Native American Children to Stay With Native Families

A preference for Native American families adopting Native children was preserved after the Supreme Court on June 15 upheld a landmark Indigenous law. In a decisive 7-2 ruling involving a Fort Worth family, the court upheld terms of the Indian

Child Welfare Act, commonly known as ICWA, adopted by Congress in 1978 with only Justices Clarence Thomas and Samuel Alito dissenting.

Justice Amy Coney Barrett delivered the opinion of the court with John G. Roberts, Jr., Sonia Sotomayor, Elena Kagan, Neil Gorsuch, Brett Kavanaugh, and Kentaji Brown Jackson

joining Barrett on the majority side. Gorsuch said the ruling secures the right for Indian families to raise their families as they please and Indian children to grow in their culture.

tribes have come to this Court seeking justice only to leave with bowed heads and empty hands. But that is not because this court has no justice to offer them," Gorsuch said in the 133-page ruling. "Our Constitution reserves for the Tribes a place – an enduring place – in the structure of American life. It promises them sovereignty for as long as they wish to keep it," he wrote.

Vice President Kamala Harris said she has seen firsthand how essential this law is. "For centuries, Native children were torn away from their families and their communities. These acts were not only violations of the basic human rights of those children and their families but also an attack on the very existence of Tribal Nations," Harris said. "President Biden and I will

continue to fight to protect Native families, children and communities. And we will continue to stand with Tribal Nations in defense of Tribal sovereignty."

Alito criticized the Supreme Court majority for violating one of the most basic laws of logic that Congress' power over Indian Affairs is "plenary" but not "absolute." But Oklahoma Rep. Tom Cole (R, Moore) and Rep. Sharice Davids (D, Kansas), the co-chairs of the Congressional Native American Caucus, said the Supreme Court made the right decision.

"This landmark decision rightly upholds protections for Native children and reaffirms the sovereignty rights of tribal governments," the two said in a joint statement. "We applaud the Supreme Court in rejecting

those challenges and standing with Native American children and their right to remain in their own cultures."

Cherokee Nation Principal Chief Chuck Hoskin, Jr. said the ruling was a major victory for not only the Cherokee Nation, but many tribes across the United States. "We hope this decision will lay to rest the political attacks aimed at diminishing tribal sovereignty and creating instability through Indian law that have persisted for too long," Hoskin said. "The Court once again demonstrated that it understands the legitimacy of ICWA and what it means for tribes, families, and children. ... the justices have landed on the right side of history," he said.

Choctaw Nation Chief Gary Batton joined Hoskin and said he is glad the Supreme Court recognized the benefits of ICWA allowing the law to stand. The case was filed after a 10 month old Navajo child was placed with Chad and Jennifer Brackeen of Fort Worth.

The child, whose mother was Navajo and father was Cherokee, fell under the definition of an "Indian child" with the child being "a member of an Indian tribe" or "the biological child of a member of an Indian tribe."

New Mexico's Navajo Nation protested the Brackeen adoption and found tribal members in New Mexico for the child. But, the Brackeens fought the tribe in state court urging the court to keep the child with them, the only parents the child knew.

After the court ruled against the Brackeens, Texas Department of Family and Protective Services almost took the child, but the Brackeens obtained an emergency stay of the transfer. Eventually, the Navajo family the Navajo Nation

had found in New Mexico withdrew and the Brackeens were allowed to adopt the boy. But their efforts to adopt the boy's sister could now be in doubt because of the court's ruling.

The family told ABC News Thursday that it was "crushed" by the ruling. Deb Haaland, the Secretary of the Department of Interior, released a statement less than two hours after the case was decided. She said it is a welcome affirmation to what people on both sides of the political aisle have been doing for four decades.

"For nearly two centuries, federal policies promoted the forced removal of Indian children from their families and communities through boarding schools, foster care, and adoption. Those policies were a targeted attack on the existence of Tribes, and they inflicted trauma on children, families and communities that people continue to feel today," Haaland said.

"Congress passed the Indian Child Welfare Act in 1978 to put an end to those policies. The Act ensured that the United States' new policy would be to meet its legal and moral obligation to protect Indian children and families, and safeguard the future of Indian Tribes," she said.

Senate majority leader Chuck Schumer (D-NY) said tribal sovereignty was affirmed with the ruling. "The Supreme Court upheld the Constitutional right of tribal sovereignty. For hundreds of years, indigenous communities have fought for their very existence, and today is nothing short of a momentous day that ensures that indigenous children maintain a connection to their culture," Schumer said.





