Sac and Fox Nation Awarded Special Diabetes Program Grant

The Sac and Fox Nation has been awarded the federal Special Diabetes Program for Indians (SDPI) grant for the 26th consecutive year. The SDPI program is considered one of the most successful public health programs ever implemented.

"Not only does SDPI improve and save lives, it also saves millions of taxpayer dollars," said Merle Boyd Center Special Projects Director Leah Carver. Federal reports indicate that SDPI is responsible for saving Medicare millions of dollars per vear.

The SDPI program, which funds hundreds of diabetes prevention and treatment programs around the country, has fostered the development of creative locally developed programs, often where few diabetes resources previously existed. "The Sac and Fox Nation SDPI program has shown that it is possible to prevent and treat diabetes through partnerships with our communities, and through the development of innovative and culturally-appropriate activities," said Carver.

"The Sac and Fox Nation SDPI program strives to decrease the morbidity and mortality rate by decreasing complications associated with diabetes through prevention activities, promoting awareness, encouraging healthy lifestyles, self-management and treatment services," she added.

The Sac and Fox Nation SDPI program has implemented the following:

• Community Garden - With help from our local partner, the Lincoln County TSET Program, For 26th Consecutive Year!

the SFN Community Garden brings together community members of all ages. The garden is used in many SFN programs, including behavioral health, nutrition, exercise, CTSA head start, language, education, and the Elders Program.

- Youth The SFN partners with many community organizations to serve local youth including Eagle Adventure, summer reading programs, the Lincoln County Health Department, Oklahoma Tribal Engagement Partners, and SFN Language and Education Departments.
- Exercise Program Exercise Specialist, Anthony Ramirez, teaches patients the benefits of physical activity and leads them through workouts in the wellness center. Anthony trains individuals and teaches group classes such as resistance training, Tai Chi, and Yoga. Additionally, he organizes the annual SFN health fair.
- Awareness Days Black Hawk Health Center provides educational opportunities throughout the year for patients to learn more about health and wellness. Members of the health care team present over topics such as nutrition, exercise, behavioral health, and disease prevention and management. These events include Heart Healthy Day, Diabetes Day, and Breast Cancer Awareness Day.
- Health Fair The SFN Health Fair showcases exhibits from a wide variety of health professionals and attracts over 600 participants annually.

• Nutrition Program - Dietitian, Josh Nooner, educates patients over the role of nutrition in disease prevention and management. Cooking classes highlight USDA FDPIR foods and focus on budget-friendly

low-carbohydrate meals. Canning workshops and food drives are provided to the Sac and Fox Elder's Program.

• Elders - Improving the health and wellness of SFN elders is a key focus of the SDPI Program. Services offered include the Elder's Health Fair, Elder's Canning Workshops, Elder's Olympics, Elder's Cooking Classes, and the SFN Language Festival.

Wintertime within the Sac

wintertime within the Sac and Fox Indian Community can be uneventful. Yet, the community members still manage their daily schedules and move on through each day as they would at any other time.

That was not the case for a duo who are Sac and Fox Tribal Members and two of the few actively serving in the U. S. Armed Forces.

From mid-December 2022 until early January 2023, SGT Cheyenne Kauley of the United States Marine Corps and, SPC Bryce Bailey of the United States Army, returned home to enjoy the holiday season with family and friends.

SGT Kauley's MOS is 0111, which is an Administrative Specialist. She is assigned to 3d MRB in Stone Bay, North Carolina. SPC Bailey is a 19K M1A2 Abrams Crewman. He is assigned to 1st Armored Division based out of Fort Bliss, Texas. Both are accomplished powwow dancers of the women's jingle and men's woodland styles. Bryce has also made himself known as a singer, having sung with many groups at many different community celebrations and powwows near and

It was not until late December when they found out about a weekday contest powwow was to take place in Macy, Nebraska on the Omaha Reservation. They had made plans to travel to participate in the Powwow, then to journey back to Oklahoma to attend the new years powwow in Muskogee, Okla.

