The Journal and Topics feature article by Tom Robb quotes the following as part of the Niles proclamation:

"Whereas, the Sauk Tribe, now present-day Sac & Fox Nation, has a strong history in Illinois including the Village of Niles; and,

"Whereas Black Hawk of the Sauk Tribe was famed for his reputation as a war leader, protector of his people, and his campaign to resist the takeover of his people's homelands, and

"Whereas for centuries, Native Americans were forcibly removed from ancestral lands, and banned from worshiping or performing sacred ceremonies, yet they remain some of our greatest environmental stewards and maintain strong religious beliefs that still feed the soul of our Nation; and,

"Whereas Native American veterans and service members who have courageously served and continue to serve in our Armed Forces - including the brave Native American Code Talkers in World War I and World War II and to this day, have chosen to serve in the United States Armed Forces at a higher rate than any other

Tom Robb's Journal and Topics feature notes the Sac and Fox Nation includes descendants of war leader Black Hawk, for whom the Chicago Blackhawks are named. Black Hawk led a

force opposing U.S. expansion in the early 1800s, battling on both sides of the Mississippi

The article also states: "The Chicago Blackhawks' relationship with the Sac and Fox Nation runs in contrast to sports franchises such as the Washington Commanders and Cleveland Guardians, both who changed their previous team names because of what was seen as a negative portrayal of American Indians."

Sac and Fox Nation Wins \$35.8 Million to Build Fiber Network

Sac and Fox Nation, along with Centranet LLC, was recently awarded a \$35.8 million grant for the deployment of a full fiber optic network, including fiber to the home, within the tribal lands.

The grant, which was awarded by the National Telecommunications and Information Administration under the Tribal Broadband Connectivity Program, will make gigabit Internet available within the tribal lands of Sac and Fox Nation.

"Tribal lands are some of the least connected territories in the U.S.," said Angela Gasper, Acting Principal Chief, Sac and Fox Nation. "Not having access to broadband creates economic hardships and keeps us from entering the digital economy. The deployment of this new fiber optic network with Centranet LLC and the availability of highspeed broadband will make Sac and Fox Nation a gig-nation and take us into the next era of information technology."

The fiber network will be interconnected with Centranet's full fiber network. Centranet, an established Internet Service Providers, provides high-speed internet to parts of seven counties in north-central Oklahoma.

"Concern for community a key guiding principle for Centranet," said Mark Prather, President of Fiber and Technology, Centranet. "This award will help us realize our mission to provide gigabit broadband to an even broader community."

Nearly 300 applications requesting more than \$5 billion were received for the program. So far, 94 grants have been awarded; Sac and Fox Nation and Centranet being one.

"Every home, school and business in Oklahoma should have access to affordable, reliable high-speed internet," said Kirk Martin, Interim Executive Director, Oklahoma State Broadband Office. "The mission of the State Broadband Office is to connect 95% of the state in the next five years. Partnerships like this accelerate our programs to reach that goal faster."

Aspirin Can Have Life-Saving Use For TTP Attacks

The solution to a rare but debilitating and often fatal blood disease may be as close as your medicine cabinet, Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation scientists have discovered.

Researchers in the lab of OMRF scientist Lijun Xia, M.D., Ph.D., found that low-dosage aspirin could prevent acute attacks of thrombotic thrombocytopenic purpura, or TTP, in mouse models. The findings were published in the journal Blood.

TTP is thought to affect between 1 and 4 per 100,000 people. In it, blood clots form in small blood vessels throughout the body. These clots can block blood flow, often resulting in organ damage or stroke. In most patients, the disease is an autoimmune disorder in which the body destroys an enzyme that controls blood clotting. Without it, the body makes too many blood clots, said Xia, who leads OMRF's Cardiovascular Biology Research Program.

