Sauk Language Dept. Receives \$300,000 'Living Languages' Grant

The Indian Affairs Office of Indian Economic Development on Dec. 21, 2023 announced it has awarded \$5.723 million in total 'Living Languages Grant Program' funding to 20 American Indian and Alaska Native Tribes and Tribal Organizations. The awards range in value from \$200,000 to \$300,000 per year for three years. The Sac and Fox Nation's Sauk Language Program has received \$300,000 in funding.

The Living Languages Grant Program provides an opportunity for Tribes to receive funding to document and revitalize languages that are at risk of disappearing because of a declining native-speaker population. For more than 150 years, Native languages in the U.S. have been subjected to suppression and elimination from a variety of factors such as federal boarding and other types of schools that forced American Indian, Alaska Native and Native Hawaiian children to forgo speaking the language of their peoples.

"Living Languages Grant Program funding supports Tribal communities in restoring and revitalizing their traditional languages, thereby preserving the essence of their cultural identities and sovereignty," said Assistant Secretary for Indian Affairs Bryan Newland. "Investing in Native language revitalization is just one part of our all-of-government approach to addressing

the harms caused by federal policies of the past, such as Federal Indian Boarding School which actively worked to suppress Native languages and cultures."

The Living Languages Grant Program's focus for fiscal year 2024 is on Native language immersion projects that support a cohesive Tribal community-approach through collaborative instruction based on current language immersion models. This year's funding is intended for projects that provide an "all-of-community" language program with measurable outcomes which will be achieved within three years.

The awards represent a longterm federal commitment to a comprehensive approach for revitalizing Indigenous communities with a framework built on the draft 10-Year National Plan on Native Language Revitalization and its four foundational pillars of awareness, recognition, integration and support.

Chief Randle Carter's Address to the Nation

Throughout these past months, the Business Committee has approved over 100 tribal budgets for programs to continue throughout the tribal fiscal year. Also, we are proud to announce that our language department has been awarded a 3-year \$300,000 grant to our most important language program for our people. Please contact Ms. Thompson and congratulate her on this achievement. Please contact her if you are interested in participating in the language program.

To date, working with Lincoln

County, Oklahoma and the Bureau of Indian Affairs Transportation Department, we have secured nearly \$1 million for four bridge replacements in Lincoln County. We are working on securing additional bridge funding at this time to improve the quality of travel and safety in Lincoln County for our tribal residents.

Also, in late December, 2023, the Business Committee took official action to remove the word "Oklahoma" off of our tribal license plates and renewal stickers beginning with the next batch of tags and stickers ordered because the current license plate law/policy was not consistent with our tribal constitution, our highest law in our nation. We continue to review our tribal law and policies to improve our governmental function for your benefit. We are here to serve the people of the Sac and Fox Nation.

I want to personally express my heartfelt "thank you" to all tribal members who have prayed for me, this Business Committee, and this Nation since I became your Principal Chief. I look forward to the challenges our Nation faces, both internally with the Nation and externally. I also want to thank "ALL" employees who go above and beyond their duties to serve our people. Sometimes, it is a thankless job, but I want them to know that their tribal leader appreciates the work they put in for the benefit of the Sac and Fox people. Be safe and well.

SFN Diabetes Program to Implement IHS Joslen Vision Teleophthalmology Program

Special Projects Director The Sac and Fox Nation Special Diabetes Program will begin implementing the Indian Health Services Joslen Vision Network (IHS/JVN) Teleophthalmology Program as soon as all of the equipment is installed and operable. The purpose of the program is to provide early detection of diabetic eye disease

The IHS /JVN program was developed to provide access to diabetic eye examinations for those patients that have been unable to make their yearly visit to the eye doctor. In many instances, patients routinely go to their clinic or hospital for other appointments and miss their yearly diabetic eye examination. Reasons can range from clinic availability to patients refusing to be dilated.

The JVN examination solves these problems by offering a simple and non-invasive procedure that does not require the use of dilating drops or any other preparation for the patient. The program also allows the monitoring of eye health and the diagnosis of diabetic retinopathy as early as possible. Emerging technologies have made this tool available to health centers in remote areas as well as those in urban medical centers.

The JVN Image Acquisition system will capture and transfer images of a Black Hawk Health Center patient's retina. The images will be received by the National Reading Center in Phoenix, Arizona. The images will be graded for a specific level of diabetic retinopathy. Results will be recorded in the database and a letter will be generated and sent to Black Hawk Health Center. An employee from Black Hawk Health Center will contact the patient and discuss the results of the eye exam. If further treatment is needed the BHHC employee will assist the patient in scheduling follow up appointments.