Almost one day before the road trip to Nebraska, Bryce received a concerning message on Facebook about the anticipated event. It said that the powwow in Nebraska had been postponed to a later date due to a loss within the Omaha Community. The new selected date was going to be after both Bryce and Cheyenne were to go back to Stone Bay and Fort Bliss. The two unfortunately had to cancel the trip

Jokingly, Cheyenne said to Bryce, "We should just have our own powwow," to which he responded, "I mean, we could if

you'd want to." They thought about it for a bit and they chose to go for it and hold the event.

A few days, later on the 28th of December, they went to Sac and Fox Tribal headquarters to fill out a rental request for the Community Building. They were approved for the event and immediately began planning.

Bryce called out to head staff candidates to inquire if they would be interested in serving the powwow. Few had to decline due to prior obligations, but eventually he got a full head staff roster. The host drum was Young Buffalo Horse, Head Singer was Hyde Toppah along with announcer and arena director, Dustin Harjo and Grant Door

The two head dancers were Nolan Shawnee and Victoria (Continued on Page 3)

Reverend Kyle Jay Gipp, age 43, made his journey December 8, 2022, at home in Shawnee, Oklahoma. Kyle was born August 26, 1979, in Fort Yates, North Dakota on the Standing Rock Reservation to Robin D. Tiger and Miles J. Gipp. He descended from the Lakota Sioux, Muscogee, Seminole, and Sac and Fox Nations.

Kyle's grandparents had a strong influence of faith on his life. It was in the car with his maternal grandmother Wanda Tiger when five-year-old Kyle decided to follow Christ. She pulled the car to the side of the road and prayed with him to accept Christ as he knelt on the floorboard.

Kyle graduated from Shawnee High School in May 1997, serving in the Army Reserves from 1997 to 2001. Following his military service, he surrendered to the ministry during a revival led by Clint Sinclair at Sallateeska Baptist Church. In 2002, Kyle was scouted out at Indian Falls Creek by then Jamie A. Burgess, who was able to meet him later that year. He had prayed for a wife like Jamie and for a family, not knowing he would be given both at one time. On June 4, 2005, he married his beloved, Jamie.

Kyle began ministry service as a youth leader at Sallateeska Baptist Church and First Indian Baptist Church in Shawnee,

Okla. Kyle was ordained at and pastored Weatherford Indian Baptist Church, in Weatherford, Okla. At his passing, he was serving as Associate Pastor of Indian Nations Baptist Church in Seminole, Okla., where he gave careful guidance and caring stability while the church was without a pastor. Pastor Kyle was a thoughtful and supportive minister with an old school sensibility that gave him a caring wisdom, steadfast commitment to service, and desire to develop and grow ministry areas as an administrator. Along with ministering in local churches, he served on the Indian Falls Creek Board of Directors in the Counseling and Promotions areas.

Sports provided an avenue for Kyle to play and enjoy family and friends. He was athletic and enjoyed competing in volleyball, softball and tennis, as well as watching his children and other family play sports. He was an Oklahoma fan, going to cheer on the Sooners football team with his brothers at bedlam this year. Ever the cinephile, he loved the Star Wars, The Lord of the Rings, and Harry Potter franchises, as well as The Office on the small screen, regularly giving insight to his family as an amateur movie

Kyle was preceded in death by his father Miles J. Gipp, maternal grandparents Rev. William and Wanda Tiger, and paternal grandparents Elaine V. 

Mi'ee Hamon. Cheyenne worked on what foods to serve for the pre-powwow dinner, as well as, who to cook. It was then told to her that, serving vegetable stew with beef, frybread and a sheet cake would be enough, since this was a small event

Later on that night, Bryce and Cheyenne looked over the flier that was created to see if last minute changes were needed. After corrections and additions were made, the flier was then posted to social media, getting shared and reposted numerous times.

