The ceremony was held in Oklahoma City at the First Americans Museum on November 12. AARP Oklahoma State Director Sean Voskuhl welcomed the 350 attendees. He said the Native American Elder Honors was established to memorialize the work and contributions of elders who inspire future generations.

"Whether they are well known or exhibit quiet devotion to family and community, all our honorees represent the love of family, dedication to culture and respect for all. And today, more than ever, I think we can all agree, we could all use a little more of that," Voskuhl said.

Bishop David Wilson presented the 2022 AARP Oklahoma Native American Elder Honor medallions to 39 individuals from 20 tribal nations. On hand to congratulate the honorees were AARP State President Jim Randall, AARP Oklahoma Associate State Director Mashell Sourjohn, former AARP Oklahoma Executive Council Member Tewanna Edwards and Jr. Miss Indian Oklahoma City Aubrey Elaine Berry.

The 14th annual AARP Oklahoma Native American Elder Honor recipients included teachers, veterans, artists, tribal leaders, culture preservationists and everyday heroes.

"These honored elders embody AARP's mission and, through example, motivate others to follow suit and selflessly serve their communities," Voskuhl said. "Individually, their accomplishments are remarkable. In totality, their impact is breathtaking throughout Indian Country and our nation."

Following are profiles included in the awards program for the Sac and Fox honorees:

• Elvis E. Ellis joined the National Guard in high school and immediately began active duty when the 45th Division was mobilized. He was stationed worldwide for 25 years while serving in the U. S. Army and Air Force. Following his retirement, Mr. Ellis worked for 21 years at Tinker Air Force Base.

Mr. Ellis followed in his father's footsteps as chief of the Fish Clan, He also served as chairman and secretary of the Sac and Fox Elders Advisory Committee.

Mr. Ellis currently serves as the Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act Committee chairman.

• Zack Morris is a member of the Sac and Fox Nation. Mr. Morris shares his wisdom as an educator, teaching information on Native American ways and Native American people. He also shares his spiritual expressions through tribal rituals, such as sweat lodges for individuals in need of healing and relief.

Mr. Morris has acted in seven movies and four Native-themed plays. He is a Southern Straight

Dancer and has traveled to 16 foreign countries with Native dance troupes.

• Nancy Nullake is one of the few remaining full-blooded Sac and Fox members. Ms. Nullake is known as a motivator and supporter of younger generations. She is an active member of the Sac and Fox tribal elder activities.

Ms. Nullake received her education from the University of Central Oklahoma. She spent her career with the KM Corporation, from which she retired. She was also employed with the Sac and Fox Nation for 20 years. Ms. Nullake prides herself on her family, and enjoys traveling. She is a faithful fan of the Thunder basketball team.

• Curtis (Dagwood) Wakolee is a full-blooded member of the Sac and Fox Nation. Mr. Wakolee made his home in California. He worked in business management and ultimately retired from Exxon Corporation. His pastime after retiring was traveling, and his vacations took him to Hawaii, the Virgin Islands and a European cruise.

Mr. Wakolee's travels also brought him back home to Shawnee, where he spends time with his grandchildren and family. Mr. Wakolee serves as an officer with the Sac and Fox Color Guard, a tribute to his time in the U. S. Army where he served as a medic. He is also an active member of the tribal elders, and enjoys participating in Sac and Fox Nation programs and events.

BIA Proposes New Regulations for Trust, Gaming Compact Processes

The Department of the Interior's Office of the Assistant Secretary for Indian Affairs on Dec. 5 announced the publication of proposed revisions to two regulations, one regarding the fee-to-trust process and one regarding Class III gaming compacts. The updated regulations will provide clearer and more efficient processes for Tribes that are applying to place land into trust or enter into gaming compacts.

"The Biden-Harris administration promised to make it easier for Tribes to place land into trust, and that's what we're doing. Taking land into trust on behalf of Tribes is critical for Tribal sovereignty, self-determination, preservation of history and culture, economic development, well-being of Tribal citizens, and to help right the wrongs of past policy," said Assistant Secretary Bryan Newland.

