative to preserve, protect and promote the rights and freedom of Native Americans to use, practice, and develop Native languages – including in signing a memorandum of agreement (MOA) to further the Native American Languages Act of 1990.

Topics to be discussed at the Native Language Summit include mentoring and developing teachers, amplifying family and community engagement, and honoring Native people for their contribution to Native languages within Indigenous communities. The summit will include a space to collectively share best practices and learned experiences from Native language revitalization in Native communities.

The Summit may be attended in-person or virtually and is free to the public. Visit the Native Language Summit website for more information.



\$50 Million in Grant Funding Available to Clean-Up Orphaned Oil, Gas Well Sites

Informed by ongoing tribal consultations, the U. S. Department of the Interior on Aug. 3, 2022, released draft guidance to tribes on how to apply for the first \$50 million in grant funding available this year under President Biden's Bipartisan Infrastructure Law to clean up orphaned oil and gas well sites on Tribal lands.

The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law provides a total of \$4.7 billion to address orphaned wells across the country, including \$150 million for Tribal communities.

Several thousand orphaned oil and gas wells remain on tribal lands, jeopardizing public health and safety by contaminating groundwater, seeping toxic chemicals, emitting harmful pollutants including methane and harming wildlife. Some of these wells are underwater, which creates an especially high risk of adverse impacts.

"The Department of the Interior is committed to helping tribal communities address legacy pollution and long-standing environmental injustices. Through President Biden's Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, we are making historic investments to reclaim orphaned oil and gas wells on Tribal lands and restore habitats and ecosystems in the degraded areas," said Secretary Deb Haaland. "We have engaged in nation-to-nation consultations since the inception of this program and are eager to hear from tribal leaders as we work to finalize this guidance."

The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law makes a historic \$13 billion investment in Tribal communities—he largest investment in Tribal infrastructure ever. This includes funding to repair wastewater and sanitation systems, clean up legacy pollution, and invest in climate resilience such as funding community-driven relocation planning and adaption for Tribes impacted by rising seas, coastal erosion and storm surges.

The draft guidance provides draft instructions to Tribes on how to apply for orphaned well grants, as well as guidance on how Tribes can ensure activities funded under the program are putting people to work, protecting the environment, and safeguarding taxpayer money in a transparent and responsible manner.

Funding through the program may be utilized to plug, remediate or reclaim orphaned wells on Tribal land, restore soil and habitat in the degraded area, decommission or remove associated infrastructure, identify and characterize additional undocumented wells on Tribal land and set up well-plugging capacity where not already established. In lieu of grants and consistent with the Department's trust responsibilities, Tribes may also choose for the agency to administer and carry out plugging, remediation and reclamation activities on the Tribe's behalf.

Greetings!

The Education Department has been very busy with school year 2022-2023 We had the opportunity to set up JOM sign-up booths at the Cushing Public Schools event, 'Student Meet the Teacher Night.'

We were able to have someone at each site for parents to sign-up their children for the Sac and Fox Nation JOM Program. The event was August 9, 2022.

On August θ , 2022, we set up a JOM sign-up booth at the Shawnee High School, student and parent meet on the

teacher night. We were able to sign up additional students that night as well.

The Education Department is planning to take part in more college fairs at our surrounding areas. Justin Morris, Education Specialist, was able to go to the Citizen Potawatomi College Fair on September 7 h at the Firelake Arena. He was able to network with numerous tribal education departments and also was able to inform our Sac and Fox students of the current services that we offer.

The Title VI Director Graham Primeaux invited area tribal education de-

partments to the Shawnee Public School for an Indian Education Staff Meeting on September 7 2022. Justin Morris and I attended, along with Juaqi n Hamilton, Historical Researcher. He spoke on the history of the Sac and Fox Nation and informed that he would be available if needed in the school.

Justin Morris spoke on all the services that the Sac and Fox Nation Education provides for our students: Johnson O'Malley (JOM), DOI, Higher Education, RAP Incentives, Clothing/School Supply, Driver Education, GED, Concurrent Class fees, graduation assistance, Vo-Tech, AVT (Adult Vocational Training) Tribes that attended training for their Indian Education Department were: Sac and Fox Nation, Absentee Shawnee Tribe, Citizen Potawatomie Nation, and Kickapoo Tribe. The purpose of the training was for Indian Education staff to inform school staff of all the services that each Nation and Tribe provides for their

The RAP Clothing/School Supply program was able to fund **8** Sac and Fox Pre-K through 12th Grade Students for school year of 2022-2023 compared to 111 students for 2021-2022 school year.

This was our first attempt for the VISA Cards, and I am sorry to report that there are some parents/guardians misusing the VISA cards. These cards are only for your child/children clothing and school supplies. You cannot try to get cash off these cards. There will be some children that will not be eligible for next school year.