Vision is an important part of our everyday life and people with diabetes need to take special care to protect their vision from diabetic disease. Many studies have been done to prove that early detection and early treatment of diabetic eye disease can reduce the incidence of severe vision loss. In many cases, the mild to moderate forms of diabetic retinopathy can heal with time with no damage to

General Motors Exhibit Opens at History Center Museum

A new exhibit at the Oklahoma History Center Museum opened on Thursday, January 25. Located in the Curators' Corner area of the Noble Gallery on the third floor, "Oklahoma-Built Excellence: GM OKC" aims to tell the story of the Oklahoma City General Motors plant and its employees.

Using a timeline, archival newspaper prints, physical artifacts, photos, and informational signage, visitors will learn the history of the plant and its contribution to the economic growth of Oklahoma City and Oklahoma as a whole. The Oklahoma City plant was estimated to provide 7,500 local jobs outside the plant, with an additional 2,600 jobs inside the plant. The exhibit looks at the growth provided by General Motors and what happened to the employees following its closure.

The Oklahoma History Center Museum is located at 800 Nazih Zuhdi Dr. in Oklahoma City. It is open to the public Monday through Saturday from 10 a.m.-5 p.m. Please call 405-522-0765 or visit www.okhistory.org/historycenter for admission costs and group rates.

Haskell Indian Nations University, a Bureau of Indian Education-operated post-secondary institution in Lawrence, Kansas, is one of four tribal colleges and universities awarded a Tribal College Small Business Achievement Grant by the U.S. Small Business Administration. The grant provides \$250,000 per year for up to five years


up to five years.

This grant will enable Haskell to create the Center of Entrepreneurial Indigenous Prosperity, a Small Business Resource Center located on the Haskell campus. The center's mission is to positively impact local and Native entrepreneurs and foster economic growth in the community and beyond. The center will serve all of northeastern Kansas. It will offer vital support to potential new startups and existing businesses by finding and providing access to financial and entrepreneurial resources.

"Native entrepreneurship in Indian Country has long been a part of many Tribal communities' economies, so the talent, ability, and striving for success in building a business is already there," said Assistant Secretary for Indian Affairs Bryan Newland. "This funding will enable Haskell to build a support system to grow Native entrepreneurship benefiting Tribal communities in Kansas and elsewhere."

"This grant provides much-needed resources to entrepreneurs within northeast

Hello! Sac and Fox Tribal Members

We hope that everyone stays warm and healthy during this winter season. The Education Department would like to introduce a new employee that is working out of our office. Tonia George, Kickapoo Tribal Member. Her title is the Support Staff for the Oklahoma STEP Grant. She will be working at Prague Public School, Stroud Public School, and Cushing Public School.

The Sac and Fox Nation Education Department receive a 5-year grant in September 2023. The purpose is to have partnership with the State Education Agency (SEA) and the Tribal Education Agency (TEA) and Local Education Agency (LEA). The Absentee Shawnee Tribe and the Kiowa Tribe will be partnering with the Sac and Fox Nation in this 5-year grant along the side with Tribal Education Departments National Assembly (TEDNA).

Each tribe will hire an individual to work in the public schools they have chosen to work with. The Absentee Shawnee Tribe will be working with the Tecumseh Public School and Little Axe Public School. The Kiowa Tribe will be working with the Anadarko Public School and Carnegie Public School and Boone-Apache Public Schools. The two tribes' education department directors are: Tresha Spoon, Education Director from the Absentee Shawnee Tribe and Toni Tsatoke-Mule, Director, Kiowa Department of Higher Education.

Oklahoma STEP Grant will promote Tribal self-determination among Absentee Shawnee Tribe, Kiowa and Sac and Fox Nation to empower participating TEA to shape their education systems and align education programs with cultural values and aspirations; Improve the academic achievement of Native students among the three TEAs to identify evidence based practices and culturally responsive approaches; and, document the specific needs of Native students enrolled in participating LEA.

Foster coordination or collaboration among the three TEAs, the OK State Department of Education and nine LEAs will establish effective collaboration and communication channels and create an informed and collaborative educational environment; Strengthen community engagement among the participating TEAs to involve Tribal parents and stakeholders and foster a sense of ownership and shared responsibility for achieving desired outcomes.

Population Served: K – 12 American Indian and Alaska Native (AI/AN) Students Primary Activities: This grant will enhance the identification of Native students eligible for the Title VI Indian Education Formula Grant Program; develop methods to identify and support

under- identified Native students; increase the capacity of early-stage TEAs; and facilitate systemic change in key areas like college readiness, workforce development, and family engagement. Outcomes: To increase the capacity of early tribal education agencies among three eligible Oklahoma tribes: Absentee Shawnee Tribe, Kiowa Tribe, and Sac and Fox Nation.

