'Community Connect' Providing Health-Related Educational Info

Coordinator Angel Thornton, RN and the Black Hawk Health Center's Community Health Dept. presented the first feature of 'Community Connect' in the February edition of the Sac and Fox News.

'Community Connect' is a newsletter with a goal of providing health-related tips and information on current events to tribal members.

In observation of American Heart Month, Thornton and other Community Health staff members provided 'informative heart-healthy materials, food samples and door prizes from a booth in the Black Hawk Health Center lobby. The representatives were available each Friday during the month of February providing educational information on 'Self Care.'

'Self-Care' Tips From the Community Health Dept.

Friday, Feb. 3 was designated as 'National Wear Red Day,' with a focus on 'Knowing Your Numbers,' including systolic and diastolic blood pressure numbers and cholesterol. The emphasis on Feb. 10 included 'Healthy Eating for a Happy Heart,' and featured free samples of various fruits.

The need for physical exercise was the focus on Feb. 17. The emphasis on Feb. 24 was stress reduction, sleep patterns and how they relate to heart health

Information was provided for beginning a 'DASH Diet.' DASH is short for 'Dietary Approaches to stop Hypertension.' The diet requires no special foods, and encourages the following: • Eat vegetables, fruits and whole grains; • Include fatfree or low-fat diary products, fish, poultry, beans, nuts and vegetable oils; • Limit foods that are high in saturated fat, such as fatty meats, full-fat dairy foods and tropical oils such as coconut, palm kernel and palm oil.

Among the door prizes were

electronic fitness trackers, cookbooks published by the New American Heart Association and other items.

Environmental Law Training to Address Illegal Roadside Dumps

Illegal roadside dumps continue to plague Oklahoma. To help combat this issue, Oklahoma State University Extension is partnering with the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality and the U.S. Department of Agriculture-Rural Development to host the Oklahoma Environmental Law Enforcement Training Seminar in Oklahoma City.

The training will take place from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. on March 9 at the Oklahoma County OSU Extension office, 2500 NE 63rd St., Oklahoma City. The event is geared toward law enforcement officers, tribal environmental representatives, county commissioners, city officials and local citizens. Testing and certification will take place from 4 to 5 p.m. Eight hours of law enforcement credit is provided. The free seminar is limited to 50 participants, and pre-registration is required. Participants will have lunch on their own.

"Illegal roadside dumps are not only unsightly, but they're also dangerous," said Keima Borsuah, OSU Extension assistant state specialist with the Solid Waste Management Program

at OSU. "They have a negative impact on the environment by contaminating the soil, ground water, drinking water, wells and streams. Unfortunately, they continue to be a problem, especially along Oklahoma's backroads."

Borsuah also pointed out these illegal dumpsites can decrease the quality of life in nearby communities and have a negative effect on property values.

Participants will receive the following: • Expertise in environmental crimes investigations involving solid and hazardous waste, air and water pollution, open burning and agency jurisdiction issues.

- Knowledge in identifying resources for improving local law enforcement programs.
- Networking opportunities with others involved in environmental law enforcement.
- Dennis Williams, chief of the Criminal Investigations Unit with ODEQ, will instruct the class. He is a CLEET-certified peace officer and is cross-commissioned with the Cherokee Nation Marshal Service.

Christine Williamson, 95, of rural Cushing, Okla., passed from this life at her home with her family by her side, on Tuesday, January 24, 2023.

Christine Barker Williamson, also known as 'Nayeshi,' her Sauk name, meaning 'to keep going,' was born November 5, 1927, outside Drumright, Okla. to Ella (Butler) and Lee Barker. Nayeshi is one of the few remaining full-blood members of the Sauk and Fox Nation.

Christine began her education as an Oak Grove tiger, and then on to Haskell Institute in Lawrence, Kansas. Christine then returned to Oklahoma to further her education in Oklahoma City, becoming a Registered Nurse. Christine worked in nursing over forty years in the surrounding communities, retiring from Stroud Hospital.

During her time in Oklahoma City, Christine met a handsome soldier, Mitchel H. Williamson, and they married in Oklahoma City on January 10, 1953. They returned to rural Cushing, built their home and went on to raise 3 Sauk/Choctaw boys: Richard, Josh, and Robert.

Christine previously served on the Sac and Fox Nation Health Advisory Board and the Sac and Fox Nation Housing Authority. Being one of the last fluent speakers of the Tribe, Christine had a deep passion for her native language. This deep passion resulted in her working with the Sauk Language Dept., working into her 90s. She shared her knowl-

Harold graduated from Capitol Hill High School in Oklahoma City in 1952. After high school, he met Lura Asah and traveled with her family to London to perform in the Asah Indian Dance Troupe, along with the Tex Ritter Rodeo Show, in well-publicized events.