Any such Primary Election shall be held at least thirty (30) days prior to the regular General Election. Primary Election: Saturday, June 3, 2023

Section 201. Election Days

(a) Regular General Elections of members of the Business Committee and Grievance Committee shall be held on the last Saturday in August of each election year. All other required Tribal elections shall be held upon call of the Business Committee.

General Election: Saturday, August 26, 2023

Each candidate may designate in writing one person, not a candidate, to watch the activities at the polls. Such designation shall be presented to Election Board Officials prior to the election. Such persons may not interfere in any way with the conduct of the election, but may observe only. Any poll watcher interfering with the election or attempting to electioneer, in any way, shall be rejected from the poll area by a Sergeant of Arms or law enforcement officer.

PRIMARY ELECTION:

Notification of Poll Watchers for the Primary Election must be in writing and received eight (8) days prior to the election, per Election Board Rules.

DEADLINE: Friday, May 26, 2023 by 5:00 p.m.

GENERAL ELECTION:

Notification of Poll Watchers for the General Election must be in writing and received eight (8) days prior to the election, per Election Board Rules.

DEADLINE: Friday, August 18, 2023 by 5:00 p.m.

All notifications must be sent to the Sac and Fox Nation Election Board, 920963 S. Hwy 99, Stroud, OK 74079 or emailed to SFNEB@sacandfoxnation-nsn.gov.

Section 302. Voting List

It shall be the duty of the Tribal Secretary to compile from the Tribal membership rolls a list of all persons who will be eligible voters on the date scheduled for the Primary Election and General Election and to present sufficient certified copies of this list as requested to the Election Board no later than sixty (60) days prior to the Primary Election and no later than sixty (60) days prior to the General Election. The said copies are to be returned to the Tribal Secretary.

One copy of the voting list shall be maintained in the Tribal Office and be open to public inspection during Regular business hours no later than sixty (60) days prior to the election.

A candidate or qualified voter contesting a Tribal Election shall, within ten (10) days after completion of the tally of the election and declaration of the results, shall deposit a two hundred dollar (\$200.00) non-refundable cashier's check contest filing fee with the Tribal Treasurer, file with the Election Board a statement in writing setting forth their particular grounds for the contest. The statement shall be verified by affidavit of the contestor (s) that they believe the matters and things therein contained are true. After the statement is filed the Election Board shall set a time for a hearing of the contest, no later than ten (10) days after the date on which the statement of contest was filed. Written notice of such hearing shall be mailed or delivered to each candidate for the office contested. Any party to the election protest and the Election Board shall have the right to view the election ballots and records in the presence of the Court Clerk in the clerk's office. Any party to the protest or a Tribal member shall be entitled to receive a photocopy of said documents certified as true and correct copies by the Court Clerk upon payment to said clerk of the normal and customary charges.

Said certified copies shall be received as evidence by the Election Board in like manner as an original. Alternatively the Election Board, upon request of a party or on its own motion, may convene a hearing for any protested election at the Tribal Courthouse for the purpose of review of said election materials. After hearing the proofs and allegations of the contestants, the Election Board shall make their findings and shall have authority to pronounce their judgment either setting aside, or confirming the election.







THE HEAT IS ON

Heat exhaustion: First aid

Heat exhaustion is one of the heat-related syndromes. These syndromes range in severity and seriousness from mild to potentially life threatening.

Heat exhaustion can occur when your body loses too much water or salt — usually because of excessive sweating or dehydration. It can begin suddenly or happen over time, usually after working, exercising or playing in the heat

Heat exhaustion signs and symptoms include:

Cool, moist skin with goose bumps when in the heat, heavy sweating, Faintness, Headache, Mild confusion, Dizziness, Fatigue, Extreme thirst, Muscle cramps, Nausea or vomiting

If you suspect heat exhaustion

- Move the person out of the heat and into a shady or air-conditioned place.
- Lay the person down and elevate the legs and feet slightly.
- Remove tight or heavy clothing
- Have the person sip chilled water, a decaffeinated sports drink containing electrolytes or other nonalcoholic beverage without caffeine.
- Cool the person by spraying or sponging with cool water and fanning.

Ingredients

2 -tablespoons whole-grain mustard

Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper

2- Scallions (white and green), thinly sliced,

- 1- Rib celery, minced, scant 1/2 cup
- 2- Radishes, grated on the large holes of a box grater
- 8- Romaine lettuce leaves
- 1-cup pea or other sprouts

Put the eggs in a saucepan with enough cold water to cover. Bring to a boil, cover, and remove from the heat. Set aside for 12 minutes. Drain the eggs and roll them between your palm and the counter to crack the shell, and then peel under cool running water.