"The federal government has a treaty and trust responsibility to protect tribal sovereignty and revitalize Tribal communities by strengthening their homelands and economic self-sufficiency through a timely and efficient process for taking land into trust and providing clarity on Class III gaming compact negotiations. We look forward to additional feedback from Tribes as we finalize these amendments."

The proposed rules reflect input and recommendations provided by Tribes during consultations held earlier this year. The Department will conduct further Tribal consultation before the regulations are finalized.

Fee-to-trust land acquisitions, also called "land-into-trust," transfer a land title to the federal government to be held in trust for the benefit of an individual or Tribe. Acquisition of land in trust is essential to Tribal self-determination and will help maximize the Tribe's eligibility for federal services and programs.

Federal policies dating back more than a century have eroded the land base of Indian Tribes across the United States. By placing lands into trust status through the Department, Tribes can reacquire lands within or near their reservations, establish a land base for Tribal communities and clarify jurisdiction over their lands. Tribes have faced delays and increasing costs in efforts to develop housing projects, manage law enforcement agencies, and develop local economies as a result of unnecessary hurdles in the land-intotrust process.

The changes being con-

sidered to 25 C.F.R. Part 151 would lead to a more efficient, less cumbersome, and less expensive fee-to-trust process by clarifying the Secretary of the Interior's authority to take land in trust for Tribes, reducing processing time, and establishing clear decision-making criteria. The proposed amendments also place an express focus on taking land into trust for conservation purposes.

The proposed changes would build on action taken by Secretary Deb Haaland in her first month in office to improve land in trust process. In April 2021, Secretary Haaland issued Secretary's Order 3400, which re-delegates the authority to review and approve applications to place land into trust to the Bureau of Indian Affairs regional directors.

Large Aviation Mural Underway at Okla. History Center

Work on a new large-scale mural by Oklahoma City native Manuel Cruz III is underway inside the Oklahoma History Center (OHC). It will be part of the new aviation exhibit at the OHC called "Taking Flight: Oklahomans Explore the Skies." Work on the new area has been in the planning stages for several years.

The addition is designed to provide a visual bookend to the "Launch to Landing: Oklahomans and Space" exhibit on the first floor. It is devoted to the many Oklahomans who were, and are, pioneers of flight.

The large-scale mural will be on the wall leading into the aviation exhibit. It will showcase an early 1900s-period hot air balloon. At 14 feet wide and 28 feet tall, the concept of the mural is to represent the dawn of the exploration of the skies at the turn of the 20th century. The hot air balloon design will have a ground-floor walk-in component that allows visitors to take selfies that give the illusion of riding in the balloon.

Visitors to the OHC are invited to watch Cruz create the stunning work of art. The Oklahoma History Center is located at 800 Nazih Zuhdi Dr. in Oklahoma City. It is open to the public Monday through Saturday from 10 a.m.–5 p.m.

BIA and FBI Sign Agreement to Improve Law Enforcement in Indian Country

On Dec. 1, the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) announced an agreement that updates guidelines to provide for the effective and efficient administration of criminal investigations in Indian Country. This is the first update since the early 1990s to a memorandum of understanding between the bureaus.

The agreement was highlighted by Attorney General Merrick B. Garland during remarks at the 2022 White House Tribal Nations Summit and was discussed during a panel featuring Secretary of the Interior Deb Haaland and Associate Attorney General Vanita Gupta. The Summit provides an opportunity for Administration and Tribal leaders from the 574 federally recognized Tribes to discuss ways the federal government can invest in and strengthen nation-to-nation relationships as well as ensure that progress in Indian Country endures for years to come.

"Interagency coordination is absolutely critical given the complexities of jurisdiction in Tribal communities. This agreement supports an all-of-government approach to addressing federal responsibilities and Tribal needs in Indian Country," said Assistant Secretary for Indian Affairs Bryan Newland. "All federal agencies share a treaty and trust responsibility to protect Tribal sovereignty and revitalize Tribal communities. This partnership will further support our efforts to keep Native people safe in their homes and communities."

"This agreement is a crucial step to advancing public safety for American Indian and Alaska Native communities," said Associate Attorney General Vanita Gupta. "The Department of Justice is committed to working with the Department of the Interior to investigate Indian Country crimes, including reports of missing or murdered Indigenous people, quickly, effectively, and respectfully. We are grateful to the Tribes that provided input into this new policy."