SAC AND FOX NATION DRIVEWAY REPAIR PROGRAM REVENUE ALLOCATION PLAN GUIDELINES

PROGRAM FUNCTIONS:

PROGRAM FUNCTIONS:

To provide for the health and safety needs of eligible tribal members with driveway repairs. Many tribal members live in rural areas and have driveways which are inaccessible to many emergency vehicles. It is important to the health and safety of tribal members to ensure that driveways are accessible and do not create a danger to them or others rightfully entering their property. The program is open to all tribal members owning a home, which is their primary place of residence, on a first come basis; regardless of place of residency.

GUIDELINES:

- 1. Preference will be given to elders and handicap persons, based on individual health and safety needs and the condition of the driveway, which may impede emergency vehicles from reaching them in an emergency.
- 2. Proof of ownership is required. Rental property will not be considered for this program.
- 3. Proof of residency is required. Rental property or secondary residences will not be considered for this program.
- 4. Applications for regular maintenance and upkeep will not be approved.
- 5. Applications received for paving an existing gravel driveway that is functional and safe will not be approved.
- 6. Applications for non-residential driveways will not be approved.
- 7. An amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) in repairs will be made to any one driveway, regardless of the number of tribal members listed as owners. This is a lifetime limit.
- 8. Applicants/Home Owner of a Sac and Fox Nation traditional house (Mack, Ellis, McKosato & Massey) may re-apply once every ten (10) years.
- 9. Applicants are required to submit: application, proof of ownership & residency plus pictures of the driveway and three (3) bids for the repairs on the contractors' letterhead.

 10. If claiming a physical handicap, applicant may submit a letter from their physician.
- 11. Applicant/Home Owner is responsible for maintaining driveway after repairs.
- 12. The Administrator of this program has the sole discretion of approving or denying the application and repairs based on qualifications, emergencies and need.



- A Letter to Stockholders -

Dear Sac and Fox Nation shareholders, our Business Committee has scheduled a Special Governing Council meeting for Saturday Jan. 27 at the Community Building, for a presentation of Economic Development Research sponsored by associates from the Chicago Blackhawks organization.

From the handout this appears to be a very detailed research project directed specifically to The Sac and Fox Nation. This seems to be something tribal members would like to hear about, it's economic development. But there is a more important answer we need to have from Saturday's meeting, and that is who manages business and economic development.

Governing Council Resolution SF/GC-03-08 says it's Governing Council, approved at a Special Governing Council meeting July 19, 2003. This document is the SAC AND FOX NATION BUSINESS ENTERPRISE ACT. One Resolution statement says "BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the affairs of the Sac and Fox Nation's Business Enterprise shall be managed by a Board of Directors comprised of three members appointed by the Nation's Governing Council."

This means Governing Council are the shareholders of business and economic development, and will oversee the Board of Directors' management. This Resolution has never been changed by a Governing Council Resolution amendment. It's still the law. Saturday's meeting is a chance for shareholders to take control of the development and building of our tribal resources.

We should ask our Business Committee members to clarify their positions on the enforcement of the 2003 Enterprise Act, as well as its requirement for qualified nominees for the Enterprise Board, for shareholder's approval and ratification vote. This is an opportunity to start a change.

If we do not resolve this problem, we are destining to continue to lose our tribal funds thru ventures like the Trophy business, and cattle business, and the \$300,000.00 Tanger black-hole. I urge all members to show up at the meeting and ask your questions and push your support for the Enterprise Act and the Enterprise Board.

- A Letter to Tribal Members -

Tribal Members,

The status and behaviors of the Sac and Fox Nation is an apprehension that our elders and Tribal members have expressed over many years. My outlook on our judicial system and Tribal operations becomes less favorable at every turn. Yet, I continue with the disposition that there will be a soft landing on matters that will rectify improprieties and prosper our Nation.

We, as Tribal members, have witnessed a tragic sequence of events regarding the Tanger property Fee-To-Trust-Resolution SF/GC-19-07. Our elders speak of this matter at Council with no finality. I felt a personal draw to research the Feeto-Trust concern.

My findings developed into a concern similar to the Governing Council's addressed concerns. I submitted a Bar Complaint to the State of Oklahoma Bar Association (SOBA). The response from the State-of-Oklahoma-Bar-Association prompted a Bar-Complaint to the Sac and Fox Nation Court Bar Association (SFNCBA).

Resolution-SF/GC-19-07 dated October 27, 2018 identifies that Governing-Body of the Governing-Council approved allocating three-hundred-thousand-dollars (\$300,000) to complete the

Fee-to-Trust by Homer Law and the environmental-assessment.

The Lincoln County Treasurer's office recognizes that the said Fee-to-Trust property listed in Resolution SF/GC-19-07 is in trust and has been since 2017.

SFNCBA-Attorney-General R. Daniel Carter, rendered the Bar-Complaint invalid and requested for the court's dismissal. Mr Carter's contract expired December 2023. It's our Constitutional duty to question matters creating waste-of-funds, time, and effort. Where is the safeguard for SFN Tribal members?