"People with this disorder live in fear of the next attack," said OMRF Vice President of Research Rod McEver, M.D., a hematologist and physician-scientist. "This research gives those patients the possibility of living their lives free from that specter." Doctors have lacked viable options for preventing TTP attacks. As a result, the condition can prove fatal.

OMRF scientist Bojing Shao, Ph.D., who initiated the study, said although aspirin has long been known to prevent blood clots that cause a stroke, researchers believed this solution wasn't applicable to TTP. Shao's previous research regarding blood platelet adhesion prompted him to test that belief in mouse models of the disease.

"Often, our research can take decades to go through the process of multiple clinical trials before it is approved for use by patients," he said. "What is particularly rewarding about this finding is the prospect of immediate applicability."

Among those contributing to the research was James George, M.D., a University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center physician-scientist and TTP expert. "Dr. Shao's observations suggest that daily use of low-dose aspirin may prevent these critical episodes, similarly to how it can prevent a heart attack or stroke," George said. "This could be an amazing benefit for patients with TTP."

Because the study was done in mice, George and Xia noted that people with TTP should consult their physician before altering their current treatment plan.

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\$12 Million Awarded to 14 Tribes to Assist With Opioid Recovery

The story of Choctaw citizen Clayton Clark's opioid addiction begins with a compressed disc, and pirouettes into a tale of devastation and loss. After sustaining a back injury from moving furniture, Clark was on bed rest for a month. He relied on painkillers he was prescribed to get him through the day. But once the prescription bottle ran dry, so did the life he knew.

"A day goes by and you're going through withdrawals, you're trying to find more so you don't get sick," Clark says of his experience. At the peak of his addiction, Clark was taking thirty 10-mg hydrocodone pills a day risking complete liver failure just to keep up with the tolerance his body had developed over time.

After five years of active addiction, Clayton applied for a spot at a local inpatient rehabilitation center. In the four months it took for a bed to become available, he lost custody of his kids, contact with his family and the roof over his head. He was living in a homeless shelter when he got the call that would ultimately save his life and give his children their father back.

"If it wasn't for the recovery center, I would be dead today," the 34-year-old Clark says of his time at Choctaw Nation Recovery Center in Talihina, Oklahoma.

About \$12 million has been awarded to 14 tribes across Oklahoma to keep those resources Clark needed flowing. Three of the state's largest tribes, the Choctaw, Cherokee, and Chickasaw nations, will each receive \$1.9 million. The money is part of the \$1.5 billion the U.S Department of Health and Human Services, through the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration,

recently awarded to support states, tribes, and territories' efforts to address the opioid crisis.

Clark, who says the triumph of his story is equal parts white- knuckled determination, and the power of accessible resources, just celebrated his 36th month clean. He now works as an addiction support specialist at a crisis center similar to the one that helped him. "Addiction and mental health have a way of making you feel like nobody can understand what you're going through. If it wasn't for the support of the tribe and their help getting me through the recovery process with these programs, I would still think I was alone in the world," Clark said.

The opioid crisis has crept its way into the homes in every corner of the U.S., but the rate at which tribal communities are battling the epidemic is unparalleled. American Indians and Alaska Natives had the second-highest rate of opioid overdose out of all U.S. racial and ethnic groups in both 2017 and 2020, the most recent year for which statistics are available. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reported the overdose death rates for those groups increased 39 percent compared with 2019.

"As the opioid epidemic has disproportionately affected Native Americans, the additional support and healing for tribal members facing addiction is critical to the Choctaw Nation," said Jessie Roberts, assistant director of behavioral health at the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma. "We have used this Tribal Opioid Recovery Grant to reconnect our people with the cultural and traditional aspects of healing and recovery," Roberts said.

Roberts says services the grant will allow the tribe to offer include prevention and education programs, sober living/

transitional housing assistance, judicial services including assessments and individual therapy, as well as Peer Recovery Support Specialists for both individual and group meetings, incorporating drum circles which infuse culture into the recovery process.