The following day, they went to the local Walmart to purchase groceries and items needed for the impending celebration. Soup, stew ingredients, bowls, plates, eating utensils, drinks any other other necessities were purchased.

Friday, the day of the New Year's Powwow, had finally came. The evening had commenced and people from all throughout community arrived in support. The powwow started with a Flag and Memorial Song followed by Round Dance songs from the 3 singing groups: Center Drum, Young Buffalo Horse and visiting group, Gunslinger.

The traditional dances, such as Swan and Pipe Dance, were done with special contests thereafter. The night came to a close and through that last hour, every-

\$50 Million Available To Clean Up Orphaned Wells

The Department of the Interior on Nov. 23, 2022 announced final guidance for Tribes on how to apply for the first \$50 million in grant funding available under President Biden's Bipartisan Infrastructure Law to clean up orphaned oil and gas wells. The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law provides a total of \$4.7 billion to address orphaned wells across the country, including \$150 million for Tribal communities over five years. The final guidance is the result of a 60-day nation-to-nation consultation process.

There are several thousand orphaned oil and gas wells on Tribal lands, jeopardizing public health and safety by contaminating groundwater, seeping toxic chemicals, emitting harmful pollutants including methane, and harming wildlife. Some of these wells are underwater, which creates an especially high risk of adverse impacts.

"Through President Biden's Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, we are making historic investments to reclaim orphaned oil and gas wells on Tribal lands and address long-standing environmental injustices left behind by extractive industries," said Secretary Deb Haaland. "As part of our treaty and trust responsibility we have engaged in nation-to-nation consultations since the inception of this program so we can assist tribal nations in revitalizing their communities and help ensure future generations will have clear air, drinkable water, fertile soil and an overall good quality of life."

The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law makes a historic \$13 billion investment in Tribal communities — the largest investment in Tribal infrastructure ever. This includes funding to repair wastewater and sanitation systems, clean up legacy pollution, and invest in climate resilience, such as funding community-driven relocation planning and adaption for Tribes impacted by rising seas, coastal erosion and storm surges.

The final guidance announced recently provides instructions to Tribes on how to apply for orphaned well grants, as well as guidance on how Tribes can ensure activities funded under the program are putting people to work, protecting the environment, and safeguarding taxpayer money in a transparent and responsible manner.

Funding through the program may be utilized to plug, remediate or reclaim orphaned wells on Tribal land, restore soil and habitat in the degraded area, decommission or remove associated infrastructure, identify and characterize additional undocumented wells on Tribal land and set up well-plugging capacity where not already established. In lieu of grants and consistent with the Department's trust responsibilities, Tribes may also choose for the agency to administer and carry out plugging, remediation and reclamation activities on the Tribe's behalf.

These will be reviewed and may be selected to be put on one of the monuments (WWI, WWII, Korean or Vietnam). A fifth monument will be designated with the appropriate name for the Peace Keeping Initiative Years

(Iraq, Kuwait, Bosnia, Desert Storm and Desert Shield)

CATTAIL MATS

Cattail reeds are an important staple for our housing. In the summertime, women would harvest the reeds to weave large mats using a ribbone need and sinue or hemp for thread. The mats were used as an exterior covering for our summer houses, sleeping and eating mats, partitions, and sometimes in burials.





Meal Planning Helps Families Get Healthy and Save Money

Some days, it can be a scramble to get
a healthy dinner on the table due to sports
practices, dance lessons, club meetings
and other activities. Dinner time can be
hectic without a plan.

Jessica Riggin, Oklahoma State University Extension educator and Lincoln County Extension director, said meal planning is a good way to serve healthy meals and save money on the grocery budget. "With a meal plan, you determine the menu for the week and make a shopping list. When shopping, buy only what's needed for those planned meals," she said. "You save money with less impulse shopping and also save time by not making extraneous trips to the store throughout the week."