We have advised we can and will continue to monitor the card activity and misuse of funds will not be tolerated. Parents and guardians should be aware that failure to comply with grant requirements and/or abuse of an award for one child places future funding for all their qualified children at risk.

Please keep in mind when sending in your next year RAP Clothing/School Supply Applications you must send in your child/children Sac and Fox Enrollment Card (CDIB). We had 25 applications that were sent in this year with no tribal card attached to the application. Incomplete applications with failure to supply CDIB will not receive funding, no exceptions as previously stated.

As per most/all Sac and Fox Nation applications reqi red by Sac and Fox Education Department must have a copy of enrollment card to process ALL applications. We will no longer need a W-9 for RAP Clothing/School Supply Application

We had 2 Sac and Fox students that were not eligible due to lack of receipts being turned in by April 1, 2022, for school year 2021- 2022. With the VISA cards in place now, you will no longer have to turn in receipts. We are able to check the transactions that are being made on the VISA Cards.

October 5 7 National Indian Education Association will hold their **5** d Annual Convention and Trade Show in Oklahoma City. Justin and I will be out

of the office during that time, so that we can attend. We will have an update on this event in the next newsletter.

'Path Lit By Lightning: The Life of Jim Thorpe' by David Maraniss

(Editor's Note: Following is a review of the recently released book by New York Times bestselling author and associate editor at the Washington Post, David Maraniss. The review is written by Aram Goudsouzian for The Washington Post. Goudsouzian is the Bizot family professor of history at the University of Memphis. His books include "King of the Court: Bill Russell and the Basketball Revolution." The review is republished here with permission from the Washington Post.)


In 196, the Associated Press named Jim Thorpe "The Greatest Athlete of the Half-Century." Nearly 400 sportswriters and broadcasters ranked Thorpe above such stars as Babe Ruth, Jack Dempsey and Joe Louis.

No one else sculpted so many contours of American sports history. Thorpe had won two gold medals in track and field at the 1912 Stockholm Olympics, twice earned All-America honors as a do-everything college football star, played six seasons of major league baseball and helped establish the National Football League. He even barnstormed on the early pro basketball circuit.

Yet Thorpe's story evokes a sense of loss. As David Maraniss artfully demonstrates in the biography "Path Lit by Lightning," Thorpe was both puffed and pilloried. The press crafted his image as both a noble Indian and a simple savage. Sports administrators stripped him of his gold medals for violating the dubious tenets of amateurism, and despite his status as a transcendent athlete and Native American hero, he struggled to find consistent, lucrative work. Maraniss states that he was a victim of the harmful myth "that the Great White Father knows best." (2)

A member of the Sac and Fox Nation, Thorpe grew up in the Indian Territory of central Oklahoma and earned fame at Carlisle Indian Industrial School, a Pennsylvania institution that sought to "civilize" Native Americans through regimentation, manual labor and cultural assimilation. Like many of his classmates, Thorpe both resented and appreciated Carlisle. Like other aspects of American policy in the Progressive Era, it sought

to uplift Indians, even as it treated them with racist contempt.

Thorpe vaulted to fame as the star of Carlisle's football team, playing running back, defensive back, kicker and punter. In 1911, his sqa d raised the school's profile by beating top college programs and winning the national championship. In 1912, Thorpe led a symbolically charged victory over Army (a team that included second-year cadet Dwight Eisenhower). In the words of Maraniss, Thorpe displayed "the uncommon multiplicity of his running skillshi s change of pace, stop-and-go, swivel hip swing, straight-arm, and burning speed, all with the power of a wild horse pounding the Oklahoma prairie." (193)

Between these legendary seasons on the gridiron, Thorpe won both the decathlon and pentathlon at the Olympic Games in Stockholm, a feat so remarkable that King Gustav V of Sweden purportedly greeted him, "You, sir, are the most wonderful athlete in the world." While some press reports treated him as the Indian stereotype of a feral creature, Thorpe also was hailed as an exemplar of American achievementa— n irony, con-

sidering that the US government failed to recognize Native Americans as citizens.

When the Amateur Athletic Union stripped Thorpe of his gold medals in 1913 it ran along these historic patterns of condescension and exploitation. In his era, the lines between professional and amateur were fuzzy. Carlisle football coach Pop Warner, for instance, dispensed cash to his athletes, including Thorpe. But when the press started reporting that Thorpe had spent two summers in North Carolina playing minor league baseballa— common practice for college athletesi-t was treated like a scandal. Warner, along with Carlisle superintendent Moses Friedman, disingenuously cast Thorpe as a simple, ignorant Indian boy who turned professional without their knowledge.