According to the National Indian Health Board, tribes were not included in the 2017 State Targeted Response to the Opioid Epidemic grants, despite being the second-most-affected group in the nation at the time. Cherokee Nation reported 18 deaths, 79 non-fatal drug overdoses and 576 treatment admissions within the tribe's reservation boundaries during 2020 alone. Statewide about 6,000 people have died since 2000, according to state officials.

In the fall of 2021, Cherokee Nation led the way for what would turn out to be a series of historical lawsuits against America's largest pharmaceutical distributors for their role in the opioid crisis and its effect on tribal communities across the country. The tribe reached the first settlement for \$75 million, and a collective of more than 400 tribes followed suit, reaching a settlement of \$590 million early this year. The tribe plans to use its settlement money to build drug treatment facilities and other opioid remediation, addiction prevention and treatment programs.

"Cherokee Nation, like much of the state of Oklahoma, continues to see a higher rate of overdoses of fentanyl and methamphetamines," said Chuck Hoskin Jr, the tribe's principal chief. "These dollars will be essential to helping our tribal citizens with treatment, especially through medicated assisted treatment and more recovery support opportunities," he said.

Bryan Warner, the Cherokee's deputy chief, said the funding will allow the tribe to expand treatment recovery support and harm-reduction services into more counties within the Cherokee Nation Reservation, including Salina and Nowata.

"These funds will continue to help our Cherokee citizens who need treatment and support by offering more tools to help, training more providers on trauma-informed continuum care for tribal citizens with substance use disorders and better educating the community on destigmatizing substance misuse in order to create a recovery-oriented system of care," said Juli Skinner, senior director of Cherokee Nation Behavioral Health.

Tribal recipients in Oklahoma of the funding include: Chickasaw Nation, \$1.9 million; Quapaw Tribe, \$172,000; Wyandotte Nation, \$250,000; Choctaw Nation, \$1.9 million; Southern Plains Tribal Health Board Foundation, \$825,000; Comanche Nation, \$949,000; Cherokee Nation, \$1.9 million; Muscogee Creek Nation, \$823,000; Wichita and Affiliated Tribes, \$825,00; Modoc Tribe of Oklahoma, \$500,000; Citizen Potawatomi Nation, \$825,000; Iowa Tribe of Oklahoma, \$250,000; Absentee Shawnee Tribe of Oklahoma, \$475,000; Keetoowah Economic Development Authority, \$500,000; Ponca Tribe of Oklahoma, \$250,000; Kiowa Tribe of Oklahoma, \$465,000

In addition, \$16 million was awarded to Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse.



Water is Life

Ho, All my relations! I hope that this finds all of you well! I would like to take this time to introduce myself, although, many of you know who I am and my family. My name is Zachary L. Butler. I started with the Sac and Fox Nation Office of Environmental Services on September 13th, 2022. I work with all the programs within the Environmental office. The main focus of my efforts is with water quality and the reduction of solid waste. In this article I am going to talk about water and water quality.



First of all, we as individuals need to do our part to protect the waters of this world. We need to do whatever it will take to keep the source water clean so we have clean water to use. So what is meant by source water. Source water is any water that can be used for public water supplies or even water that is providing water to private water wells. Examples of these waters can include rivers, streams, springs, lakes, ponds, reservoirs, and ground water.

If we can protect this source water this would help to reduce the risk of us as humans coming into contact with water that has been contaminated. By protecting water sources from contamination helps to reduce the financial burden and could reduce the need for extensive and complex treatment for human consumption. Water has to meet certain requirements if it is designated a public water system by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The water is also subject to meet the requirements of Federal regulations by the Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA) and Ground Water Rule.