Riggin suggests meal planning for your family's biggest meal of the day, which for most people is the evening meal. Without a plan, it can be easy to fall into the habit of pizza delivery or drive-thru meals, which typically aren't

as healthy and are more expensive.

Riggin said she plans an entire month of meals at a time, but someone just starting out could start with two or three meals a week and work up from there. Print off a blank calendar page to keep track of the planned meals.

"The great thing about meal planning is it's catered to the specific needs of your family," she said. "Look at your calendar and determine what nights you or your children have activities. Activities can influence what kind of meal to plan for that evening. Do you need something quick so you can make it to the ballgame? A slow-cooker meal could be an option. You can even put a drive-through meal or pizza delivery on your calendar. The point is you've planned for it."

Consider theme nights to ease the planning process, such as soup night, sheet-pan dinners, slow-cooker meals, breakfast for dinner, grilling night, etc. Riggin said if possible, cook a bigger meal on the weekend and plan to repurpose the leftovers another night during the week. Be sure to plan side dishes along with the

main course.

"Try oven roasted vegetables for a different taste. A little olive oil and seasonings can change up the flavor and may entice picky eaters to give it a try," she said. "Sometimes, it takes several exposures before a child develops a taste for a particular food. Frozen vegetables are just as healthy as fresh, and the quality is good all year long. However, do take advantage of fresh in-season fruits and vegetables."

Vegetables can be served in a variety of ways, such as steamed, roasted, raw, in a stir fry or with a sauce. Each cooking method changes the flavor and texture. Someone may not like raw broccoli but can't get enough of it roasted.

Get the family involved in choosing recipes, shopping for ingredients and cooking the meals, said Riggin. These are good life skills for everyone to have. Look at online recipe sites for new ideas. Be sure to read through each recipe to ensure it fits your health goals and lifestyle.

"Another great tool to help with meal planning is the USDA's MyPlate website.

It offers guidance for all age groups as well as healthy recipes on a budget and helps with setting personal goals for healthy eating," Riggin said. "Consumers can also sign up to receive tips, recipes and more through email that can be incorporated into your meal plan."



The statement shall be verified by affidavit of the contestor (s) that they believe the matters and things therein contained are true. Any party to the election protest and the Election Board shall have the right to view the election ballots and records in the presence of the Court Clerk in the clerk's office. Any party to the protest or a Tribal member shall be entitled to receive a photocopy of said documents certified as true and correct copies by the Court Clerk upon payment to said clerk of the normal and customary charges.

Said certified copies shall be received as evidence by the Election Board in like manner as an original. Alternatively the Election Board, upon request of a party or on its own motion, may convene a hearing for any protested election at the Tribal Courthouse for the purpose of review of said election materials. After hearing the proofs and allegations of the contestants, the Election Board shall make their findings and shall have authority to pronounce their judgment either setting aside, or confirming the election.

Section 805. Request for Recount Since the Election Ordinance provides for automatic recount of ballots, any request for recount of ballots must list the reasons therefore in writing and be submitted to the Election Board Chairman, or the Chairman's designated representative within five (5) days after the election. Such request must be accompanied by a nonrefundable cashier's check of two-hundred dollars (\$200.00) made payable to the Sac and Fox Nation. Said check

shall be forwarded to the Tribal Secretary-Treasurer to be credited against the cost of the recount. The Election Board shall meet and decide within ten (10) days of receipt of the notice whether or not the reasons listed in the request are sufficient to cause a recount of ballots.



Systolic vs. Diastolic Blood Pressure

Blood Pressure is typically recorded as two numbers and written as a ratio like this 120/70 Systolic:

The top number measures the pressure in the arteries when the heart beats (when the heart contracts).

Diastolic

The bottom number, which is also the lower of the two numbers, measures the pressure in the arteries between the heartbeats (when the heart muscle is resting between beats and refills with blood).