Harold attended Oklahoma University and Hills Business School before serving in the US Army. While in the US Army, he was stationed in Anchorage, Alaska for two years. After serving in the US Army, he returned to Oklahoma City and married Lura in 1958, where they made their home and started a family.

Harold started out working with his father at Jones Boys Tire Company before opening his own tire business, Little Chief Tire, which he ran until he retired in 1989. He was involved in the Indian Bowling league, Red Feather.

In his later years, he enjoyed watching football, basketball, and golf. His favorite teams were the OKC Thunder, Oklahoma Sooners, and OSU Cowboys. When his grandchildren were younger, he was the family babysitter, and all the grandchildren have fond memories of that time with him.

He is survived by 3 sons: Spencer and Timothy (Cindy) of Oklahoma City, Robert (Marcella) of Anchorage, Alaska; 1 daughter: Leslie (Robert) of Stillwater, Okla.; 10 grandchildren: Tim Jr., Nicholas, Christine, Amanda, Aleigha, Alanna, Keenan, Anisah, Danelle, and Kaitlyn; 7 great-grandchildren; 1 sister: Karen Ingham; and a host of other loving family members and friends.

Nayeshi was raised in the Native American Church and the traditional ways of the Sauk and Fox tribe. Through these customs, Nayeshi was adopted into several families. Through those adoptions, Christine and Mitch acquired a great amount of daughters, sons, grand-children and other relations ranging from Iowa back to Oklahoma.

She is predeceased by her husband Mitchel H. Williamson in December of 2009; her son Josh Lee Williamson in November of 2010; and, her son Richard Howard Williamson in September of 2018. Christine was the last remaining sibling of 7: Her 3 brothers Everett Barker, Scott 'Punny' Barker, and Lee 'Skush' Barker; her 3 sisters Maxine Cobb, Nadine Barker-Sloan, and Nora 'Josie' Lauderdale; and, her parents Ella and Lee Barker.

Sac and Fox Nation Education Department News

Greetings!

The Education Department attended an Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) consultation on January 25, 2023, hosted at the Oklahoma City Public Schools Administration Building, Clara Luper

Due to the weather, the consultation was delayed one hour. The OKC Metro Indian Education Directors Consortium

Business Committee Meeting Minutes are accessible on the Website sacandfoxnation-nsn.gov

is comprised of the following schools: Edmond, Mid-Del, Moore, Norman, Oklahoma City, Putnam City and Western Heights Public Schools. Tribes that attended were Creek Nation, CPN, Cheyenne Arapaho, Kickapoo, Sac and Fox Nation, Seminole Nation, Kiowa, Pawnee Nation, Wichita and Affiliated Tribes, Choctaw Nation.

The Sac and Fox Nation has 86 students that attend the schools mentioned above. Edmond has zero; Mid-Del 10; Moore 17; Norman 15; Oklahoma City Schools 30; Putnam City 7; and, Western Heights 7.

The overall consultation was a meaningful dialogue with each school district. A question that I asked: "What are the schools doing in changing their policies in protecting our male Native American Indian Students who wish to wear their hair long?"

Three schools responded with their feedback. Most of the schools responded that the administration came to the Indian Education director and filtered through the problem if there was an incident of hair cutting. The response to my question was "No", with no policies being change or added to school handbook.

We are very concerned about some senate bills: SB 429 and SB 863 and House Bill 2115. Senate Bill 429 pertains to tribal regalia at school. SB 863 removes federal funds from schools. House Bill 2115 pertains to Native culture taught in schools.


We have been on several virtual town hall meetings discussing the bills mentioned. SB 429 was approved by the Education Committee, and now the Senate will bring it to the Senate Floor for a vote. When passed, it will then go into effect July 1, 2023.

THE THREE SISTERS

For many Native American communities, three seeds - corn, beans, and squash represent the most important crops. When planted together, the Three Sisters, work together to help one another thrive and survive.

Corn provides tall stalks for the beans to climb so that they are not outcompeted by sprawling squash vines. Beans absorb nitrogen from the air and convert it into forms that can fertilize the soil while also stabilizing the tall corn during heavy winds. The large leaves of squash plants shade the ground which helps retain soil moisture and prevent weeds.

In our creation story, when the Earth was vast and barren, twelve brothers set out to find food and water for their people. They came across an elderly couple that asked each boy what they sought. Each boy sacrificed their lives to give our people what we need. The sixth, seventh, and eighth boy asked for food to feed their people; corn, beans, and squash.

The Three Sisters are lead foods in ceremonies and the Sac and Fox offer prayers of thanks and appreciation to the Twelve Boys. "Mah kwa ti says to take heed to each note card message."



Any such Primary Election shall be held at least thirty (30) days prior to the regular General Election.