There are many benefits to having clean and safe water and that is clean water for us, animals and wildlife. Also, clean water for recreational purposes. This just aids in the availability and clean quality for all to use. Protecting the water sources can and does include many types of activities that can be implemented and maintained to help with improving, maintaining and keeping safe of the water. These actions are what have to be conducted to keep the quality and quantity of safe drinking water. The different types of activities can vary on what type of water source that is trying to be protected. Some examples of source water protection are:

- Riparian zone restoration to reduce runoff pollution;
- Stream bank stabilization to reduce sedimentation;
- Land protection/easements;
- Best management practices for agricultural and forestry activities or storm water control;
- Local ordinances to limit certain activities in source water or wellhead protection areas;
- Developing emergency response plans; and
- Educating local industry, businesses, and citizens on pollution prevention and source

So as you can see how important it can be for us to realize that some of our actions could affect the water we drink and sustains life. This simple idea of clean water is one that we might take for granted but we must realize the importance and do what we can to protect our waters so they will be clean and safe for all the generations to come



Each candidate may designate in writing one person, not a candidate, to watch the activities at the polls. Such designation shall be presented to Election Board Officials prior to the election. Any poll watcher interfering with the election or attempting to electioneer, in any way, shall be rejected from the poll area by a Sergeant of Arms or law enforcement officer

The said copies are to be returned to the Tribal Secretary.

One copy of the voting list shall be maintained in the Tribal Office and be open to public inspection during Regular business hours no later than sixty (60) days prior to the election.

Each candidate may select a watcher of their choice, not a candidate, to observe and keep a separate record of the tally of the ballots, and who shall not interfere with the tally process. After the tally is complete, all ballots, absentee ballots, voter registers, and ballot boxes shall be transported to the Sac and Fox Nation Tribal Court House.

A candidate or qualified voter contesting a Tribal Election shall, within ten (10) days after completion of the tally of the election and declaration of the results, shall deposit a two hundred dollar (\$200.00) non-refundable cashier's check contest filing fee with the Tribal Treasurer, file with the Election Board a statement in writing setting forth their particular grounds for the contest. The statement shall be verified by affidavit of the contestor (s) that they believe the matters and things therein contained are true. After the statement is filed the Election Board shall set a time for a hearing of the contest, no later than ten (10) days after the date on which the statement of contest was filed. Written notice of such hearing shall be mailed or delivered to each candidate for the office contested. Any party to the election protest and the Election Board shall have the right to view the election ballots and records in the presence of the Court Clerk in the clerk's office. Any party to the protest or a Tribal member shall be entitled to receive a photocopy of said documents certified as true and correct copies by the Court Clerk upon payment to said clerk of the normal and customary charges.

Said certified copies shall be received as evidence by the Election Board in like manner as an original. Alternatively the Election Board, upon request of a party or on its own motion, may convene a hearing for any protested election at the Tribal Courthouse for the purpose of review of said election materials. After hearing the proofs and allegations of the contestants, the Election Board shall make their findings and shall have authority to pronounce their judgment either setting aside, or confirming the election.

Southern Plains Exhibit at Okla. History Center

'In Citizen's Garb: Native Americans on the Southern Plains, 1889–1891,' an exhibit featuring a selection of modern gelatin silver prints made from glass plate negatives from the photography studio of Lenny and Sawyers, is on display in the Sam Noble Gallery located on the third floor of the Oklahoma History Center in Oklahoma City.

The Lenny and Sawyers Studio was in operation for a short period of time from 1889 to 1891. Many of the photographs taken by William Lenny and William Sawyers in that period depicted Indigenous people in the Lawton and Fort Sill area. The tribal nations represented in the collection include the Comanche, Kiowa, Apache, Wichita, Delaware, and Caddo.

The Oklahoma Historical Society Research Center was recently gifted the original glass plate negatives from the photography studio of Lenny and Sawyers, and the traveling exhibit entitled In Citizen's Garb: Native Americans on the Southern Plains, 1889–1891, which consists of modern gelatin silver prints made from the negatives.

The donors of the collection are Joe and Frances Swalwell. The original exhibition was organized by the Museum of the Great Plains in Lawton, Oklahoma, and was previously toured by Exhibits