Maraniss is much more sympathetic to Thorpe. Throughout a book marked by deep research and expert context-setting, he sifts through the myths about Thorpe and Native Americans, depicting his subject as a proud, complicated man who sought to shape his own destiny, yet was bedeviled by larger forces of racism and hypocrisy.

An associate editor at the Washington Post, Maraniss owns a well-deserved reputation for crafting meticulous, sweeping narrative histories of American politics and culture, including works on sports. His book on football coach Vince Lombardi, "When Pride Still Mattered," might be the best sports biography ever written.

If "Path Lit by Lightning" cannot reach that impossible standard, it is largely because Thorpe kept his thoughts and emotions to himself. His stoic personality lent him a shield from the pressures and prejudices that accompanied his uniqe celebrity, but he also played some role in his own struggles. He let his first two marriages fail. He had distant relationships with his eight children. He struggled with alcohol abuse. Maraniss pulls out the few shreds of evidence that reveal Thorpe's unfiltered personality, but it is often difficult to see the man behind the mask.

Thorpe's story reaches its dramatic climax during his glory years at Carlisle and in the Olympics, so the later chapters of his biography chronicle an ever-rambling life on sports teams of diminishing prestige, unsatisfying stints as a one-line actor or extra in Hollywood films, and short-lived gigs as a public speaker, traveling entertainer or saloon owner.

Yet by highlighting Thorpe's perseverance, Maraniss paints a portrait with both heroic and tragic shadows. He writes: "Rarely demonstrative, more introvert than showman, lonelier than he ever showed the public, he endured nonetheless as the itinerant entertainer, the athlete, the Olympian, the Indian in constant motion, moving from one city to the next across America, fueled by a combination of willpower and often desperate financial need, searching for ways to adjust and survive." (25)

At the end, Maraniss tells the tale of Thorpe's bones. They now lie under a shrine in the old coal country of the Poconos Mountains. The small memorial park is in a town called Jim Thorpe, Pennsylvania. Despite his decades of constant travel with countless sports teams, the actual, living Thorpe never set foot there.

Thorpe had asked to be buried near his Oklahoma birthplace, in the lands of his ancestors. His widow instead profited by arranging for two municipalities to merge and rename themselves after the famous athlete. In return, the town received Thorpe's remains, along with unrealized promises of economic development.

In death as in life, then, Jim Thorpe was a celebrated hero, but one commodified beyond his control and stripped of his authentic identity. "Path Lit by Lightning" describes his story with skill and integrity.

SACAND FOX NATION REVENUE ALLOCATION PLAN GUIDELINES EMERGENCY APPLIANCE PROGRAM

PROGRAMFUNCTIONS:

To provide for the safe and healthy daily living needs of eligible Sac and Fox Nation tribal members with emergency appliance replacement. Emergency Appliance Assistance is established for EMERGENCY purposes ONLY. The program is open to all tribal members 18 or older on a first come basis; regardless of their location of residency.

GUIDELINES:

- 1. Applicant must be an enrolled member of the Sac and Fox Nation, residing anywhere.
- 2. Applicant must express a need for services based on an emergency situation. An EMERGENCY is any situation beyond the applicants control causing a hardship on the applicant and family.
- 3 Emergency Appliance Assistance is to replace unusable and unsafe appliances only. It does not cover duplicate or outdated appliances.
- 4. Funding for this program is limited and each application will be processed in the order in which it was received. This program will fund as many tribal member's requests as funding will permit.
- 5 Applicant may receive up to for an appliance that includes (refrigerator, stove, washer, dryer, hot water heater or air conditioner) every 2 years per household.
- 6 Applicants should submit three (3) qot es for the appliance they are requesting however the final selection of appliance and vendor will be at the discretion of the RAP Department.

The statement below is from Judith LeBlanc (Caddo), who serves as executive director of Native Organizers Alli-

"Nobody knows our nation's lands, waters, and resources better than the Tribal Nations and Indigenous peoples who have lived here since time began. Our people have always fished these waters, harvested our medicines and foods, and cared for our ancestral lands. The traditional knowledge our people have about our ecosystems is invaluable.

"Tribes should be eqa 1 partners in the management of these sacred places. We are grateful that Rep. Grijalva and his colleagues in Congress recognize the

U. S. Representative Raul Grijalva need for the U.S. to further examine the way our federal agencies engage Tribes and Native peoples in the management of our sacred sites and resources.

"The climate crisis, development, and fossil fuel extraction has created a dire situation that has put our most sacred sites at risk. The time couldn't be better to expand Tribal co-management of public lands, waters, and natural resources to ensure they are healthy and thriving for future generations."