Dice the eggs. Combine the eggs with mayonnaise, mustard and season with the salt and pepper. Stir in the scallions, celery, and radish.

Divide the egg salad among the lettuce leaves, top with the sprouts and roll up. Serve 2 rolls per serving.

Meet BHHC Community Health Nurses



Hamilton and Smith Selected for Carlisle Indian School Workshop

On April 7, 2023, Historical Researcher, Juaquin Hamilton and Librarian/ Archivist Tech, Johanna Smith were accepted to participate in the Carlisle Indian School Summer Workshop on June 14-16, hosted by the Carlisle Indian School Digital Resource Center at Dickinson College. The event was supported by a grant from the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation.

From 1879 to 1918, nearly 7800 students from as many as 200 different Native American communities were enrolled at the Carlisle Indian Industrial School, located in Carlisle, Pennsylvania. For the past ten years, a team of archivists, scholars, students, and volunteers have been digitizing records related to the school and uploading those materials to an open and accessible website, known as the Carlisle Indian School

Digital Resource Center (CISDRC). The lasting impact and legacy of Carlisle and the larger Indian boarding school movement is an important part of American history that warrants continued exploration, discussion, and dissemination.

Juaquin and Johanna were 2 of the 12 participants that were chosen for this great opportunity. The workshop was specifically designed for tribal librarians, archivists and museum curators to learn more about the materials available through the digital project, to understand the context of the materials among the large body of extant documentation about the school, and to hear the latest information that the CISDRC team has learned from these extant records.

Through the efforts of Jim Thorpe expert, Robert Wheeler, they were asked to accept an award on behalf of the Sac and Fox Nation by Alison Eaby Eachus, the Governor of The Amateur Athletic Union (AAU) in Philadelphia on Monday evening June 12 as Jim Thorpe was inducted into the Hall of Fame. The trophy will be on display at the SFN Cultural Center.

Wheeler also organized meetings with Carlisle football historian, Dr. Tom Benjey and Carlisle Indian Boarding School historian, Barbara Landis. Valuable information was shared about Sac and Fox students with Juaquin and Johanna. On Tuesday evening June 13, they made the two-hour trip to pay their respects to Olympian Jim Thorpe at his mausoleum.

They also continued research at the Cumberland County Historical Society where archivist, Cara Curtis presented to the workshop participants. After Thursday's session in the Dickinson College classroom the workshop participants were taken on a tour of the Carlisle Army barracks (The old boarding school).

Each candidate may select a watcher of their choice, not a candidate, to observe and keep a separate record of the tally of the ballots, and who shall not interfere with the tally process. After the tally is complete, all ballots, absentee ballots, voter registers, and ballot boxes shall be transported to the Sac and Fox Nation Tribal Court House.

PRIMARY RUN-OFF ELECTION:

Notification of Tally Watchers for the Primary Run-Off Election must be in writing and received eight (8) days prior to the election, per Election Board Rules. DEADLINE: Friday, July 14, 2023, by 5:00 p.m.

Section 710. Certification of Election

The election shall be certified by the Election Board immediately after the ten (10) day period for filing an election contest expires, provided, that if an election contest petition is filed within the time period allowed, then no Certificate of Election shall be issued until after such election contest is finally decided.

PRIMARY RUN-OFF ELECTION: If the tally is completed on Saturday, July 22, 2023

CERTIFICATION is on Tuesday, August 1, 2023

If the tally is completed on Sunday, July 23, 2023 CERTIFICATION is on Wednesday, August 2, 2023

Section 802. Contest Petition

A candidate or qualified voter contesting a Tribal Election shall, within ten (10) days after completion of the tally of the election and declaration of the results, shall deposit a two hundred dollar (\$200.00) non-refundable cashier's check contest filing fee with the Tribal Treasurer, file with the Election Board a statement in writing setting forth their particular grounds for the contest. The statement shall be verified by the affidavit of the contestor (s) that they believe the matters and things therein contained are true. After the statement is filed the Election Board shall set a time for a hearing of the contest, no later than ten (10) days after the date on which the statement of contest was filed. Written notice of such hearing shall be mailed or delivered to each candidate for the office contested. Any party to the election protest and the Election Board shall have the right to view the election ballots and records in the presence of the Court Clerk in the clerk's office. Any party to the protest or a Tribal member shall be entitled to receive a photocopy of said documents certified as true and correct copies by the Court Clerk upon payment to said clerk of the normal and customary charges.