"The FBI is committed to ongoing and continued collaboration with the Bureau of Indian Affairs," said FBI Director Christopher Wray. "The FBI has a crucial role in successfully addressing matters in the nation's Indian Country communities and this updated MOU affirms our dedication to the mission of protecting all Americans. The FBI will not waver in its support of our Tribal law enforcement agency partners and our coordination with the Bureau of Indian Affairs."

Under the agreement, the BIA Office of Justice Services and the FBI will cooperate on investigations and share information and investigative reports. The agencies will also establish written guidelines outlining jurisdiction and investigative roles and responsibilities for investigators from the BIA, FBI and Tribal law enforcement agencies. The agreement also requires that all BIA, FBI and Tribal law enforcement officers receive training regarding trauma-informed, culturally responsive investigative approaches.

This agreement supports the unified response to the Missing and Murdered

'Sovereignty Symposium' Transferred to OCU

The Oklahoma Supreme Court has announced the transfer of 'The Sovereignty Symposium' to Oklahoma City University

The Sovereignty Symposium was established by the Oklahoma Supreme Court to provide a forum in which ideas concerning common legal issues among federal and state officials and the state's Native American tribes can be exchanged in a scholarly, non-adversarial environment. The Oklahoma Supreme Court espoused no view on any of the issues, and the positions taken by symposium participants were not endorsed by the Supreme Court.

The next symposium will take place June 13-14, 2023, at the Skirvin Hilton Hotel in downtown Oklahoma City. Titled "Treaties," the keynote speaker will be Baroness Emma Nicholson of Winterbourne, a Life Peer and a member of the House of Lords in the United Kingdom. More details will be released later on the event website at thesovereigntysymposium.com.

The Oklahoma City University School of Law has a long history of teaching and working in Oklahoma Indian Country. OCU Law houses the American Indian Law and Sovereignty Center, as well as its American Indian Wills Clinic.

Oklahoma Supreme Court Chief Justice Richard Darby said that "the transfer enables OCU to expand the event in a more robust way and offer even more educational opportunities to students and the legal community."

Indigenous Peoples crisis, and the Missing and Murdered Unit launched by Secretary Haaland. It defines responsibilities for FBI, BIA and Tribal investigators to ensure that missing person cases are entered into the National Crime Information Center, National Incident-Based Reporting System, and other appropriate federal criminal databases and that DNA is submitted to the National Missing Person DNA Database when appropriate and available.

The agreement also specifies that the FBI will take an initial primary role in the investigation of any BIA or Tribal law enforcement officer-involved shootings and in-custody death incidents. The BIA will concurrently conduct separate internal administrative investigations of any BIA or Tribal law enforcement officer-involved shootings and in-custody death incidents.

The action reversed steps taken in 2017 that unnecessarily elevated land-into-trust decisions to the Department's headquarters staff, increasing the complexity of the decision-making process and causing delays. The proposed amendments were also developed in response to nation-to-nation consultations on Tribal homelands restoration held in October 2021 and consultations held in May 2022 on draft revisions to Part 151.

The Indian gaming industry remains one of the most significant sources of Tribal economic development in Indian Country. The changes proposed to 25 C.F.R. Part 293, which governs the review and approval of tribal-state gaming compacts, would provide clarity on the criteria the Department would consider when deciding whether to approve these compacts by clarifying boundaries as to allowable topics of negotiation, better

defining key terms, and clearly outlining when the Department must review a gaming compact.

The proposed regulations were announced during the 2022 White House Tribal Nations Summit last week, which provided an opportunity for Administration and Tribal leaders from the 574 federally recognized Tribes to discuss ways the federal government can invest in and strengthen nation-to-nation relationships as well as ensure that progress in Indian Country endures for years to come.





A Message From Sac and Fox Nation Office of Environmental Services: What is Mold?

From Sac and Fox Nation Office of Environmental Services

There are hundreds of thousands of different types of mold. They are living organisms (fungi) that grow naturally, particularly in warn, damp, humid conditions where there is little air movement. Some my often refer to mold as mildew. Both are terms used to describe fungal growth.