Primary Election: Saturday, June 3, 2023 Section 201. Election Days

(a) Regular General Elections of members of the Business Committee and Grievance Committee shall be held

on the last Saturday in August of each election year. All other required Tribal elections shall be held upon call of the Business Committee.

General Election: Saturday, August 26, 2023

Each candidate may designate in writing one person, not a candidate, to watch the activities at the polls. Such designation shall be presented to Election Board Officials prior to the election. Such persons may not interfere in any way with the conduct of the election, but may observe only. Any poll watcher interfering with the election or attempting to electioneer, in any way, shall be rejected from the poll area by a Sergeant of Arms or law enforcement officer.

PRIMARY ELECTION:

Notification of Poll Watchers for the Primary Election must be in writing and received eight (8) days prior to the election, per Election Board Rules.

DEADLINE: Friday, May 26, 2023 by 5:00 p.m.

GENERAL ELECTION:

Notification of Poll Watchers for the General Election must be in writing and received eight (8) days prior to the election, per Election Board Rules.

DEADLINE: Friday, August 18, 2023 by 5:00 p.m.

All notifications must be sent to the Sac and Fox Nation Election Board, 920963 S. Hwy 99, Stroud, OK 74079 or emailed to SFNEB@sacandfoxnation-nsn.gov.

Section 302. Voting List

It shall be the duty of the Tribal Secretary to compile from the Tribal membership rolls a list of all persons who will be eligible voters on the date scheduled for the Primary Election and General Election and to present sufficient certified copies of this list as requested to the Election Board no later than sixty (60) days prior to the Primary Election and no later than sixty (60) days prior to the General Election. The said copies are to be returned to the Tribal Secretary.

One copy of the voting list shall be maintained in the Tribal Office and be open to public inspection during Regular business hours no later than sixty (60) days prior to the election.

Open to the public: Tuesday, April 4, 2023

GENERAL ELECTION:

Open to the public: Tuesday, June 27, 2023

Section 303. Challenges to Voting Lists

At any time more than twenty (20) days before the Primary Election and General Election, any person may challenge the voting eligibility of any person whose name appears on said list or may apply to have their name added to said list by filing an application with the Election Board. The application shall clearly indicate the substance of the challenge, the specific names challenged, and the relief requested.

The statement shall be verified by affidavit of the contestor (s) that they believe the matters and things therein contained are true. After the statement is filed the Election Board shall set a time for a hearing of the contest, no later than ten (10) days after the date on which the statement of contest was filed. Written notice of such hearing shall be mailed or delivered to each candidate for the office contested. Any party to the election protest and the Election Board shall have the right to view the election ballots and records in the presence of the Court Clerk in the clerk's office. Any party to the protest or a Tribal member shall be entitled to receive a photocopy of said documents certified as true and correct copies by the Court Clerk upon payment to said clerk of the normal and customary charges.

Said certified copies shall be received as evidence by the Election Board in like manner as an original. Alternatively the Election Board, upon request of a party or on its own motion, may convene a hearing for any protested election at the Tribal Courthouse for the purpose of review of said election materials. After hearing the proofs and allegations of the contestants, the Election Board shall make their findings and shall have authority to pronounce their judgment either setting aside, or confirming the election.

ALGONQUIAN FOOTWEAR

The New England Indians preferred a one-piece moccasin without added sole. The centered front scam was characteristic and gove a rather pointed toe. Sinew was stronger than thread and cinched up tightly on drying Few Indians today, however, opt for the sinew.

By all odds, moosehide was best for durable service, but buckshin was a tolerable substitute. The moccasins were sometimes tied with a thong of the same hide, and in four weather the flaps could be folded up for protection.





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Construction of 8-Mile Sewer Main is Underway in Shawnee

Construction has begun on the new sewer main included in the City of Shawnee Wastewater Treatment Plant update. The line is over 8 miles long and will be under construction for the next year.

Downey Contracting, LLC, is the contractor for the City of Shawnee handling this lengthy project that extends from Garret's Lake Road to S. Bryan Avenue. The route mostly follows Brangus Road, then E. Highland Street, E. Main Street, and S. Bryan Avenue, to the existing treatment plant on E. Dunbar Street. Downey will be placing information, including a contact name, on the doors of residences that may be affected.

"While it is Downey's priority to get the job done, they will gladly work with residents to lessen the impact and keep them informed," said Seth Barkhimer, Director of Engineering for the City of Shawnee.

The City of Shawnee Wastewater Treatment Plant project encompasses over \$117 million in critical public infrastructure improvements. The project includes the replacement of 40-year old wastewater treatment plant and the conversion of a 70-year old wastewater treatment plant into a lift station.

The project will provide protection of citizen health and safety, promotion of continued community growth, and allow for future expansion capabilities to support the next generation. Funding for this project is made possible by Shawnee voters who approved a 0.5% sales tax in January 2023.