Said certified copies shall be received as evidence by the Election Board in like manner as an original. Alternatively the Election Board, upon request of a party or on its own motion, may convene a hearing for any protested election at the Tribal Courthouse for the purpose of review of said election materials. After hearing the

proofs and allegations of the contestants, the Election Board shall make their findings and shall have authority to pronounce their judgment either setting aside, or confirming the election.



Section 805. Request for Recount

Since the Election Ordinance provides for automatic recount of ballots, any request for recount of ballots must list the reasons therefore in writing and be submitted to the Election Board Chairman, or the Chairman's designated representative within five (5) days after the election. Such request must be accompanied by a nonrefundable cashier's check of two-hundred dollars (\$200.00) made payable to the Sac and Fox Nation. Said check shall be forwarded to the Tribal Secretary-Treasurer to be credited against the cost of the recount. The Election Board shall meet and decide within ten (10) days of receipt of the notice whether or not the reasons listed in the request are sufficient to cause a recount of ballots.







Office of Environmental Services Summer is upon us, it's that time of year again when we spend time outside in the heat and we can be exposed to the very real dangers associated with working in the heat. The best plan is prevention. Knowing the dangers and signs of heat illness are vital to health and safety.

When Are We At The Greatest Risk

The sun has the greatest intensity between the hours of 10:00am and 3:00pm Standard Time, which is also when people are in the middle of their workday and may be exposed to the heat.

What Are the Dangers?

There are four common medical problems caused by heat exposure: heat rash, heat cramps, heat exhaustion and heat

Heat rash is just what it sounds like: a rash caused by too much heat. The skin becomes irritated by excessive sweating, particularly during humid times when it can't evaporate well.

Symptoms & Treatment: It looks like a red cluster of pimples or small blisters and is most commonly found on the neck and upper chest, in the groin, under the breasts and in elbow creases. If possible, move to a cooler environment, at least temporarily. Keep the area dry — do not wash with water unless it is immediately

Heat cramps are pains felt in the muscles, often with spasms, and usually in conjunction with strenuous activity. They're often caused by a depletion of the body's salt and fluids through excessive sweating, and can also be a symptom of heat exhaustion.

Symptoms & Treatment: Symptoms include intermittent and involuntary spasms of larger muscles in the body. Stop activity and rest in a cool place. Drink juice or a sports beverage to replace the fluids and salts, but DO NOT take a salt pill unless directed by a doctor. If you are on a low-sodium diet, seek medical attention. Continue resting for several hours after the pain from the cramps goes away—returning to work too soon puts you at serious risk of heat exhaustion or heat stroke. If the heat cramps do not subside within one hour of resting, seek medical attention.

Heat exhaustion is the beginning of the body breaking down by being unable to regulate its internal temperature.

Symptoms & Treatment: Symptoms may include heavy and excessive sweating, paleness, muscle cramps, fatigue, weakness, dizziness, headache, nausea or vomiting, and fainting. Stop working immediately, get somewhere much cooler or even take a cool shower or bath, and drink cool beverages that are nonalcoholic. If clothing is heavy or tight, change into something lightweight and airy.

As with heat cramps, wait several hours after the symptoms subside before returning to work. If the symptoms get worse during treatment, or if they last longer than one hour, seek medical atten-

Heat stroke is the most serious of the heat-related illnesses. The body's temperature regulation system breaks down entirely, and the body is unable to cool itself. Body temperature can rise to 106°F or higher in as little as 10-15 minutes. At that point, vital organs, including the brain, can become damaged.

Symptoms & Treatment: There are several warning signs of heat stroke, and not all of them need to be present: an extremely high body temperature (103°F or higher); skin that is red, hot, and dry, without sweating; a strong, fast pulse; a throbbing headache; dizziness; nausea, possibly with vomiting; confusion; and possibly unconsciousness. In the event of a heat stroke, call 911 immediately and do whatever you can to cool the victim's temperature down until help arrives.

Prevention is key

Drink water, water and more water. Plenty of fresh water will keep the body hydrated and cool during intense heat. Avoid sugary and caffeinated beverages because these can dehydrate your body. When you are going to be exposed to the sun for prolonged periods of time you should also take frequent breaks in the shade, rest, apply sunscreen with at least SPF 15, and wear protective gear when

The heat index takes both temperature and humidity into account to give a more accurate account of how conditions will affect the body. Once the heat index gets into the 90s and above, threats start getting severe and precautions need to be raised.