Mildew is typically powdery and light in color, mold is often fuzzy and can range from different colors (black, green, yellow, orange, brown, etc.) We can only see or smell mold when there is a large quantity. Mold can grow almost anywhere: on walls, ceilings, carpets, or furniture. Humidity or wetness, caused by water leaks, spills from bathtubs or showers, or condensation (like steam from showering and cooking), can cause mold to grow in your home.

Mold needs air, moisture, food and the right temperature to live and grow. But, if there is no moisture present, then mold cannot grow. So, the key to mold control is moisture control.

People are exposed to molds every day and everywhere, at home, at work, at school, both indoors and out. Mold produces spores tiny particles that float through the air. Spores can sometimes cause health problems. Mold does not affect everyone, and different people are affected in different ways when mold is consumed or inhaled. People who are allergic to mold may get watery eyes, runny or stuffy noses, itching, headaches, and may have difficulty breathing. Mold can also trigger asthma attacks.

Stachybotrys chartarum and other molds are referred to as black or toxic molds that produce toxins may be dangerous if people are exposed to large amounts of these molds.

Mold Prevention

In order to keep or prevent mold from growing or coming back, there are some steps to follow: Keep your house clean and dry. Fix water problems such as roof leaks, wet basements and leaking pipes or faucets. Make sure your house is well ventilated and always use ventilation fans in bathrooms and kitchens.


If possible, keep humidity in your house below 50 percent by using an air conditioner or dehumidifier. Avoid carpeting in kitchens, bathrooms and basements. If there are floor mats in these areas, clean and dry as quickly as possible. Fix and dry and moisture issues immediately and clean or remove wet materials, furnishings, or mold. Clean up spills or floods that may have occurred in the home within one day. Dry all surfaces and fix the problem or leak to prevent further damage.

Replace water damaged components, such as drywall and insulation with new materials. Clean mold off non-porous surfaces with a weak solution of bleach and water (no more than 1 cup bleach to 1 gallon water) or a mix of soap and water. Throw away moldy materials that cannot be cleaned, such as carpet, upholstered furniture and drywall. When cleaning mold, protect yourself by wearing long sleeves, pants, shoes, show covers, and rubber gloves, as well as goggles and a face mask (N95 paper mask/respirator).

If damaged area(s) are too large and you are allergic to mold, consider hiring a professional to clean and fix the cause of the problem.

New Partnerships to Leverage New Resources for Indian Country

House Tribal Nations Summit on Nov. 30, Secretary of the Interior Deb Haaland announced a series of actions to support Tribally led conservation, education and economic development through a new Office of Strategic Partnerships.

The Department also announced a new joint project between the Bureau of Indian Education (BIE) and Trust for Public Lands to create culturally informed outdoor educational spaces, the renewal of "The National Fund for Excellence in American Indian Education." and new partnerships with community organizations to catalyze economic opportunities across Indian Country.

"At the Department of the Interior we have a solemn duty to honor and strengthen the federal government's nation-to-nation relationships with Tribes. Today's announcements reaffirms that commitment and will bring increased and much needed resources to Indigenous communities," said Secretary Haaland.

The new Office of Strategic Partnerships will assist with building partnerships, leveraging resources, and promoting innovative solutions for Indian Country. It will work to bring awareness of the needs and unique status of Tribal communities as federal-philanthropic initiatives and programs are developed. Housed within the Office of the Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs and with support from a partnership with Native Americans in Philanthropy, the office will work in close coordination with the White House Council on Native American Affairs and other federal partners to help Tribes and Tribal organizations develop and build long-term sustainable bonds with philanthropy, non-profit organizations and the business community to further conservation, education and economic development initiatives in Indian Country.

Through the office, the Department will help manage a diverse set of collaborative efforts with philanthropic and non-profit organizations, including a new partnership between BIE and the Trust for Public Land's Community Schoolyards Project to create culturally informed outdoor educational spaces. Working closely with Tribal communi-

In opening remarks at the 2022 White ties, the Trust for Public Land has helped design multi-purposed outdoor spaces that infuse physical activity, education, Native languages and cultural heritage. In 2023, this innovative partnership will help fund nine new schoolyards in Tribal communities:

> • Coeur d'Alene Tribal School, De Smet, ID; • Crazy Horse School, Wanblee, SD; • John F. Kennedy Day School, White River, AZ; • Menominee Tribal School, Neopit, WI: • Northern Chevenne Tribal School, Busby, MT; • Pine Ridge School, Pine Ridge, SD; • Rock Creek Grant School, Bullhead, SD: • Santa Fe Indian School, Santa Fe, NM; and, Wingate Elementary School, Ft. Wingate, NM.

> In support of these new strategic initiatives, Secretary Haaland is renewing "The National Fund for Excellence in American Indian Education." Founded in 1999, the congressionally chartered but long unused—nonprofit organization has a mission to promote educational opportunities for American Indian students attending BIE schools. Through the National Fund, the Department will support Tribally-led educational initiatives, including its work on Native language revitalization.

> The Department also announced the signing of new MOUs between the Office of the Assistant Secretary - Indian

A petition of ten (10) or more members of Council may submit a written notice with required filing fees of twohundred (\$200.00) non-refundable (cashier's check only), no later than sixty-five (65) calendar days prior to the date of the Primary Election and/or General Election stating the name of the candidate, age, birth date, and proof of actual residence and domicile.

Section 406. Withdrawals

Any candidate for office may withdraw by filing a written notice of withdrawal with the Election Board at any time within ten (10) days after the closing date of filing for office. Such notice shall contain the candidates name, the office filed for, a statement of withdrawal and shall be notarized or sworn to before a person authorized to administer oaths. (Required filing fee non-refundable)

Each petition shall state with particularity the reasons the candidate is not eligible to file for office. There is a one-hundred dollars (\$100.00) non-refundable cashier's check contest fee.

Section 706. The Tally

The Election Board shall unlock the ballot box(es), shall remove the ballots one by one, and as each one is removed, the clerks shall read off the names of the candidates marked thereupon. At least two election officials shall view each ballot, and each counter shall keep a separate tally of the votes cast. Each candidate may select a watcher of their choice, not a candidate, to observe and keep a separate record of the tally of the ballots, and who shall not interfere with the tally process. After the tally is complete, all ballots, absentee ballots, voter registers, and ballot boxes shall be transported to the Sac and Fox Nation Tribal Court House.

Section 710. Certification of Election

The election shall be certified by the Election Board immediately after the ten (10) day period for filing an election contest expires, provided, that if an election contest petition is filed within the time period allowed, then no Certificate of Election shall be issued until after such election contest is finally decided.

Section 802. Contest Petition

A candidate or qualified voter contesting a Tribal Election shall, within ten (10) days after completion of the tally of the election and declaration of the results, shall deposit a two hundred dollar (\$200.00) non-refundable cashier's check contest filing fee with the Tribal Treasurer, file with the Election Board a statement in writing setting forth their particular grounds for the contest. The statement shall be verified by affidavit of the contestor (s) that they believe the matters and things therein contained are true. After the statement is filed the Election Board shall set a time for a hearing of the contest, no later than ten (10) days after the date on which the statement of contest was filed. Written notice of such hearing shall be mailed or delivered to each candidate for the office contested. Any party to the election protest and the Election Board shall have the right to view the election ballots and records in the presence of the Court Clerk in the clerk's office. Any party to the protest or a Tribal member shall be entitled to receive a photocopy of said documents certified as true and correct copies by the Court Clerk upon payment to said clerk of the normal and customary charges.

Said certified copies shall be received as evidence by the Election Board in like manner as an original. Alternatively the Election Board, upon request of a party or on its own motion, may convene a hearing for any protested election at the Tribal Courthouse for the purpose of review of said election materials. After hearing the proofs and allegations of the contestants, the Election Board shall make their findings and shall have authority to pronounce their judgment either setting aside, or confirming the election.

Such request must be accompanied by a nonrefundable cashier's check of two-hundred dollars (\$200.00) made payable to the Sac and Fox Nation. Said check

shall be forwarded to the Tribal Secretary-Treasurer to be credited against the cost of the recount. The Election Board shall meet and decide within ten (10) days of receipt of the notice whether or not the reasons listed in the request are sufficient to cause a recount of ballots.
